# Dons ready to take second chance

**JUDGING from the sounds from Pittodrie, the Aberdeen players haven't yet heard that Celtic are favourites to win tonight's replay in the Scottish Cup quarter final tie at Parkhead!**

They certainly don't feel they have lost their chance to progress in the national tourney . . . nor does their boss Alex Ferguson.

He sees a stronger — and better — Dons squad in action this evening. He has Drew Jarvie and Doug Rougvie back . . . the former at midfield and the latter resuming a strong and improving partnership at the centre of the defence with Aberdeen skipper Willie Miller.

Aberdeen admit they didn't strike their best rhythm in the first tilt at Pittodrie, but didn't hold back in their praise for Celtic.

Certainly the improvement from the Celtic team whipped 4—1 in a Premier League match back in October was most marked, and while the Dons had seen some of the signs in the championship fixture a week earlier at Parkhead there wasn't much they could do about it in face of Celtic's determined attitude.

So having got a second bite at

the tie — one which some commentators felt they didn't deserve — the mood of the Aberdeen men is this: Let's take full advantage of the let-off.

And they certainly have the resources to do so. Immediately to mind comes Joe Harper, Scotland's leading scorer, who demonstrated why he's at the top of the goals list with one flash on Saturday.

Joe's ready to pounce on the briefest loss of concentration by the opposition. That's what he did to Celtic . . . and the warning will assuredly be carried into the game tonight by every Parkhead player.

Drew Jarvie's experience in the midfield can have a pronounced influence on the flow of Aberdeen's attacking pattern and he is a player who has not forgotten his days as an out and out striker, coming up with vital goals for the Pittodrie club.

And, of course, Celts will have to be pretty sharp around the goal area now that Aberdeen have "revealed" they've got a second keeper in Gordon Strachan! The smallest man in the Pittodrie squad twice headed clear on the goal-line Jo Edvalds-son head flicks which seemed netbound.

The little midfielder player was the man who made the big difference between Dons departing and staying in the Cup.

The third meeting between the teams in 12 days clearly means that one of them will have to come up with something "new" to break the deadlock and in two matches in rapid succession the teams have found out a great deal about each other.

Who will spring the surprise? Aberdeen hope the return of Rougvie and Jarvie will be enough.
