A Brief History of Inter Milan

In Inter's glory years up to 1967, their game was based on an airtight defence with lightning raids on the break. But age has taken its toll on some of its players. Several stars are no longer with the Club and the survivors are getting close to the veteran stage.

Thin man Sandro Mazzola, 29, is still very much a world class player but he is more of a schemer, playing all over the field, than a lightning striker as he was in his younger days.

Other familiar names in Inter's line-up are 26-year-old wing-half Bedin; sweeper Burgnich, 33 next month but wearing well; left-back Facchetti, still a stalwart though perhaps not so good as a season or two ago and Brazilian winger Jair, back after a spell with Roma.

But the big menace in the Inter attack is centre-forward Roberto Boninsegna.

The Italian champions, last club to win the European Cup in successive years (1964-65) have what no other European club can offer—five players who played in the World Cup Final in Mexico in 1970.

They are Facchetti, Bertini, Mazzola, their brilliant skipper, Burgnich, and Italy's top-scorer, Boninsegna. Who says Celtic are on to a soft touch?

It is interesting to compare the European Cup records of the clubs. Both have played exactly the same number of ties.

The respective records are:

Mr. STEIN'S MESSAGE

We face tonight the might of Italy in the team of Internazionale, the champions of that country. Tonight is the gateway to greatness, a further chance to move into the final in this greatest of all European competitions. Inter Milan are a good team—a very good team, but it is in such company that Celtic rise to their highest level. I ask our support to give the Italians a warm Celtic welcome, but after that we want that old traditional sound behind our players.

Only twice have any of these clubs been involved in a final tie—Celtic v. Inter Milan in 1967 and Benfica v. Inter Milan in 1965.

Of the teams that lined up at San Siro Stadium on 5th April, only Craig, Murdoch, McNeill, Johnstone and Lennox remained in the Celtic line-up and only Burgnich, Facchetti and Mazzola have survived in the Inter Milan line-up.

We have to congratulate our players once more in reaching the final of the Scottish Cup. However, it was not so much in the winning as in the manner of doing so that gave us greatest pleasure. One newspaper described the boys as "The Magicians".

When over in Italy the players stayed at the Hotel Regina Olga, Cernobbio, which is beautifully situated on Lake Como, only fifteen minutes by the lake from that town.

Instead of taxis, the boys were using the little steamers which are constantly on the move up and down the lake.

The weather was beautiful although there was still snow on the mountains to the north.

Some of the shops in Milan had many small birds on display for eating. Prominent among them were starlings. Perhaps that would be a good way of getting rid of our starling menace in the City of Glasgow, if we all took up the habit of having half-a-dozen starlings for dinner at night! Strange, in this country, we generally feed the birds in winter, not eat them.

According to the French newspaper "France Foot-

ball," the Derby match in Italy, Torino-Juventus has beaten all records for receipts in the Championship of Italy, having drawn the fantastic amount of 177,000,000 liras. This is equivalent in our language to £118,000. The preceding record for receipts was also in Turin and only dated a month earlier on the 20th February, 1972, in the match Juventus v. A.C. Milan, where they drew 151,000,000 liras.

As far as our own match is concerned, the Inter-Celtic match was an all time record which drew approximately 240,000,000 liras, being £160,000. This is not extraordinary when one considers that the cheapest price was £1.50, the next £2.50, then £7.00 and £8.75. The £8.75 tickets were, however, very restricted in number.

It is all the more creditable that Celtic, living in Scottish football with gate money at our own relatively low level, should be able to compete with the other Greats in Europe.
