# SEAN FALLON says...

We have faced few more important matches in seasons gone by than this afternoon's against Dundee. I wonder how many of our supporters appreciate that Celtic have not won a match for a month?

Our last victory was against Arbroath at Gayfield on December 16. Since then we have drawn at home with Hibs and lost 1-2 to Rangers at Ibrox and have had two matches postponed because of 'flu—Kilmarnock (away) and Morton (home). It must be a long, long time since Celtic went this length of time without winning.

## Progress

In the interval both Hibs and Rangers have made important strides to the top of the table. So now it is of the utmost importance that Celtic return to winning form.

However we do today, I am looking forward to a very good match. This will be our fifth

encounter with Davie White's team this season. Dundee have beaten us twice at Dens Park—2-0 in the league and 1-0 in the League Cup. We have won 3-2 after extra time in the return League Cup quarter-final at Celtic Park and then 4-1 in a play-off at Hampden.

The effect of the 'flu at Parkhead appears to have disappeared and we can field the side of our choice for this "rubber" match.

Victory would be a great morale-booster for all of us—especially our manager Jock Stein, for whom I am trying to deputise here and elsewhere. Mr. Stein is nearly 100 per cent fit now. Everybody connected with Celtic and many more besides looks forward to his return to active service and wishes him many years of health and strength.

What better wish could we have for him than that Celtic beat this very talented Dundee side this afternoon.

# CELTIC VERSUS DUNDEE IN THE LEAGUE

## Visitors' last win at Parkhead

Celtic Park is not one of Dundee's happiest hunting grounds, although already this season the Dens Park club have proved their worth against the league champions on their own ground and at Celtic Park.

Today's will be the fifth encounter between the clubs this season. In September Dundee won a league match at Dens Park by 2-0. That was Celtic's first league defeat of the season and remained their only reverse until Rangers' 2-1 victory last Saturday. There followed two closely contested League Cup quarter final ties in which Dundee were again successful on their own ground (by 1-0) and lost 2-3 at Celtic Park after extra time. The easy win of Celtic (4-1) in a play-off of that quarter-final at Hampden Park was unexpected.

### Changes in Personnel

Dundee's team has changed considerably compared with the side who last played at Parkhead in a league match. Three of the 12 who were at Celtic Park in October 1971 are no longer with the club—Jim Steele and Ian Phillip, now with Southampton and Crystal Palace respectively, and Ron Selway, now with Raith Rovers. In addition the substitute, Alec Kinninmonth, has gone to Dunfermline Athletic.

The teams that day, when Celtic won 3-1 with three goals by Kenny Dalglish against one by John Duncan, were :—

Celtic—Williams; Hay, Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill, Connelly; Johnstone, Dalglish, Hood, Callaghan, Macari.

Dundee—Hewitt; Wilson (R), Johnston; Steele, Phillip, Houston; Duncan, Selway, Wallace, Scott (J), Lambie.

Referee—R. C. Greenlees (Lochgelly).

That was Celtic's seventh successive win over Dundee in the league at Celtic Park. Dundee have won only three of their 25 league games at Parkhead since the war. Celtic have won 16 and six have been drawn.

### Stoppage

The last Dundee victory was eight seasons ago, and had it not been for a sudden improvement in the weather their chance of winning that day would have disappeared.

They were leading 1-0 when a terrific rainstorm and damage to the floodlighting caused the referee to send the teams off. The ground was in semi-darkness, and so dense was the rain that it seemed as if fog had descended on the pitch. Before all the players were in the pavilion, however, an extraordinary sudden lull in the rain came and the light just as suddenly improved greatly. So the game was resumed after only a few minutes stoppage. Two minutes from time Steve Murray, now one of the "stars" of the Aberdeen team, scored Dundee's second goal. Andy Penman, now on the books of Rangers had scored the first in 22 minutes. The teams on that November day in 1964 were :—

Celtic—Fallon; Young, Gemmell; Clark Cushley, Kennedy; Johnstone, Murdoch, Chalmers, Maxwell, Hughes.

Dundee—Donaldson; Hamilton, Beattie; Cousin, Easton, Stuart; Murray, Penman, Harley, Gilzean, Robertson.

Referee—N. Watson (Glenrothes).

Of the Celtic team only Jimmy Johnstone is a regular first-team man now—indeed of the others only Jim Kennedy (now on the club's office staff) and Bobby Murdoch are still at Celtic Park.

Not one of the Dundee eleven remains at Dens Park and only Alistair Donaldson (Falkirk), Jim Easton (Queen of the South) and that splendid veteran Alan Gilzean (Tottenham Hotspur) are regular first-team men elsewhere.

Hugh Maxwell, the Celtic inside left, had joined Celtic from Falkirk on the previous evening for a transfer fee of £15,000.

Gilzean was one of the players who helped Dundee to win their first and only first division championship. That was in

1961-62 when they topped the table with 54 points from their 34 games compared with the 51 of Rangers, who were second, and the 46 of Celtic, who finished third. They lost only five league matches, one of which was at Celtic Park, where the home club won 2-1—the reverse of the result at Dens Park that season.

Dundee's manager at the time was Bob Shankly, now with Stirling Albion. That league championship triumph took Dundee into the European Cup, in which they played with great distinction. They defeated Cologne, Sporting Lisbon and Anderlecht on aggregate before they lost to the ultimate winners of the trophy, Milan, by 2-5 on aggregate in a semi-final.

Dundee were runners-up in the first division—three times—in 1902-03, 1908-09, and 1948-49.

### TAKE CARE

Celtic Football Club ask all spectators to take care as they enter or leave the ground. It is particularly important to be careful as you leave, especially if you have to descend slopes.

Everyone should follow the advice and instructions of police and stewards and help in having a trouble-free match.
