# FROM THE MANAGER

We started the match against Airdrie very convincingly and were two up very early thanks to goals from Roy Aitken and Danny Crainie. There was a spell before half-time when we allowed Airdrie to get back into the game and they managed to pull one back through a penalty.

In the second half we quickly got back on the rails and goals from George McCluskey, Davie Provan and a penalty score from Mark Reid sealed a very satisfactory performance. It was particularly pleasing to see young Mark Reid score his first goal for the club and since then he has of course scored another, perhaps more important, penalty.

On Saturday we had to work hard for our points and I'd like to give credit to Dundee. I was pleased to see a team in their position try to make attractive play and indeed it paid off for them because they scored an early goal and managed to hold on to that lead until half-time.

After Mark Reid pulled us level from the penalty spot early in the second half and George McCluskey followed up with our second it showed that we just needed that breakthrough and we managed further goals from Davie Provan and George McCluskey.

All in all these two successful results serve to reinforce our claim that if we are to be Champions we will do so on our own merits. If we can produce the same freshness and finishing throughout our remaining matches things should go our way. We must forget about complacency and keep our determination and positive attitude.

Tonight our opponents are Dundee United in what proves to be a very difficult and attractive match. United have been very entertaining and exciting this season and their long run in the UEFA Cup is evidence of the quality of players they have. We know only too well that it takes a good performance to ensure both points against them and hopefully we will provide one tonight.

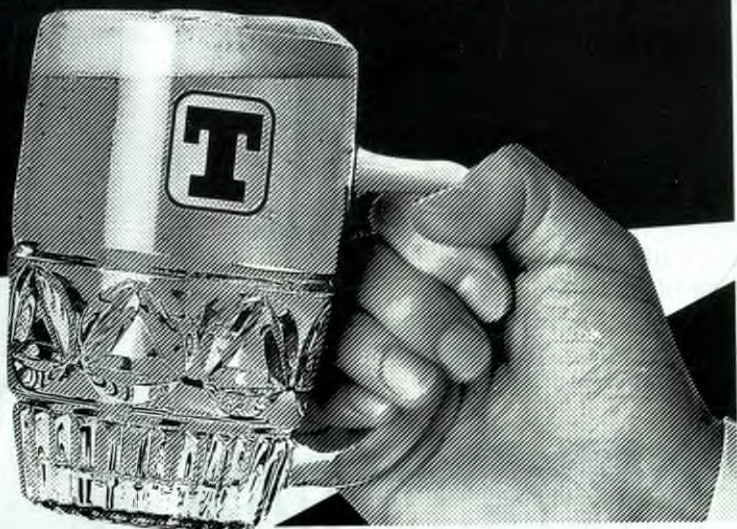

YET another former Celtic player joins the ranks of managers in Scotland with the weekend appointment of ex-midfielder Steve Murray as boss at Montrose in succession to the ex-Links Park outside left Bobby Livingstone.

Stevie had a brief though effective and entertaining spell in the green and white jersey after starring with Dundee and Aberdeen before a foot injury cut short his career.

But the lure of the game has

proved too strong, and when the vacancy arose he applied, and was successful. He had a hankering to bid for the Forfar post when it became vacant but his banking job at that time prevented his move.

That obstacle has now apparently been cleared and so Steve becomes the SEVENTH former Celtic player to manage

a Scottish club at present (and that list doesn't include ex-Parkhead backroom boys Davie McParland and Frank Connor).

The ex-Celtic bosses are Billy McNeill, Bertie Auld (Hibernian), Davie Hay (Motherwell), Sammy Henderson (Clydebank), Pat Stanton (Dunfermline), Harry Hood (Queen of the South) and now Steve.
