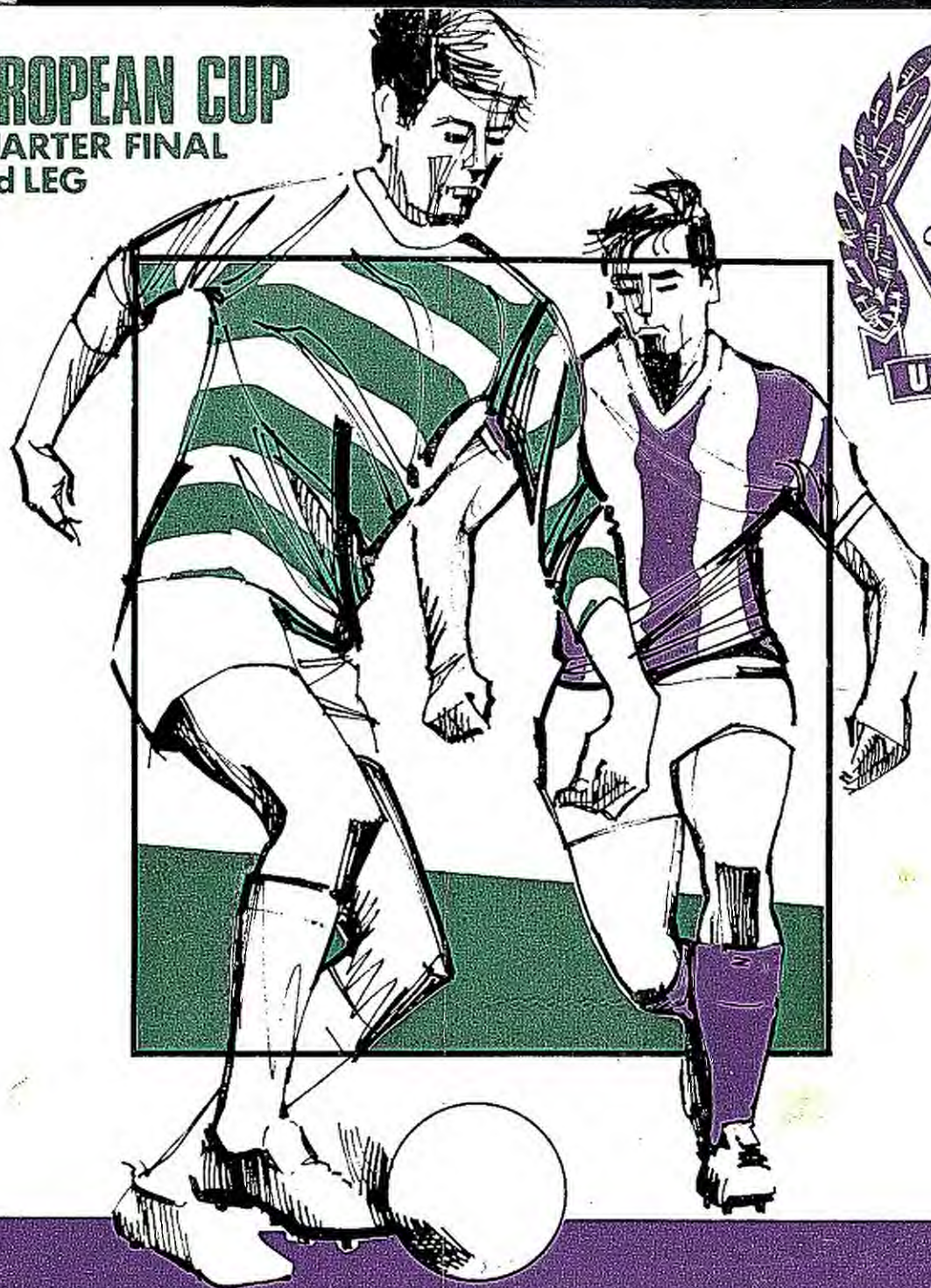

# Ujpest Dozsa Sports Club

As the name indicates, Ujpest Dozsa is much more than a football team. Like so many other similar organisations on the Continent it embraces practically all forms of sport.

Ujpest Dozsa is an industrial area with many factories in one of the older districts of the Hungarian Capital, Budapest.

It was in the 1880's that sports activity in this area began to show itself as a force and on the 16th June, 1885, Ujpest Torna Egylet (UTE for short) was formed and the first mayor of Ujpest was elected as honourable secretary of the club.

It was only a short time later that soccer began to be imported from Great Britain, becoming more and more popular, which resulted in the formation of a football section which quickly sprang to prominence in Hungary.

UTE football team won the Second Division Championship of Hungary for the first time in 1903 and from that time forward has played in the First Division, with the exception of the year 1911.

On the 17th September, 1922, the Football Stadium of Ujpest was opened and was the first stadium in Hungary.

Just over 20 years ago the club was reformed into Ujpest Dozsa Sport Club which now belongs to the Ministry of Interior of the Hungarian People's Republic.

The Sport Club as comprised today includes the following:—Athletics, Wrestling, Judo, Ice-hockey, Kayak-Canoe, Cycling, Handball, Football, Boxing, Modern Pentathlon, Volleyball, Sport Shooting, Skiing, Lawn Tennis, Gymnastics, Swimming and Water Polo, Fencing.

Thirty-one athletes from the club competed for Hungary in the Tokyo Olympic Games in 1964 and 28 athletes took place in the Mexico Olympics, 1968.

There can be no doubt, however, that the football section of the Club, with its popular colours of violet and white, have brought to Ujpest Dozsa their greatest popularity and renown.

In 1960 on the occasion of the 75th Anniversary of the foundation of the Club, the soccer team won the Hungarian Championships, but in the following nine years the fans

of Ujpest Dozsa had to wait in vain for their beloved football team to become champions again, although the team was considered one of the best in Hungary. At last, in 1969/70, the team was successful and won well ahead of the other teams, the first place in the Hungarian Championships, and were again successful last season.

1969/70 was the tenth championship won by Ujpest since the foundation of the club and enabled them, for the first time, to qualify for the most outstanding football event in Europe, the European Champion Clubs Cup.

In 1969, after beating Leeds both in Leeds and in Budapest in the semi-final of the Fairs Cities Cup, they were beaten in the final by Newcastle United.

Like most other top clubs, Ujpest Dozsa have travelled all over the world, including South America where they beat Universitario and Municipal in Lima.

In 1971 they had an outstanding victory over Real Madrid and also a victory over CSZKA, Moscow.

Today they are undoubtedly a team to be feared as all their regular first team players have been members of the Hungarian National Team.

Undoubtedly among their many stars their top player would be Ferenc Bene, their world-famous centre forward and top scorer in the Tokyo Olympic Games and today, with their twin striker Fuzekas, running neck and neck with our Kenny Dalglish as top scorers in Europe.

Antal Dunai II, who won, behind Portugal's Eusebio, the "Silver Boots" in 1968, and the "Bronze Boots" in 1969, is another potential goal scorer. Janos Gorocs is considered the mental leader of the team and is today also the captain of the National Team.

Tonight we expect a great match against this star studded outfit.

# Where our visitors come from

Since prehistoric times there have been settlements on the site of modern Budapest, as it was ideally placed in those far-off ages for hunting on the plains and our remote ancestors dug pits and trapped the Mammoth and Woolly Rhinoceros as they retreated every year before the winter snows.

Budapest is split into two twin cities—Buda on the right bank of the Danube at the foot of the Buda mountains with Pest on the left bank on the borders of the great plain. There are not many cities in the world so beautifully situated. Being on the Danube, Budapest is on a natural waterway through Central Europe and large ships can travel down to the Black Sea through the Bosphorus into the Mediterranean, or up river into Austria and Vienna.

The Chain Bridge that joined the two banks of the Danube was built in 1848 and made possible the union of the three towns—Pest, Buda and Old Buda.

In 1872 these three townships became

known as Budapest and became established as the Capital of Hungary.

As well as being an industrial city, Budapest is renowned for its restaurants and traditional Hungarian Cooking, which is famous for its spicy meats, tasty fish, game and poultry dishes. The wine of the country, Tokay, is distinctly stronger than the normal French wines, but suits the rich Hungarian dishes very well.

Budapest is, to a certain extent, a city of music. There are two Opera Houses, one Operetta Theatre and nine other theatres which, from time to time, also have musicals on their programmes. Youth is also served with beat and jazz evenings in many cafes and night clubs.

There are many Lidos on the River Danube for swimming and many fishermen pass many pleasant hours on the great river.

The Hungarians are naturally hospitable and are a friendly people, which makes a visit to their country a pleasure.

## IMRE KOVÁCS, Coach

Imre Kovács was born in Budapest. He only recently joined Ujpest Dozsa and has, since 1971, been coach to the Football Section. Kovács had a distinguished football career and played with the soccer team MTK of Budapest, with whom he became a world famous player, having several times been a member of the National side and was a member of their Olympic Team. Having finished his soccer career he travelled to Egypt and acted as a coach in that country before returning home to Hungary. He has already crossed swords with Celtic being in charge of MTK when, in spite of losing 3-0 in Glasgow, won the return match 4-0 in Budapest.

After his visit to Glasgow to see us play Hibernian he was interviewed by Varga Bela in Hungary and had this to say to the Hungarian sports writer:

"It would be reckless, irresponsible, not to exploit this chance of getting into the next round of the Cup. Eight years ago the Scots played better. And only Johnstone and McNeill remain from that team. And the level of play they could produce then also seems to belong to the past. The young men of today are superior to their predecessors only in their strength: they are faster, more rugged than the old Celtic."

Benfica are running away with the League this year and scoring more goals this season than they have for a long time. Up to the beginning of March they had played 21 matches—won 18—drawn 3—lost none—scored 59 goals and lost only 9 and as we said at the beginning, are 7 points clear at the top of the League. The rise to form of Eusebio has undoubtedly something to do with this great return to success.

Marseille have this season leapt to the front of French football and as well as being an easy first in the First Division have, with 13 matches played, had a total attendance of 306,586, which is an average gate of 23,584.

Our old friends from Nantes come second in the attendance figures in France with 161,523 for 12 matches played with an average gate of 13,460 people.

Saint-Etienne, our other past opponents, are just below that figure.

At the other end of the scale in France is Monaco with a total attendance of only 38,571 people for 13 matches with an average attendance of just under 3,000 per match.

Doctor Aldo Stacchi of Italy has been appointed as official delegate of U.E.F.A. for this match tonight.

Bene and Fazekas had, up to the close-down of football in Hungary, each played 16 matches for Ujpest Dozsa and each scored 16 goals in these same matches. This is a very high record and these twin spearheads will require to be watched with care.

The draw for the Semi-Finals will be drawn on the 24th March, 1972, at 12 noon in the Hotel St. Gotthard, Bahnhofstrasse 87, Zürich.

The might of Holland had quite a considerable setback in the first leg of the quarter finals when both teams at home only managed to scrape through by the odd goal. For Arsenal to go to Amsterdam and get away with only a 2-1 defeat, must give them a real chance in London tonight. Feyenoord of Rotterdam had a victory of only 1-0 against Benfica, which leaves them a very difficult task against the vastly improved Benfica side. Eusebio is no longer playing as a striker but in mid-field as a link man. It could well be that we will be visiting Lisbon once again. The other quarter-finalists, Inter Milan, only managed to beat Standard Liege 1-0 in Milan, which must give Standard a great chance of going into the semi finals. However, as Inter Milan are well behind in the championship race, they will undoubtedly put up a terrific effort in Belgium, to keep their Club in the European Cup.

### Mr. STEIN'S MESSAGE

No club from Eastern Europe has ever won the European Cup, but most countries in Eastern Europe consider that Ujpest Dozsa will this year provide a formidable challenge.

Victory tonight would give us entry once again into the Semi-Finals of this competition and perhaps even give us a chance of repeating the 1967 Victory in Europe.

Tonight we would like our supporters to give the Hungarians a warm welcome onto Celtic Park, but after that we would like the full Celtic sound behind the boys for yet another Victory in Europe.

We have to thank S.T.V. for managing to put on the whole of our match in Hungary for the benefit of our supporters here in Scotland. We understand that Glasgow was quite deserted from 4.30 p.m. onwards.

Goals are still very hard to come by in Italy where Juventus, leading the League at the beginning of March, had only scored 34 goals and lost 17 in 20 matches played. Immediately behind them A.C. Milan, for the same number of matches played, had only scored 24 goals for with 12 against. This type of football would, I am sure, hardly entertain the Scottish public who are interested in plenty of action and attacking football.
