JOCK STEIN says...

We break new ground today by having a match at Celtic Park on a Sunday—and we'll be watching with interest to see how the football public respond.

Today's game hasn't been arranged just to break with tradition. It is simply to have the game played on a day which suits the majority of the public under the present power crisis.

Since the vast majority of the working population have been forced to work a three-day week it stands to reason that Saturday becomes a normal working day for half that number.

As a result of this, the recreation day for the vast majority of people, temporarily at least, is a Sunday.

Clydebank, with two ex-Celts in their line-up will be determined to give a good account of themselves in today's match and I'll be warning our players against any feeling of complacency against our second division opponents.

I was delighted with the display of the team against St. Johnstone. They quickly dispelled any fears that the cancellation of the previous week's game against Morton might have taken the edge off their recent good form.

St. Johnstone are also to be commended for their contribution to a first class match which was interesting and entertaining from first to last.

On the form shown at Celtic Park, the Muirton Park side don't deserve to be languishing near the foot of the league table.

Since I was unable to make any reference in last week's programme about our European Cup quarter-final opponents, I'll take this opportunity to make a few observations.



Firstly I would immediately discount all the talk of our game with Basle merely being a passport into the semi-final stage of the competition. Swiss football has shown a marked improvement in standard in recent years and no one can ignore the fact that in the last round the champions of Switzerland eliminated Bruges of Belgium from the competition.

At the same time I'm happy with the draw and I think that Celtic can progress in the tournament if the team produces their best form over the two legs of the tie.

Of one thing I'm certain, however, if we can't play well enough to overcome Basle, we don't deserve to be in the final stages of Europe's top tournament.

In an attempt to help Basle's date problem we have offered to play in Basle on February 27 or March 5—but the 2nd leg will be played at Celtic Park on March 20.

Spotlight On Today's Scottish Cup Visitors

Today's visitors to Celtic Park, Clydebank, have the distinction of being the youngest club in the Scottish League, having been formed in 1965.

Originally, the Bankies were called E.S. Clydebank (replacing the East Stirling Club) but after a Court of Session ruling they then became Clydebank and the East Stirling club was reformed in Falkirk.

The two Steedman brothers have made their presence known in football circles and not so long ago devised a new league structure for Scottish football that failed to get the necessary support.

Although there are one or two 'Old Heads' in the Clydebank squad, the new Kilbowie Park outfit still pursue a youth policy and some of their younger players were playing in juvenile or amateur football not so long ago.

This afternoon's team will probably come from the following pool of players:—

Jim Gallagher—Signed last season to replace Mike McDonald who joined Stoke City from the Bankies. His good goal-keeping performances have proved him to be a capable and reliable last line of defence.

Dave Mitchell—Former Ayr Utd. defender now in his seventh season with the Clydebank side and one of the 'veterans' of the Kilbowie set-up.

Gregor Abel—A former schoolboy cap who had a spell with Falkirk before joining up at Kilbowie Park last season.

Norrie Hall—Joined the club a couple of seasons ago from Fernhill Athletic in Rutherglen and has quickly established himself in the team.

Jim Fallon—Stepped up direct from schools football in Hamilton five years ago and is now an established member of the team.

Billy McColl—Signed last season from Drumchapel Amateurs, the mid-field player has made a quick breakthrough into the Bankie's team.

Mike Larnach—A product of juvenile team Campsie Black Watch, the goal-scoring striker is attracting the attention of some English clubs.

Sam Henderson—The former Celt was signed from Stirling Albion at the start of the season. Industrious and skilful mid-field man, he is the captain of the side.

Ward White—The second ex-Celt in the Bankie's line up, he was snapped up in the close season on being released by Celtic after four years with the Club.

Andy Roxburgh—Now in his second spell with the Kilbowie side, he's an experienced striker who has also had spells with Queens Park, Partick Thistle and Falkirk.

Bobby Provan—This young 6' 2" centre half is in his first season with Clydebank having joined the club from Glasgow Perthshire last season.

Ian Law—Was a Scottish Youth International 'cap' before joining up at Kilbowie from Clydebank Juniors. A 19 year-old staking a strong challenge for a regular team place.

Ian Currie—Joined the club via North Kelvinside School and Drumchapel Amateurs. Another 19 year-old knocking at the first team door.

Billy Fanning—In his first season as a senior, having joined the club from local juvenile side Belhaven Athletic.

CLYDEBANK'S LAST CUP VISIT TO CELTIC PARK

The last occasion on which Clydebank visited Celtic Park in a cup-tie they started the game with a 5-goal deficit.

That was in season 1971-72 when the two teams clashed in the quarter-final stage of the League Cup and in the first game at Kilbowie Park Celtic went nap and in so doing reduced the second leg match to a mere formality.

Celtic introduced the then 16-year-old Brian McLaughlin into the team for the home match and Brian fully justified his selection with a skill and poise which promised great things for the future.

The teams for the second leg match, which was played on Sept. 22, 1971 were as follows:—

Celtic—Williams; Craig and Brogan; Hay, McNeill and Connelly Hood and McLaughlin; Macari, Callaghan and Lennox. Twelfth man Hughes.

Clydebank—McDonald, Mitchell and Gray; Ruddy, Fallon and Hay; McFarlane and Love; Kane, Munro and Caskie. Twelfth man—Hall.

Celtic picked up where they had left off in the first match and after only two minutes play Harry Hood opened the scoring. The Bankies surprised everyone by equalising quarter of an hour later. Harry Hood restored Celtic's lead with a well-taken shot.

Shortly after the interval Ruddy scored an own goal and twenty minutes later Celtic had added another two goals, first by Macari and then Hood completed his hat-trick.

Clydebank kept plugging away and near the end Dougie Hay scored a second goal.

With two minutes left for play, however, Lou Macari scored his second and Celtic's sixth goal to make it 6-2 on the night.
