# JOCK STEIN says...

Today we play our quarter-final tie of the Scottish Cup against Motherwell and, if the game comes up to the standard of our previous meetings with the Fir-parkers, it will be a game well worth watching.

To date we have played the Fir Park side five times and we have won three and lost two of these meetings. This game should attract a large crowd because both teams play with the emphasis on attack and that is what football is all about.

Football fans have made it patently clear that negative defensive football won't encourage them to attend matches and it is, therefore, incumbent on all of us in the game to provide the football that will attract people into the grounds.

Last week's game against Hearts produced the win we wanted, even though we didn't play as well as we might have done. Nevertheless, the game that follows a trip to Europe is always a difficult one, because of travel fatigue and changes of food and climate.

On this occasion it was doubly difficult, because we had lost a game that we always looked capable of winning.

Apart from that, we had to introduce young Roddy MacDonald into the side, in place of the injured Billy McNeill. Although he hasn't been asked to deputise for several months, Roddy came through the match very well and the experience will again stand him in good stead for the future.

During the game Alistair Hunter was badly handicapped by a leg injury which considerably reduced his mobility. So all things considered, a win in these circumstances was something we could be pleased about.

Jimmy Bone made his debut in the second half against Hearts and did enough to suggest that, when he is



adjusted to our set-up, he could prove a valuable addition to the staff.

Another pleasing feature of last weekend was the return, albeit for only twenty minutes, of young Brian McLaughlin in the reserve team at Tynecastle. Brian deserves great credit for the tireless and uncompromising way he has worked towards his goal of complete fitness.

# MOTHERWELL PEN PORTRAITS

**Stewart Rennie**—Signed from Falkirk in October as replacement for £100,000 Keith MacRae and his form has been so impressive that MacRae is hardly ever mentioned around Fir Park. A part-timer, Edinburgh-based Stewart works as a civil servant at the Department of Agriculture.

**Willie Watson**—A Bellshill boy, snapped up by manager St. John when released by Manchester United after eight years at Old Trafford. He made 25 first team appearances at Old Trafford. Was a Scottish schools cap at under-15 level. Played full-back and centre-half, but has settled in at right-back for 'Well. Tall and firm in the tackle.

**Bobby Graham**—Transferred from Coventry City for £20,000 in September and has been a key factor in the 'Well upsurge this season. A Motherwell boy, he left for Liverpool as a 15-year-old, staying at Anfield during the "great years" before moving to Coventry for £80,000. Fast, clever reader of the game, good header of the ball and packs a strong shot.

**Joe Wark**—Signed from Irvine Vics in 1967-68 season. Belongs to Glasgow, and is a versatile player with unending enthusiasm for the game. Strong personality at Fir Park, currently Player of the Year (for 2nd time) and is club captain.

**Bobby Watson**—Was signed in 1970 from Rangers, is a director in steel stockholding firm, and came to Motherwell in an exchange deal for Peter McCloy. He has played in both sweeper and mid-field roles effectively Former Player of the Year at Fir Park.

**Jim Muir**—Was signed in 1967-68 season from Irvine Vics, originally as a centre, but last season he was switched to double centre half with a fair degree of success. He is an ex-foundry worker, now a full-timer and a very industrious player.

**Peter Millar**—Was signed from Dunfermline in 1972, he is a local

lad, and was a Motherwell fan before signing for Arbroath, then Dunfermline. He is a hard opponent and very versatile. He also is a full-timer.

**John Goldthorp**—Was signed from Lesmahagow Juniors in 1968 and is a full-timer. Tall, shrewd distributor, useful in the air, recently moved forward from mid-field to striker. Has netted more than 17 goals this season, netted winners in two previous meetings with Celtic.

**Jim McCabe**—Signed from Bargeddie Amateurs in 1969. A regular first team player but currently sidelined because of injury.

**Alex Martin**—Was signed in 1970 from Hull City. He spent three years at Hull after winning school caps and can adapt between mid-field or striker, operating successfully in mid-field. Netted both goals in earlier cup win over Brechin City.

**John Muir**—Was signed in 1969 from Rotherham, full timer, he is a hard, uncompromising defender who showed promise as driving midfield man for spells last year.

**John Gray**—Was signed in 1972 from Cumbernauld. Small, but cheekily confident winger, he made a big impact early last season before being laid low by illness. He is an electrician, and lives in Glasgow.

**Willie McClymont**—Another product of Cumbernauld United who was first spotted playing with Eastercraigs. Talented Player who lives in Glasgow, he is a full-timer and has made several first team appearances.

**Willie Leishman**—Joined up from Dalziel High School in 1970. Has only had occasional first team games but could break through to the top side anytime.

**Ian Kennedy**—Tall, slim, fast-raiding winger, signed from Eastercraigs at the start of the season and called up shortly after. Made his debut against Morton. Packs a strong left foot shot.

# TODAY'S SCOTTISH CUP VISITORS

Motherwell Football Club have in their 87 years history, won every honour open to them in Scottish Football.

In 1932 they ended the Rangers-Celtic monopoly in the championship that had spanned for almost a quarter century to win the League for the first and only time and in the following two seasons they finished runners-up in the League.

Next boom period came in the early '50's. In 1951 they won the League Cup, beating Hibs 3-1 in the final, and a year later, they went on to win the Scottish Cup. Two seasons later 'Well were relegated for the first time . . . only to win promotion a year later as Division II Champions.

The "Ansell Babes" dominated the late '50's when the club's prestige shot high and although no titles or trophies were won, the calibre of football served up was outstanding. In 1965 with the club reaching the Scottish Cup semi-final against Celtic, a switch in management took place with Bobby Howitt taking over from Bobby Ansell. Although Celtic won the game and the Cup, just three months later the Summer Cup was nestling in the Fir Park boardroom after 'Well had beaten Dundee Utd. on aggregate in a two-leg final.

Last year, another managerial change took place when Bobby Howitt stepped down after seven years in the "hot seat", and former Fir Park idol Ian St. John was appointed the new manager.

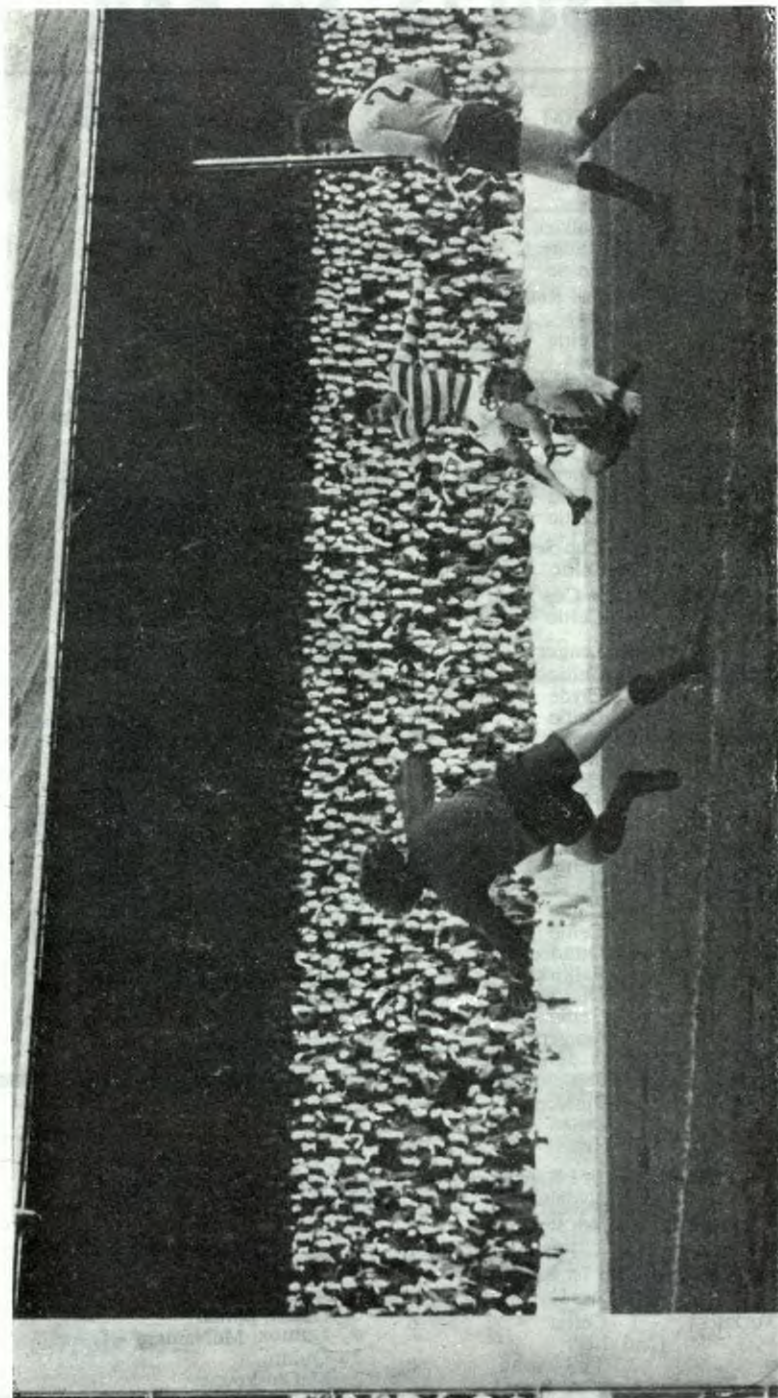
