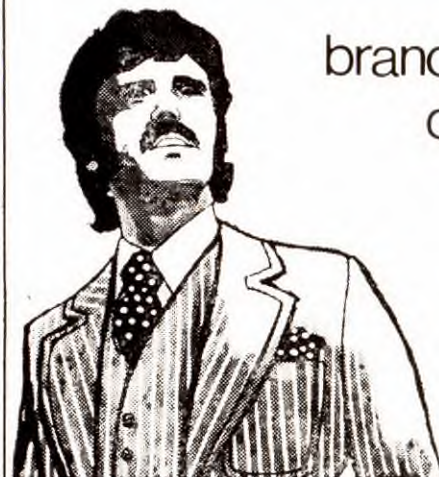

JOCK STEIN says...

We return to the Scottish Cup competition today after some far from inspiring league performances in recent games which have left us with an uphill fight to retain our league championship tag.

I still contend, however, that the title chase is far from over and that there will be a few more surprising results before the league race is decided.

Having said that, our fellows will have to apply themselves to the task of getting back on to the rails. This means recapturing the art of sticking the ball in the back of our opponents' net and at the same time putting an end to the shockingly careless way we are losing—or rather giving away goals—by slack defensive play.

In my last programme piece, which was for the Motherwell league game of five weeks ago, I complained about the careless loss of goals and we proceeded to lose three bad goals in that game and two points as well in a 3-2 defeat.

The following week the team clicked in to gear at Somerset Park—but not before we had squandered half a dozen scoring chances and conceded yet another bad goal to give the home side the lead.

That goal shook our fellows into action and having equalised before half-time, they went on to score four more for a convincing 5-1 win.

Our Scottish Cup defence started the following week with a somewhat dangerous looking journey to Easter Road but the players set about the match with the right attitude and, apart from a slack spell in the middle of the game, never looked like losing the tie.

In the two most recent games, however, the carelessness of which I have spoken so often reappeared and we lost a valuable point to each of the two teams currently placed at the bottom of the league.

I don't in any way want to detract from the spirited performances of



Arbroath and Dumbarton, but neither team should have come within a mile of gaining a point. At Arbroath we held a 2-1 lead with 15 minutes to go and lost a goal and a point when we had passed up enough chances to go into double figures.

Without playing well against Dumbarton we took a 2-0 interval lead and to lose that advantage in the second half was unforgivable.

Clydebank are our cup visitors this afternoon and having eliminated Dunfermline in the last round they will be accorded the respect they deserve.

Spectators are requested to avoid undue haste in and around the ground and especially when leaving at the end of the match. They are also requested to cooperate with police and stewards in the interests of safety.

TODAY'S VISITORS

Today, for the second time in successive seasons to the day, Clydebank visit Celtic Park to play in a Scottish Cup-tie.

But although it is a similar time of year to that of last season's meeting the similarity goes no further, because for a start last year's clash was in the third round of the competition and today's game is one stage later.

An even more significant difference is that the 1974 meeting took place on a Sunday due to a ban on floodlights and the inclusion of Saturday in the three-day working week.

CROWD COMPARISON

A crowd of 28,000 turned out to see the first Sunday match ever played at Celtic Park and no doubt some comparisons will be made between that crowd and the attendance at today's game.

The weather was absolutely perfect on Sunday, January 27th when the teams lined-up as follows:

Celtic—Hunter, McGrain and Brogan, McCluskey, McNeill and Hay, Hood and Callaghan, Deans, Dalglish and Lennox. Substitutes: Wilson and Davidson.

Clydebank—Gallagher, Mitchell and Abel, Fanning, Fallon and White, Roxburgh and Henderson, Larnach, McColl and Currie.

Celtic took the game straight to the Bankies from the kick-off and

within six minutes Dixie Deans had struck twice to put Celtic into a 2-0 lead. With just four minutes on the clock Bobby Lennox spreadeagled the Clydebank rearguard and Dixie was on hand to score from his cross.

Just two minutes later Kenny Dalglish and Bobby Lennox combined to make the opening for Dixie's second.

Bobby Lennox got into the scoring act with a third goal and after Dixie Deans had completed his hat-trick Bobby scored his second and Celtic's fifth goal.

Shortly after this goal Dalglish and McGrain were taken off and substitutes Wilson and Davidson were brought on.

SIXTH GOAL

Just minutes after coming in to the game Vic Davidson scored Celtic's sixth goal and in the last minute of the game Fallon scored a consolation goal for Clydebank from the penalty spot.

The only other visit Clydebank have made to Celtic Park was in a quarter final League Cup-tie in September, 1971, after Celtic had taken a 5-0 lead at Kilbowie Park.

Brian McLaughlin made his debut in this match and showed great promise with his skilful use of the ball in Celtic's 6-2 victory.
