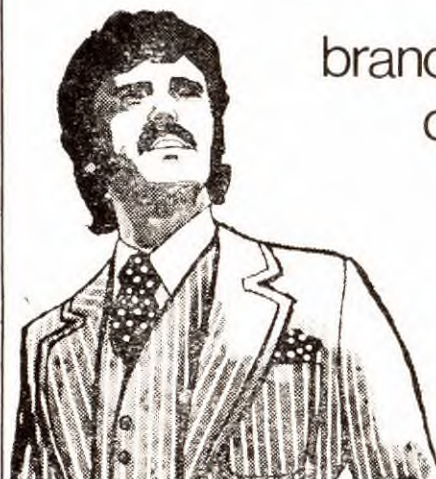

# JOCK STEIN says...

It seems strange to be writing the last programme piece of the season when in fact we are still very much interested in two competitions.

The two tournaments to which I refer are of course the Scottish Cup and the Glasgow Cup and Celtic in the next three weeks will contest the finals of them both.

Before I go any further I want to express my appreciation—and that of everyone else connected with the club—of the terrific support we have received from our fans this season.

We started the season in fine style by winning the Dryborough Cup for the first time and followed that by recapturing the League Cup in October.

Our attempt at a record of ten-in-a-row league championship wins looked good over the first half of the league campaign but as everyone now knows it wasn't to be. Strangely enough our failure to win the title for the first time in ten outings is considered by some people to be the end of an era—yet we could finish up the winners of every other domestic competition.

During the spell from January, when our own carelessness cost us the championship, our supporters have risen above their disappointment and given the team great encouragement.

This was particularly evident at East End Park, Dunfermline, last Saturday. Perhaps there were fewer Celtic fans at the game compared with previous visits to Fife—but you wouldn't have thought that the way the fans supported the team. It was only right and fitting that they should be rewarded by one of our best displays for some time. In the second half in particular the team really got into top gear and the win could have been by a much greater margin.

The team played well and I was particularly pleased with the display



of Steve Murray, after his fairly long absence, and the return to best form of Bobby Lennox who with a little luck could have had a second half hat-trick.

The game this afternoon against Dundee and next week at Perth will be used in preparation for our Scottish Cup final with Airdrie in a fortnight and our Glasgow Cup final clash with Rangers a week later.

In both finals I can only ask our fans to continue with their great support and to be on their best behaviour and the team will try to repay them with victories.

Spectators are requested to avoid undue haste in and around the ground and especially when leaving at the end of the match. They are also requested to co-operate with police and stewards in the interests of safety.

# TODAY'S VISITORS

---

The two games with Dundee that we recall today resulted in a victory for each club.

In the match won by Celtic the home side fielded the team that, with one change, was to win the European Cup just four months later.

However Lisbon, or for that matter sunshine, never entered the heads of any of the 37,000 fans who turned up to see the game at Celtic Park on the bitterly cold January 7th, 1967.

Five other Scottish first division games scheduled for that Saturday afternoon were cancelled because of the conditions but Celtic Park had been protected from the elements by a covering of straw.

The teams on that occasion were:

**Celtic**—Simpson, Craig and Gemmell, Murdoch, McNeill and Clark, Johnstone and Wallace, Chalmers, Gallagher and Lennox. Substitute: Auld.

**Dundee**—Arrol, Wilson and Cox, Murray, Easton and Houston, Bryce and Scott, Cameron, McLean and Kinninmonth. Substitute: MacKay.

If the weather was cold the opening action was red hot and Celtic tore into a two-goal lead after just five minutes play. Bobby Murdoch started it in the fourth minute when, after beating four defenders on the run, his final shot was deflected past keeper Arrol. One minute later Bobby made the opening for Willie Wallace to score the second goal. Further goals by Jimmy Johnstone and Charlie Gallagher gave Celtic a

4-0 interval lead. In the second half Kenny Cameron scored for Dundee and then two minutes from time Willie Wallace scored his second goal to give Celtic a comfortable 5-1 victory.

It was a different story last season, however, when Dundee visited Celtic Park on Sunday, February 10th, and recorded a 2-1 victory.

The teams last year were:

**Celtic**—Hunter, McGrain and Brogan, Connelly, McNeill and Hay, Hood and Murray, Deans, Dalglish and Lennox. Substitutes: Callaghan and Davidson.

**Dundee**—Allan, R. Wilson and Johnston, Ford, Phillip and Gemmell, J. Wilson and Robinson, Duncan, J. Scott and Lambie. Substitutes: Pringle and Scott.

Very few players remained from the 1967 encounter and two of those—Steve Murray and Tommy Gemmell—had switched sides.

A crowd of 40,000 attended the match and almost all of them were stunned when first Lambie and then Duncan scored to give Dundee a 2-0 lead.

Davie Hay scored with a great shot just ten minutes before the end of the first half to set the scene for a big second half push by Celtic.

Celtic attacked non-stop throughout the second half but they failed to score an equaliser.

The Celts still topped the league with a three points lead over Hibs and on the following Saturday they won at Easter Road to strengthen their grip on the title.
