## LOOKING BACK

**5**  
YEARS  
AGO

ON Saturday, March 25, 1978, Celtic were at home to Rangers in a Premier League game and following the League Cup final defeat of the previous week they were anxious to get revenge.

With 32 minutes played Celtic opened the scoring when a Ronnie Glavin shot dipped in front of Stewart Kennedy and beat him at his left post. Seven minutes later and Celtic were two up when Roddie McDonald shot past Kennedy. It all started with a Ronnie Glavin free-kick low and hard towards goal. Jo Edvaldsson stopped the ball and back-heeled it to Roddie McDonald to place a right foot shot beyond the reach of the Rangers' keeper.

Celtic again took the game to Rangers in the second half and created chances to increase their lead. Unfortunately none were accepted. Although Rangers fought back a bit as the game progressed the outcome of the match was never in doubt.

ON the front page of the 'Celtic View', dated March 28, 1973, John McPhail wrote:

Celtic are back with a true League and Cup winning look about them. The recent sag that saw so many points squandered is over. The boys proved this against Aberdeen twice, and Hearts at Tynecastle.

It was fitting that after one of the greatest cup-ties seen in years skipper Billy McNeill should score the golden goal at Pittodrie to give Celts a semi-final spot. Billy has been under a bit of a cloud this season but his confidence is now fully restored and I don't think I have seen him better than he was at Tynecastle.

The spirit is high among the players and they are always at their best when the chips are down in the tense tough run-in for the League and Cup. All this with class players like Kenny Dalglish, Jimmy Johnstone and Tommy Callaghan on the touchline. Celtic are still far ahead of their rivals for the depth of playing resources and the great experience of Lennox, Murdoch, McNeill, Brogan and Hood has played a vital part in the last three matches.

CELTIC, following their League win at Falkirk, flew over to Dublin to play a friendly match against Shamrock Rovers at Dalymount Park. The game ended in a 2-2 draw and Willie Wallace scored both Celtic's goals.

Raith Rovers were the visitors to Celtic Park the following Saturday, March 23, 1968 and the details of that encounter were as follows:

Celtic 5 (Wallace, Hughes, Lennox), Raith Rovers 0. Celtic: Simpson; Craig and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Lennox; Wallace; Gallagher and Hughes. Substitute: Chalmers.

On the same afternoon the Celtic Reserves travelled through to Kirkcaldy and recorded a 4-0 victory.

The team was: Fallon; Murray and Shevlane; Cattanach, Connelly and Clark, John; Taggart and McBride; Quinn; Hay and Clark, Jim. Joe McBride (2) and Jimmy Quinn and Davie Hay were the scorers.

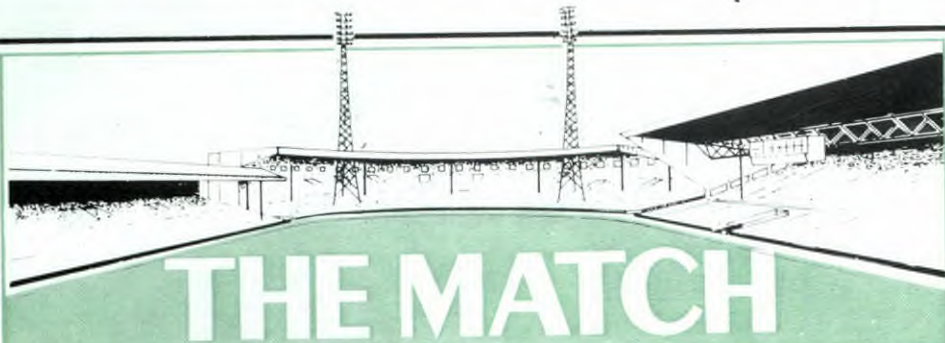
