JOCK STEIN says . . .

AS you probably know by now, I am not one for going overboard about the past. I fully realise that in a club such as Celtic there are great traditions to be admired and followed. Yet I believe my job as manager is to concentrate on the present and the future and not pay too much attention to what is history.

At the same time we must make sure that we learn from mistakes of the past. We have, for instance, to remember our depressing experience of being knocked out in the very first round of the Scottish Cup while we were European club champions, Scottish Cup holders and league champions!!!!

The club who dismissed us so summarily in 1968 were Dunfermline Athletic, whom we meet in the first round this afternoon. That defeat hasn't, of course, been Celtic's only Scottish Cup reverse inflicted by the Fife club in recent years.

CHANGE IN ATTITUDE

We can learn from those defeats, particularly the 1968 one. Very probably Celtic treated Dunfermline on that occasion with less respect than they should have done. I can assure everyone that Celtic will have an entirely different attitude this afternoon.

There are other reasons too why we should give special attention to this match. Dunfermline have slipped somewhat in recent weeks and can't have better than an outside chance of playing next season in European football—unless, of course, they get to the final of the Scottish Cup at least! They have a wonderful record in European competition for a provincial club, and all of us in Scottish football were sorry when they were eliminated last week from the Fairs Cities Cup.

But being sorry and being sensible go together in this case. So we shall treat Dunfermline as a side all out to make the very best of their remaining chance of fame if not fortune.

If further incentive were needed by our lads they would find it in the fact that Dunfermline beat us in the league on their ground some four months ago.

INJURIES

The "Pars" have been dealt some unkind blows this season through injury, and it's most likely that in their team today will be one or two faces new to Celtic Park.

I have much pleasure in welcoming Manager George Farm, his directors and players. I know that whatever the outcome of the match the Dunfermline players will contribute much to the entertainment.

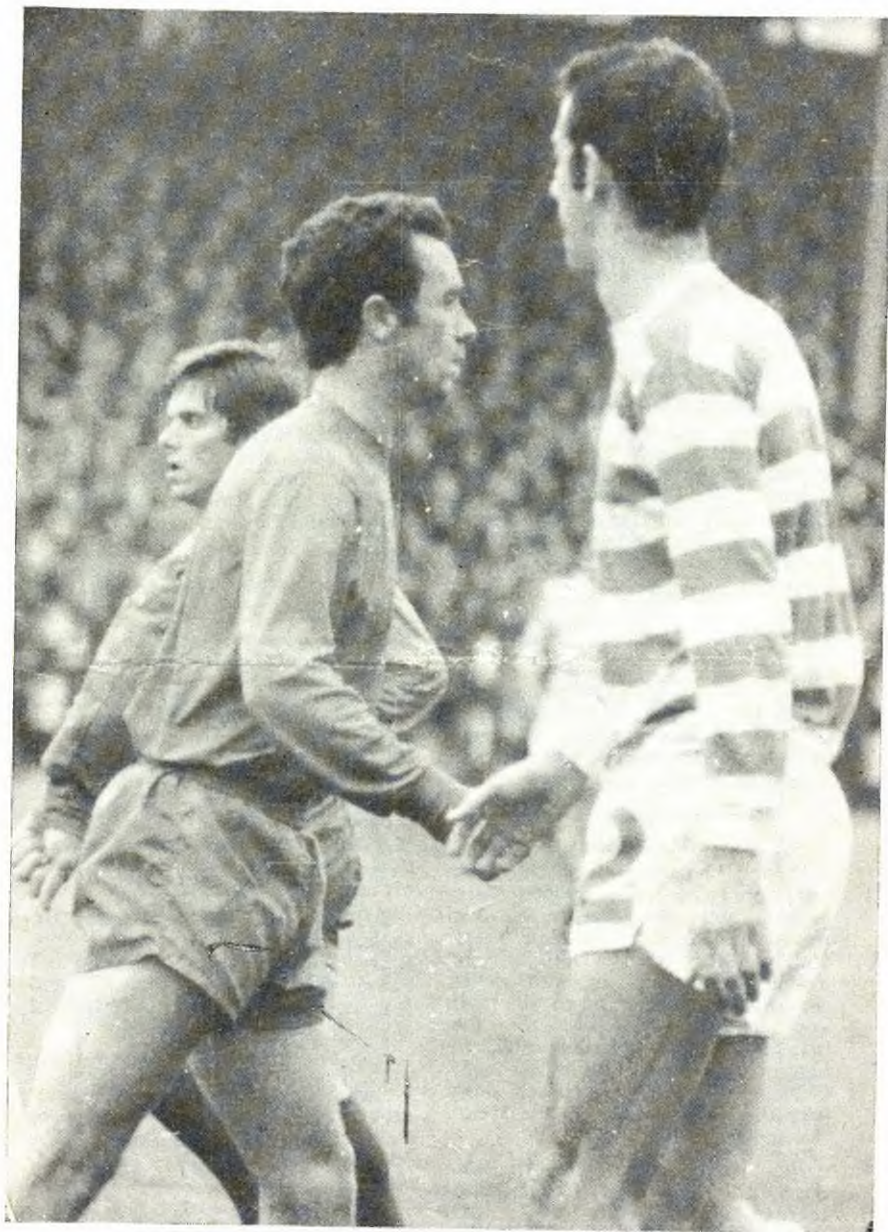

SCOTTISH CUP FEATS OF DUNFERMLINE

Their six ties with Celtic

ONLY Celtic and Rangers have a better record in the Scottish Cup than Dunfermline Athletic in the past nine seasons. Indeed only Dunfermline as well as the "Old Firm," have won the trophy in that period. They have done so twice, compared with Rangers' four successes and Celtic's three; in addition they have been beaten finalists.

Dunfermline have the distinction of having won the trophy the first time they reached the final. That was in 1961, when, under the managership of Jock Stein, they beat Celtic 2-0 at Hampden Park after a 0-0 draw.

Not one of the successful Dunfermline players remains with the club but of the unbeaten Celtic side Billy McNeill, John Clark, Charlie Gallagher, John Hughes and Steve Chalmers are still on the club's books as players. The teams in the second match were:

DUNFERMLINE — Connachan; Fraser and Cunningham; Mailer, Miller and Sweeney; Peebles and Smith; Thomson; Dickson and Melrose.

CELTIC — Haffey; MacKay and O'Neill; Crerand, McNeill and Clark; Gallagher and Fernie; Hughes; Chalmers and Byrne.

Referee—H. Phillips (Wishaw).

ILLNESS

Davie Thomson and Charlie Dickson scored the goals. Sudden illness affected both clubs before the final was decided. Dunfermline were without their regular outside right, Tommy McDonald, in both games, the winger having taken ill with appendicitis just before the first match. Then by curious and unhappy coincidence Jim Kennedy, Celtic's left back, was struck down with the same trouble on the eve of the replay.

Four years later, with Mr. Stein now Celtic's manager, Celtic gained revenge. Down twice by a goal (Harry Melrose and John McLaughlin scored) Celtic won 3-2, Bertie Auld equalising twice and Billy McNeill heading a brilliant winning goal near the end. Teams:

Referee—H. Phillips (Wishaw).

SENSATION

Next season Celtic beat Dunfermline 2-0 in a semi-final at Ibrox. Then in 1968 Dunfermline gained a sensational 2-0 win in the first round at Celtic Park. Hugh Robertson and Pat Gardner scored the goals and the teams were:

CELTIC—Simpson; Cattanach and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Wallace; McBride; Auld and Hughes (substitute, Chalmers, played instead of McBride after 58 minutes).

DUNFERMLINE — Martin (B); Callaghan (W) and Lunn; Fraser, Barry and Thomson; Edwards and Paton; Gardiner; Callaghan (T) and Robertson (substitute, Hunter, played after 54 minutes for Fraser).

Referee—R. H. Davidson (Airdrie).

Jock Stein stopped abruptly a great deal of comment on the causes of Celtic's defeat when he said in "The Celtic View" a few days later:

"The principal reason for us losing to Dunfermline was that they on the day were a better side than Celtic. . . . Let me repeat — Dunfermline deserved their victory. . . . The pity is that it was not gained without one of their players (Jim Fraser) being badly injured. . . ."

Unhappily Fraser has again been the victim of serious injury. He suffered a broken leg on the opening day of this season and only last Saturday returned to competitive football in a Reserve League game. We wish this fine young half back better luck in future.

The only other Celtic-Dunfermline Scottish Cup ties—there have been six in all—were played in 1912 and 1933. In the first round in 1912 at Celtic Park Celtic won 1-0 and in the first round at Dunfermline in 1933 Celtic won 7-1. Jimmy McGrory and Hugh O'Donnell each
