CELTIC beat Ayr United by 3-0 on Saturday, March 11, 1978, to jump to the middle of the Premier League and perhaps also to serve warning that they could still finish the season nearer the top than the bottom.

Number two came from a quick throw-in from Tom McAdam to Ronnie Glavin. Ronnie tore towards goal and left footed a rocket shot which 'keeper Sproat got his hands to but couldn't prevent going into the net. George McCluskey headed the third goal when a shot from Ronnie Glavin was blocked by the goalkeeper.

Celtic opened the scoring on the half hour mark and nine minutes later they had increased their goals tally to three. The all-important opening goal came after George McCluskey took a short corner on the left, got a return pass and blasted the ball across the goal. All it required was a touch and that was provided with a nod of the head from Jo Edvaldsson and Celtic had broken their duck.

THE front page story of the 'Celtic View' dated March 14, 1973, read like this:

Changes will be made for Celtic's bid to get back on the winning way against Aberdeen in the Cup on Saturday.

Midfield maestro Bobby Murdoch returned to action with the reserves against Dundee United on Monday and there is no doubt we need his experience, drive and constructive ability.

Saturday's game at Tannadice cried out for a Murdoch type player for after a bright start with a great Bobby Lennox goal, the entire team for some unaccountable reason lost all idea of building up moves and simply banged the ball about hoping for the best. Murdoch would have controlled the midfield, built up attacks and generally provided the composure needed for this type of game.

United's two goals ruthlessly exposed glaring weaknesses in the Parkhead defence and I must admit it's difficult to pinpoint the culprit as so many players were caught right out of position when United scored.

CELTIC recorded a convincing League win over Aberdeen at Celtic Park to keep in contention at the top of the table. The details of the match played on March 6, 1968, at Celtic Park were as follows: CELTIC 4 (Lennox 3, McNeill); ABERDEEN 1 (Johnston). CELTIC: Simpson, Gemmell and O'Neill; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Lennox; Wallace; Gallagher and Hughes. Twelfth man: Hay.

Two nights later Newcastle United were the visitors to Celtic Park in a challenge game and, like the match at St James Park the previous month, they again won by an odd goal — CELTIC 2 (Johnstone, Lennox), Newcastle United 3 (Davies, Scott, Robson T.).

Manager Jock Stein wrote in his column in the 'Celtic View': "No one should assume that Jimmy Smith (Aberdeen) or any other player of note will fall into the hands of Celtic.

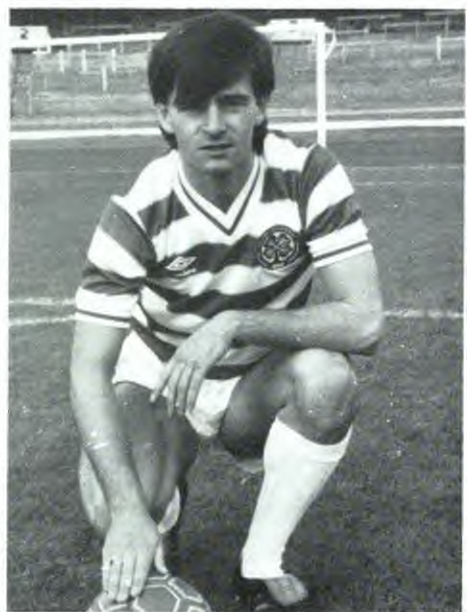
THIS message from Charlie Nicholas appeared on the front page of this week's Celtic View, headed **Newspaper Talk**.

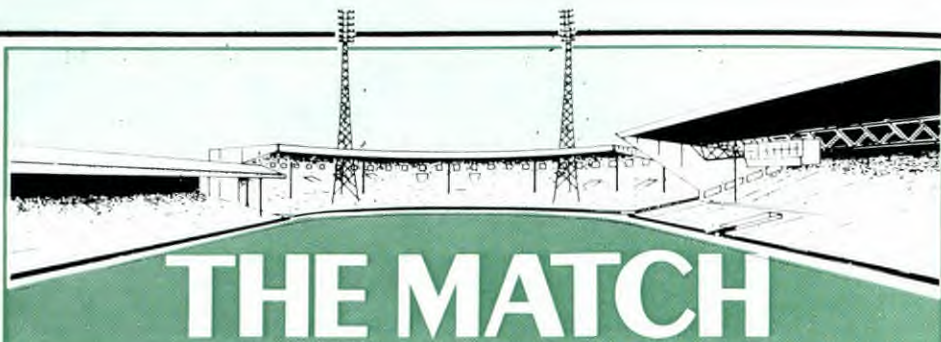

FLASHBACK

THIS is, of course, Hearts second season in a row in the first division. In season 1980-81, however, they played in the Premier league and had to travel to Celtic Park twice. Celtic won both matches with scores of 3-2 and 6-0.

On their visits to Tynecastle that season, Celtic also collected full points with a 2-0 and a 3-0 victory.

Hearts also featured in the top ten during season 1978-79 and that year Celtic took six of the eight possible points from the meetings of the clubs. The scores were 4-0 and 1-0 to Celtic in Glasgow with Hearts winning 2-0 and losing 3-0 in Edinburgh.
