parkhead pop review

THIS week in the Pop Review, let's have a look at the video industry.

The launch of the VHD video disc, developed by Thorn EMI in conjunction with JVC in Japan, has now been postponed indefinitely — due, say Thorn EMI, to adverse market conditions. In other words, buyers have been in no great hurry to acquire the Philips Laservision system, which now has the field to itself.

The £20 million invested by Thorn EMI in the VHD is not likely to be lightly written off. Plants in Swindon and Cologne, which were specially built to produce the VHD discs, are being moth-balled while work continues on developing the VHD discs for computer and video games. The VHD disc, similar to the disc memory stores of medium-sized computers, is reputed to be ideal for so-called interactive TV uses in games, teaching and other areas.

The videocassette equivalent of the vinyl pop single is currently CBS/Sony's fast-selling fifteen dollar-plus reality in Japan. Now plans for a Stateside launch are imminent. Guess it's brown paper bag over the head time for many artists, whilst, others can take comfort that for bands like The Boomtown Rats video killed the record star.

A couple of early rock'n'roll videos hit the racks and rentals this month. Atlantis Video release *Blue Sueded Shoes*, featuring Bill Haley, Eddie Cochran and Gene Vincent alongside home grown talent such as Billy Fury, Tommy Steele and Cliff Richard. Precision Video, meanwhile, are putting out *The London Rock and Roll Show*, a film of the 1973 Wembley concert featuring Little Richard, Bo Diddley, Jerry Lee Lewis, Bill Haley and Chuck Berry, including interviews with some of the stars concerned.

Thorn EMI continue their releases (which already include such classics as Polanski's debut *Knife In The Water* with Billy Wilder's *Fedora*, Marcel Caine's *Les Enfants Du Paradis*, Fassbinder's *Despair*, Fellini's *Nights of Cabiria* and Wajda's *A Generation*).

CELTIC had the worst possible results in their holiday programme losing at Ayr on Saturday, December 31 and going down 0-1 to Motherwell at Celtic Park the following Monday.

At Somerset Park Celtic had the best of the opening exchanges and could have scored on at least a couple of occasions. Instead of that they found themselves a goal behind after eight minutes of play. A long ball into the middle of the Celtic area found Danny Masterton all alone and he made no mistake with a header from close range.

However in the first minute of the second half Celtic were on level terms with a cracker of a goal. Straight from the start they attacked down the left and when Tom McAdam passed the ball inside to Edvaldsson he fairly blasted the ball into the net. Although Celtic had most of the ball they couldn't find the net again and with only two minutes to go ex-Celt Brian McLaughlin scored the winning goal for Ayr.

Against Motherwell, the Celtic blend looked good in the early stages but dour Motherwell defensive play and some bad luck prevented them from finding the net. Then, as at Ayr, their opponents pinched a goal on the breakaway and put an added strain on to the Celtic search for goals. O'Rourke was the marksman.
