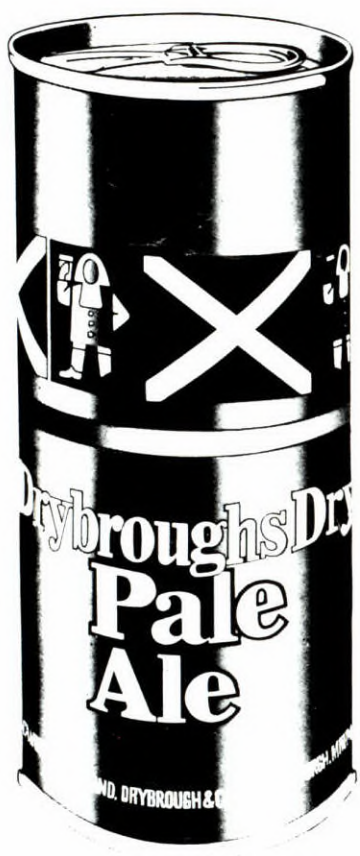

# Bankies' aim for top ten

**TODAY'S match has been switched from Clydebank to Parkhead because of reconstruction work at Kilbowie Park, one further example of the long term ambitions of this lively and progressive club.**

They missed promotion to the Premier League by a whisker last season, but having experienced the atmosphere of the Top Ten in 1977-78 they are keen to return . . . and stay.

Clydebank's aspirations are reflected in the number of players on the staff . . . forty of them.

"We aim to go one better this season," says their energetic and irrepressible manager Bill Munro who has been player, trainer, coach and team boss with the club. Bill has done all manner of jobs for the Bankies . . . even to marking off the pitch!

He's recruited a number of young players for a season which bring into being the Under 18 Professional Youth League. "We had to be in it. After all it was originated by Clydebank. It is a fine area for bringing on young players in a really competitive league against other senior clubs."

Bankies' fans are looking forward to seeing the one new face in the recognised first team pool . . . Joe Sweeney.

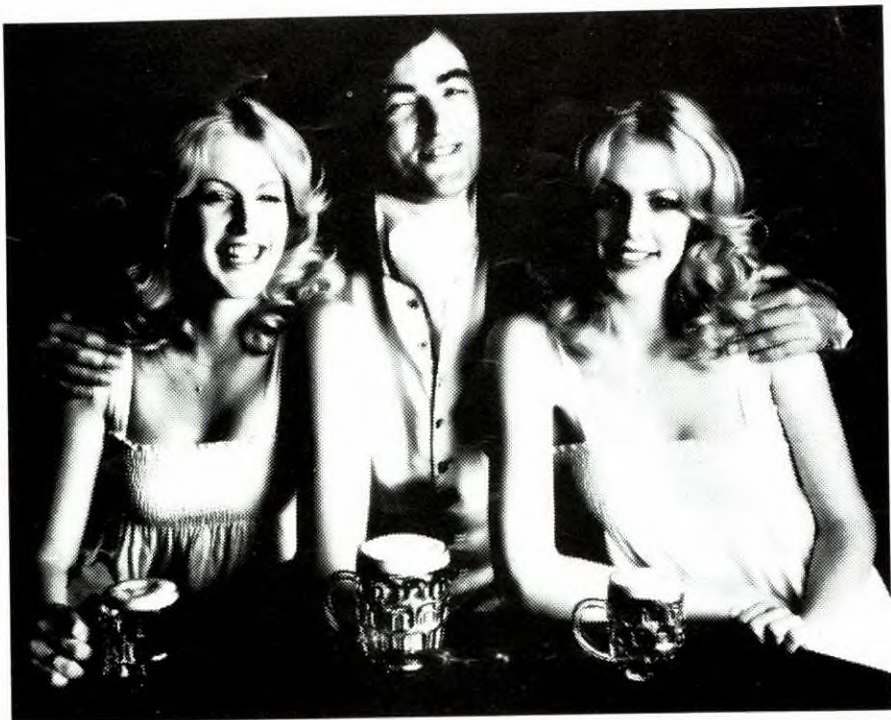
Joe was signed from Pollok Juniors to take the place of striker Frank McDougall, who joined St. Mirren a few weeks ago for a fee reported variously from £140,000 to £175,000 . . . a record between Scottish clubs.

"It was good business", agreed manager Munro. For McDougall signed a year earlier from junior Glasgow Perthshire, cost three figures! In his season at Kilbowie he became the club's top scorer (28 goals) and formed a fine forward partnership with Blair Miller.

The departure of McDougall has "left a bit of a hole in the side" and Sweeney is the man with the chance to fill the gap. "He's shaped up well in training," says manager Munro. "He's a big, strong lad and just as fast as Frank McDougall. He is in the pool of players for tonight's game.

The Kilbowie boss would have liked a few more games before tackling Celts. However, holidays have created minor problems, though he did manage to get in two fixtures last week apart from training games.

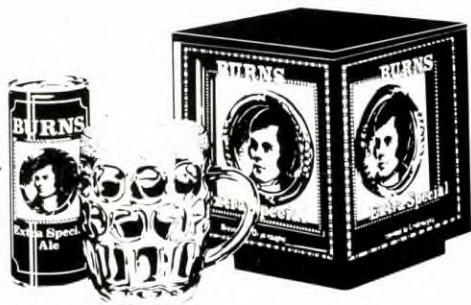
The Clydebank players are delighted to have a tilt with the Scottish champions. "I really don't require to boost them for this one," say their boss.
