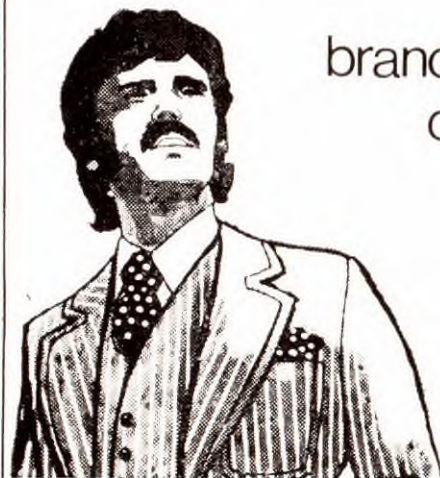

# JOCK STEIN says...

This afternoon we are hosts to Dunfermline Athletic in a league match and there is every likelihood that the fans will have yet another treat in store for them. After a somewhat shaky start to the league campaign the East End Park team, ably guided by manager George Miller, have been collecting points recently and have hoisted themselves up the league table in the process.

Judging by the recent results and goals obtained by the Fife side they are not overawed by the reputation of opponents, indeed the reverse would appear to be the case.

Our own form on the whole has been very satisfactory and since our last home game, which we won convincingly against Airdrie, we have travelled to Tynecastle and Cappielow and collected three points out of the possible four. I think in all honesty we did enough to win both matches but after a spate of goals in the Airdrie match our scoring touch appears temporarily to have deserted us.

In the match against Hearts, for example, our form in the first half-hour was as good as it has been for a long time. Great goalkeeping and missed chances robbed us of a commanding lead and the resultant draw indicates how close we came to paying dearly for failing to cash in on our outfield superiority. Our match at Greenock last week was a different kettle of fish altogether. Although we didn't play half as well as at Tynecastle we dictated the action from start to finish and if our victory was by the narrowest of margins we never at any stage looked in danger of losing the game.

One thing that is emerging from this seasons fight for the top ten places is the fact that week by week results get more and more difficult



to forecast. In recent weeks there have been all kinds of surprise results and if that is not a sure way of stimulating interest I don't know what is—especially when only four points separates 11 teams.

In concluding today's piece may I say it is my earnest hope that we get a bumper turn-out for the match with Benfica on Wednesday night. As everyone knows the proceeds from the match and the souvenir programme will go to the United Nations Children's Fund—a charity which assists the deserving youngsters all over the world irrespective of creed or colour.

# TODAY'S VISITORS

---

Dunfermline are the visitors to Celtic Park this afternoon and going by past meetings of these clubs in league and cup competitions we are in for an entertaining match.

In last season's meeting at Celtic Park, which was played in December of last year, Celtic with goals from Deans (2), Dalglish (2) and Hood (2) hit the East End Park side for six, but goals don't always come so readily against the dour Fifers.

Indeed the young Dunfermline side have been scoring quite a few goals of their own recently which has taken them into the top half of the league table. In two other matches we look at today the goals weren't so easily obtained. On January 4th, 1969 for instance Celtic got off to the best possible start with a goal from Willie Wallace in just 60 seconds from a Tommy Callaghan pass. Willie scored a second just seven minutes later and Celtic looked set for a goal spree. Alec. Edwards got one back for Dunfermline after 20 minutes, however and it took Celtic another 45 minutes to settle the issue with a great Bobby Lennox goal.

A more recent league meeting was on February 19th, 1972 when 35,000 fans saw Celtic win by the only goal of the game. The teams were:—

**Celtic**—Williams, Hay and Brogan, Murdoch, McNeill and Connelly, Dalglish and Macari, Deans, Lennox and Hood. Substitute—Callaghan.

**Dunfermline**—Arrol, Callaghan and Lunn, Fraser, Cushley and

McNichol, Thomson and Mitchell, Scott, Mercer and O'Neill. Substitute—Gillespie.

The all important goal was scored by Lou Macari after 63 minutes.

Another close match between the two clubs was played on March 18th, 1967 in the season that Celtic won all the Scottish competitions and the European Cup as well. Celtic with goals from Steve Chalmers, Tommy Gemmell from the penalty spot and Willie Wallace won the match by 3-2 and took an important step towards winning their second successive league championship. Only Billy McNeill and Bobby Lennox of Celtic's team that day are still at Celtic Park.
