# JOCK STEIN says...

The two weeks that have passed since my last league programme piece have been very eventful indeed.

A fortnight ago we played most convincingly to defeat Ayr United by 4-0 and then on the following Wednesday we had that memorable struggle with Basle to reach the semi-final stage of the European Cup.

The game with Basle which we started trailing by a goal from the first leg was a see-saw match which first saw us equalise on aggregate and then take an overall one goal lead. Then, just as we seemed to have the game under control Basle hit us with two goals to take the lead once again.

I honestly thought that the Swiss team turned the game their way with a bit of blatant gamesmanship.

This came about with their goalkeeper substitution which I thought took an inordinate length of time to achieve.

The long stoppage seemed to break the Celtic concentration when they had the visitors on the rack and the Basle team obviously derived some benefit from the breather.

All's well that ends well, however, and although it took us a period of extra time to win the tie we still got the win we were after.

The one black note in the proceedings was the unfortunate injury to George Connelly which will have him sidelined for about a month.

The draw for the semi-final which paired us with Atletico Madrid gives us our first European Cup clash with Spanish opponents.



I'm travelling to Madrid to see them in action to-morrow, but really, I am more concerned with our play which will be vital. A good performance at Celtic Park on the 10th of April will go a long way to another European Cup final appearance.

# DUMBARTON PEN PORTRAITS

**Laurie Williams**—Joined Dumbarton from Port Glasgow Juniors in 1970. Not very tall for a goalkeeper at 5 ft. 10 ins. but makes up for it with tremendous agility. Had great games against Celtic in Hampden League Cup clashes in October 1970. Has had lengthy absence recently because of broken cheekbone injury.

**John Taylor**—Came from Queen's Park in June 1973 but has made a number of appearances in first team following Laurie William's injury. Stands over 6 feet tall.

**Donald Watt**—Joined Celtic from Shettleston Juniors in 1970 and after showing early promise was out of action for some time with a bad injury. Was released by Celtic at the end of last season and joined up at Boghead.

**Billy Wilkinson**—Joined up in 1968 from Dunbartonshire minor grade team Balloch Junives. Gained some Junior experience with St. Anthony's before being called up by the Sons. Although he has been with the club a few years he's still only 22.

**Colin McAdam**—Was signed from Clydebank Junives in February 1970. Has been very unfortunate in receiving some bad injuries which have resulted in long spells on the sidelines. Colin is currently attending Jordanhill College where he is a Physical Education student.

**Alan McKay**—Former Third Lanark player who was captain at Cathkin when the club became defunct. After a spell with Motherwell he joined Dumbarton and is now in his fifth season. Generally plays full back but on occasions has played further upfield.

**Denis Ruddy**—Started his football with Lourdes Secondary School and won two school medals before joining Glasgow United. The Steedmans signed him for Clydebank and he was four seasons at Kilbowie Park before joining Dumbarton.

**John Cushley**—Is no stranger to Celtic Park having been on the staff from 1960-67. John, who arrived at Boghead via West Ham and Dunfermline also teaches at St. Patrick's High in Coatbridge.

**Johnny Graham**—Skillful mid-field player who has been five years with Dumbarton having joined them from minor grade football. His full time job is on stock control with the Grant's Whisky Company.

**Willie Wallace**—Another man who needs no introduction to the Celtic fans as 'Wispy' was five years at Parkhead and one of the 'Lisbon Lions'. Willie joined Dumbarton (his fifth Scottish club) after a season in England with Crystal Palace.

**John Bourke**—Is in his second year with Dumbarton, having stepped up Senior from local secondary juvenile team Dumbarton United. Only recently back in action following a cartilage operation he is another Physical Education student at Jordanhill.

**Tom McAdam**—A former school-boy internationalist who joined the Sons on an 'S' form before being called up in 1971. His flair for goal-scoring attracted a £40,000 offer from Dundee last season but he declined the move. Still only 19 years old.

**Peter Coleman**—Joined Dumbarton in 1970 from Albion Rovers following the footsteps of ex-manager Jackie Stewart (now St. Johnstone). Has been regular performer with the Sons since then.

**Brian Heron**—Won a junior cap with Baillieston Juniors before being called up by Rangers. After two years with Rangers he joined Motherwell and moved from Fir Park to Boghead just over a year ago. Fast and dangerous left winger with lethal left foot.

# ONE OF THE OLDEST SCOTTISH CLUBS

To-day's visitors, Dumbarton, were founded in 1872 and together with Celtic were one of the founder member clubs of the Scottish League.

In their early days Dumbarton won the Scottish Cup and the League Championship and were a formidable force in the Scottish football set-up.

Following their relegation to the Second Division in 1910-11 season, however, they remained in the lower league until they won promotion in 1971-72.

Last year the Boghead side struggled hard and successfully to avoid a quick return to Second Division football and this season they look as if they could finish the season in an improved position.

The most memorable meeting of the two clubs in recent years was the League Cup semi-final clash at Hampden in October 1970, which Celtic eventually won after four hours of football.

In the first game on Wednesday, October 7th team line-ups were as follows:—

**Celtic**—Williams; Craig and McGrain; Murdoch, McNeill and Hay; Johnstone and Connelly, Hood, Macari and Lennox.

Twelfth man—Wallace.

**Dumbarton**—Williams; Jenkins and Muir; Ferguson, Bolton and Graham; Coleman and C. Gallagher, McCormick, Wilson and B. Gallagher.

Twelfth man—Donnelly.

This game, including a period of extra time, failed to produce a goal and the teams played again on the following Monday night. Dumbarton's team was unchanged for the replay, but Celtic had Quinn at right back and a forward line of Johnstone and Connelly, Wallace, Lennox and Wilson.

Celtic eventually won the tie by 4-3 but it took yet another period of extra time to do it.

The goalscorers in the match were Lennox 2, Wallace and Macari for Celtic and Wilson, Graham and Charlie Gallagher for Dumbarton.
