FROM THE MANAGER

We know only too well that Dundee are a club with very proud traditions and will be working very hard to stay in that league so we must approach the game in the same manner we did the Old Firm game.

Midweek Action

Goals from Aitken, Crainie, McCluskey, Provan and a penalty score from Mark Reid gave Celtic a 5-1 win over Airdrie on Wednesday.

Celtic started well and in only two minutes a Roy Aitken header from a Davie Provan cross had them ahead.

The second came in the ninth minute. Again Provan and Aitken were involved but it was Danny Crainie who finished this time.

Just on the half hour mark, Airdrie were awarded a penalty for a Roy Aitken foul on Sandy Clark. Clark scored and that's how the score stood at half time, 2-1.

Celtic started the second half with the same determination as the first and it only took 11 minutes for them to go further ahead. The hero this time was George McCluskey with a fine run past the Airdrie defence and a scoring shot from 20 yards.

Four minutes later the Crainie and Provan partnership worked the ball into the Airdrie box for Provan to score.

The fifth goal came in just over 70 minutes when Mark Reid converted a penalty after the Airdrie keeper had brought down Murdo MacLeod.

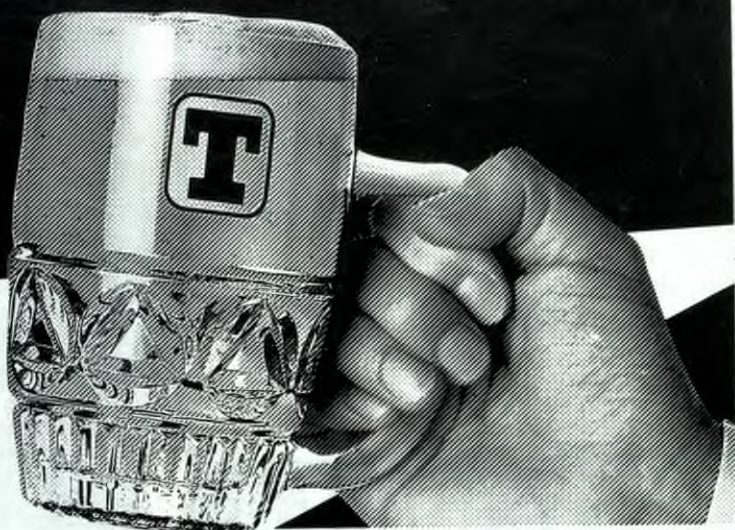
