**T**HESSE ARE the other six teams left in the European Cup. Three of them, along with the winners of tonight's tie at Celtic Park, will go into the semi-final draw in Zurich on Friday.

After the first leg Bayern Munich and Atletico Madrid look certain qualifiers.

And Ujpest Dozsa, Celtic's opponents in the previous two seasons, will probably be the third.

Apart from Celtic, none of the clubs left in the competition, has ever won the cup. Only Bayern, Basle and Ujpest have never been semi-finalists.

**“The one thing above all else is to guard against over confidence”**



**E**VERY CELTIC PLAYER knows exactly what has to be done tonight to reach the semi-finals. Manager Jock Stein had this to say:

“ Our opponents have a one-goal lead from the first leg in Basle and they will pretty certainly play a tight defensive game, hoping to attack on the break.

“ Our supporters are experienced enough in European Cup methods to know that to win through tonight we have to go looking for goals. At the same time we cannot afford to be exposed in defence, so our tactics must be to attack with caution.

“ The Celtic support can be a tremendous help to the team but they must roar the boys on—even

if things aren't happening as quickly as they would like.

“ Basle, contrary to some reports, ended the first game against us looking a more than competent team and they had several very capable players in their team.

“ Few of our players played to anything like their best form in the first game and I confidently expect them to reach a much higher standard of efficiency tonight.

“ The one thing above all else that I have told the players to guard against is over-confidence.

“ A Celtic success tonight has been predicted in most quarters but the players, and our fans, know that progress in the competition can only be guaranteed by our performance on the park.”

**C**OACH OF THE Swiss champions, Basle, Helmut Benthaus, was capped eight times for West Germany when he played in the Bundesliga with Cologne.

When he first joined Basle it was as player-coach and, in fact, he played in both games against Celtic in the European Cup first round tie of 1969-70 season.

In an interview with the Celtic View after the game at Celtic Park on October 1, 1969, he said:

“I knew Celtic would be a much more formidable team at home and I was most impressed by the fervour of the crowd.

“The Scottish fans give their team much more encouragement than the spectators on the continent.

“European fans become much more impatient

when things aren't going well and they are quick in voicing their displeasure.”

The Basle coach returned to Glasgow for the Celtic league match with Dundee last month and after the game—which Celtic lost by 2-1—he said:

“That was a tremendous match. Celtic were unlucky to lose. They had most of the game but their finishing let them down. In spite of this, I think Celtic will be far too fast for us.”

After the game in Basle, Mr Benthaus, flushed with excitement after his team's victory, commented:

“I was delighted with the team's performance, and I think that we could now go on to qualify for the semi-final stage of the tournament. We'll be looking for goals on the break as Celtic attack all out.”
