# JOCK STEIN says...

This afternoon, for the second time in a fortnight, we play a match at Celtic Park on a Sunday and following last Saturday's defeat at Motherwell, we'll be hoping to return to the winning trail.

I was disappointed with our defeat at Fir Park but I am constantly reminding our players that they're bound to come unstuck in some games during a league campaign.

The important thing is to learn from your mistakes and as far as possible guard against similar setbacks.

My main concern about this last defeat was the fact that we were two goals in front with less than half an hour left for play, yet we lost the game.

Strangely enough, we took the lead after Motherwell had had their best spell of the match and they scored their opening counter when we had decisively turned the game our way.

Following 'Well's first goal, we looked like having the game sewn up when we scored again but the referee didn't allow the score to stand.

Result apart, I thought that this was the type of football match which would fill football grounds on a Saturday or Sunday and attract back fans whose enthusiasm has waned.

Returning to the game this afternoon, the players will be keen to avenge the League Cup final defeat and at the same time collect two valuable points.

Dundee generally put the accent on attacking football and when both teams play this way, you can invariably expect an entertaining match.

With regard to Sunday football, I'll keep an open mind about it and look no further than the situation



brought about by the present power crisis.

With regard to the George Connelly transfer request, I can only say that although I can understand George's disappointment at being out of the side, we will be just as disappointed to lose a player of his calibre.

# TODAY'S VISITORS, DUNDEE

Today's game with Dundee has all the ingredients to make it an outstanding match. The Celtic players will be anxious to avenge their League Cup defeat in December and at the same time complete a league double over the Dens Park team this season.

Dundee, riding high following their Scottish Cup win at Pittodrie, are likely to field a team from the following players:—

**Thomson Allan** is the current man in possession of the goal keeping position. Signed from Hibs in 1971 he is a most capable keeper but is constantly being challenged for the berth by former Queens Park keeper Mike Hewitt.

**Bobby Wilson** was bought from Cowdenbeath in 1966 and has proved a reliable and consistent right back since he made the position his own.

**Dave Johnston** joined the club from junior football six years ago. A big powerful player who likes to overlap from the left back position.

**Bobby Ford** joined Dundee from Falkirk a couple of seasons ago and has settled into a mid field role which he plays with boundless energy and skill.

**Ian Phillip** brought back from Crystal Palace after a short spell in English football is playing in the middle of the defence where his experience and strength is being utilised to the full.

**Tommy Gemmell** having had ten years at Celtic Park before going south to join Notts Forest 'Big Tam' needs no introduction to the Park-head fans. Since his transfer to Dundee however, Tommy has forsaken his overlapping full back role for that of sweeper.

**Jimmy Wilson** came back to Dundee this season after sampling South African football for a spell. Although he's been around the Scottish scene for a long time he can still be a dangerous winger.

**Jocky Scott** is going into his tenth

year with Dundee having joined them on his return after a period with Chelsea as a youngster. A good ball player, he also knows the way to goal and his goalscoring flair has earned him representative recognition.

**Bobby Robinson** another player in the Dundee squad who joined the club from Falkirk, he also plays in the midfield and is a very capable player.

**Gordon Wallace** has been a consistent scorer with the Dens Park side since he was signed from Raith Rovers in 1969. In his last season with the Kirkcaldy club he was Scotland's top scorer.

**Ian Scott** made the move along the road from Tannadice in 1971 and plays either in midfield or as a striker. In the latter role he scored against Celtic in Dundee's League win at Dens Park last season.

**John Duncan** top scorer last season with 40 goals was being linked with Celtic earlier this season. Signing problems kept him out of the side for a good spell, but he is back in the scheme of things again.

**Duncan Lambie** brother of St. Johnstone's new coach, he joined Dundee from Armadale Thistle in 1971. Has recently settled differences with the club and signed a new contract. An outside left with pace and a lot of skill.

**Billy Semple** was a Rangers player when manager White was at Ibrox, but later, on his release he sampled football in South Africa. The speedy winger was quickly signed by Dundee on his return to this country.

**George Stewart** regular centre-half before the return of Phillip to the heart of the defence but still very much in contention for a place. Tall, powerful player he joined Dundee from Tynecastle Boys' Club.

**Alec Pringle** joined Dundee after being released by Hibs in 1971. Strong, forceful player who normally plays in the back of the defence or in midfield.

# ALWAYS A THRILLER

Matches between Celtic and Dundee have produced many thrilling encounters with the emphasis generally placed on skill and attacking football.

The last two occasions in which Dundee have visited Celtic Park in the league, the games have fallen into that category and in both games Kenny Dalglish proved a real thorn in the flesh of the Dens Park men.

In the game two seasons ago, played on October 16th, 1971, the teams lined up as follows:—

**Celtic**—Williams; Hay and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Connelly; Johnstone and Dalglish; Hood, Callaghan and Macari.

Twelfth man—Lennox.

**Dundee**—Hewitt; Wilson and Johnston; Steele, Phillip and Houston; Duncan and Selway; Wallace, Scott and Lambie. Twelfth man—Kinninmonth.

Kenny Dalglish scored the only goal of the first half from a magnificently judged pass from Bobby Murdoch.

In the first minute of the second half, however, Celtic were two up. Lou Macari combined with Dalglish to open up the Dundee defence and Kenny scored his second goal.

Three minutes later Dundee were back in the hunt with a headed goal by John Duncan but shortly after this Kenny Dalglish scored with a header to complete his hat-trick and the scoring.

Last season's match with Dundee was played on the second Saturday in January and it was the day that Jock Stein returned to Celtic Park following a short spell in hospital.

After Jimmy Johnstone had given Celtic the lead Doug Houston equalised following some slack defensive work.

Then, when the game looked like finishing a draw, up popped Kenny Dalglish late in the game to score the winner and avenge Celtic's league defeat at Dens Park earlier in the season.

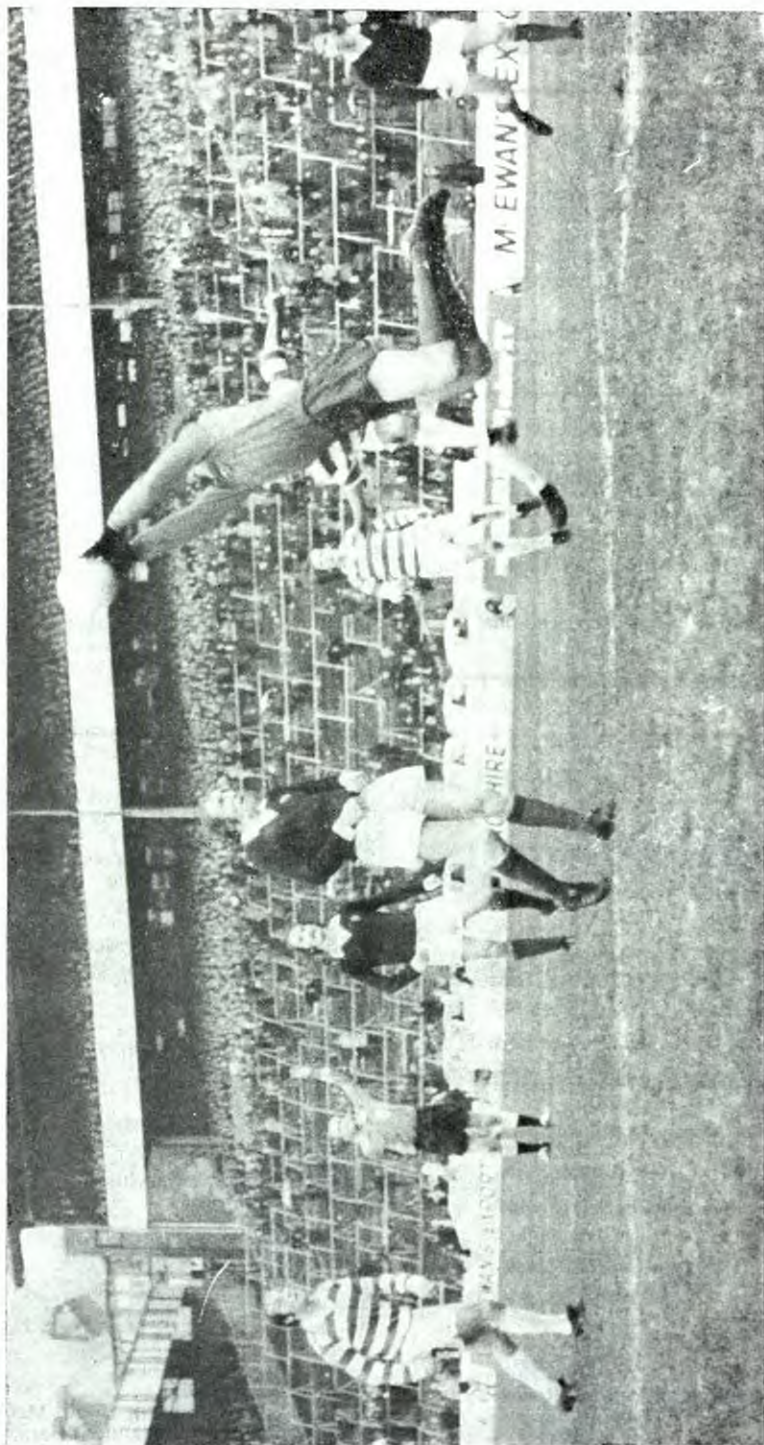
