MAKE no mistake about it — Celtic will pay proper respect to East Stirling this afternoon. For the Scottish Cup being what it is does present the smaller clubs with the opportunity to bring off a surprise.

And in our current position we don't want to be involved in any shock results . . . not even a replay!

Of course East Stirling will be geared to their highest pitch when they take the field. The glamour of the Cup will have their adrenalin going and they'll be seeking further glory in this one-off assignment.

We can be sure that they'll give 100 per cent for manager Billy Lamont. Our respect for the 'Shire was built before the game. We've had them checked in recent games and we will seek to make use of the information that was brought back to Parkhead.

East Stirling have reached this quarter-final stage on merit and while we are taking due precautions I am happy with the current form of the Celtic squad.

We've been turning on highly satisfying performances and I look for a repeat of the flowing football that disposed of Rangers and Morton.

That, I feel, would take us through to the semi-final stage of the Cup against opponents who have worked hard to reach the present stage in the tournament and also maintain a place in the First Division after an absence of about 20 years.

Our standard of football at the moment is such that it should allow us to meet any side and have a winning chance.

The trick now is to stay in the driving seat. Certainly the players are a most determined company. Their attitude and application is first rate and they play at pace with a lot of skill as well.

Certainly Celtic fans have been given a lot to cheer about with victories all the way since 1981 began. It has been a deserved reward for supporters who have shown their care and concern for the club through the entire season and one hopes that it will all be mirrored in exciting European competition for them next season.

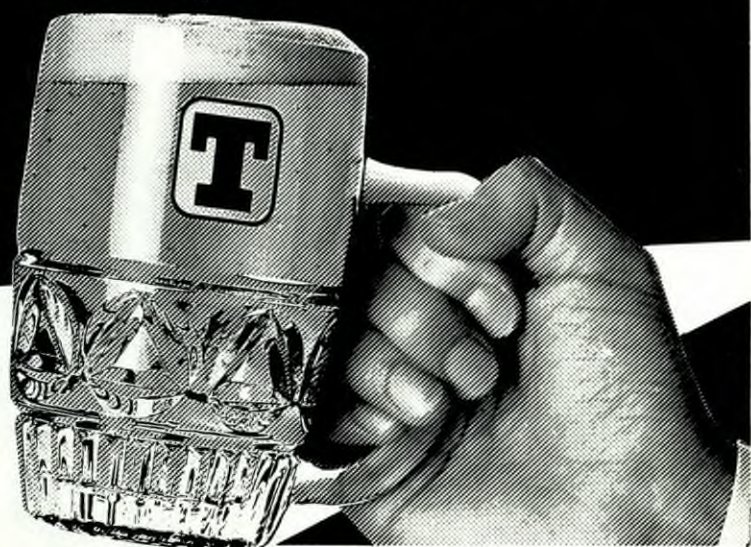
