JOCK STEIN says...

Celtic played very well at Motherwell last Saturday, and I hope that our supporters—and indeed the general public who attend our game today—will be as well entertained. I would say that our lads have not played better all season. The victory by five goals did not exaggerate our superiority.

The display at Fir Park was particularly satisfying, coming as it did so soon after the European Cup defeat in Budapest. I am sure that it is always a sign of a good side when they come back from defeat and disappointment so convincingly. Enough has been said about Budapest: all I shall repeat now is to say that Ujpest Dozsa were on the night the clearly superior team.

On the same evening as we lost the European Cup tie our opponents of this afternoon, Hearts, were being defeated in a Texaco Cup tie at Motherwell, though they were two goals up at half-time. No doubt having a player ordered off was an important factor. But Hearts in



their next game against Ayr United gained, like we did, a convincing victory.

Hearts have very often been doughty opposition; immediately we recall their league win over us at the end of last season and the Scottish Cup tie of last season.

Our visitors are only four points behind us in the league table and they are in fourth place. Hearts are in a challenging position and the fact that they are close behind their Edinburgh rivals, Hibernian, as well as Celtic is a good thing for the Capital. I feel sure that they will contribute much to a fine game this afternoon.

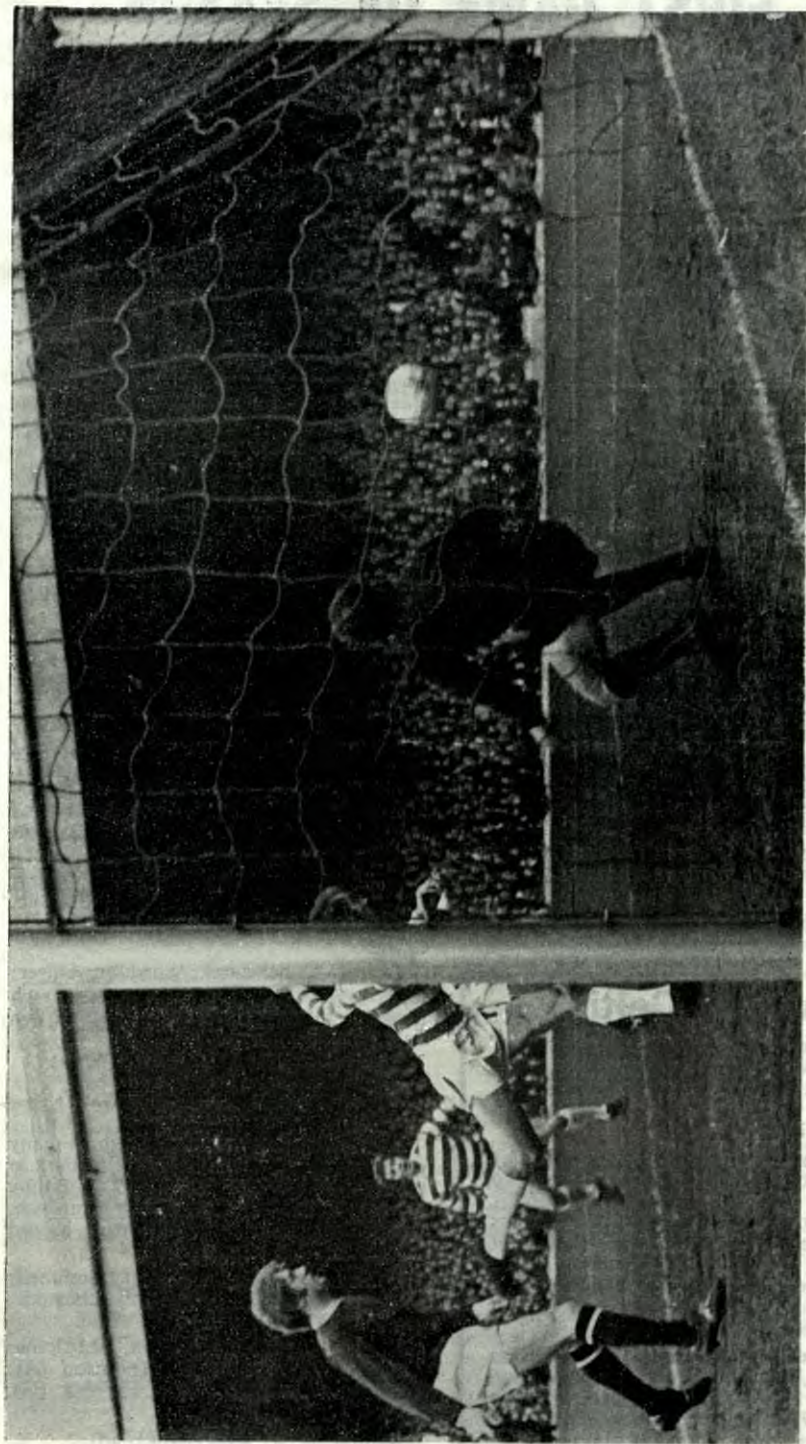

FIRST GAME OF SEASON AGAINST GLASGOW CLUB

Hearts have played 21 matches in competition since the season started (11 in the league, 6 in the League Cup, and 4 in the Texaco Cup) but not one of them has been in Glasgow.

They may consider it a good omen for their league game this afternoon at Celtic Park that their last league win against a Glasgow club was at Tynecastle on the final day of last season when they won 4-1.

There have been 26 Celtic-Hearts Scottish League fixtures since the competition restarted after the war. Celtic have won 12 and Hearts 7; seven have been drawn. In the same period Hearts have had splendid results in league games at Tynecastle. Of the 26 matches there, Hearts have won 16 and Celtic 5; there have been five draws.

Three Years Ago

The last Hearts win in the league at Parkhead was just over three years ago—on November 8, 1969. Roald Jensen and Donald Ford scored the goals in the 2-0 victory. Jensen was part of a Scandinavian right wing for Hearts that day, for his little Norwegian's partner was a Dane, Rene Moller. The teams were:—

Hearts to Celtic

Willie Wallace, who was transferred to Crystal Palace last season, was one of Jock Stein's greatest transfer investments when he joined Celtic from Hearts in 1966.

Many younger Celtic supporters may not know that over 70 years ago two former Hearts men played for Celtic in a Scottish Cup final in which Hearts beat Celtic 4-3. That was the final of 1900-01 and the two ex-Hearts in the Celtic team were Barney Battles, whose son was to follow him at Tynecastle, and Davie Russell.

Battles and two other former Hearts players, Harry Marshall, and Alec King, formed the Celtic half-back line in 1898-99 when Celtic beat Rangers in a Scottish Cup final for the first time.

Hearts' previous league success at Celtic Park was in January, 1965, in a season in which they had a league double over Celtic, having won the Tynecastle match 4-2. Of the 22 men who played in the Parkhead game that Hearts won 2-1, the majority have either retired or are now with other clubs. The teams were:—

Johnny Hamilton scored the two Hearts goals; Tommy Gemmell scored from a Celtic penalty kick.

Last season's match at Parkhead on Christmas Day was a great credit to both clubs. In "The Celtic View" published four days after the game, Jock Stein said:—"This was exciting football played skilfully and at great pace. Hearts must take credit for not folding up when we took a 3-1 lead." Harry Hood (in less than a minute), Jimmy Johnstone, and "Dixie" Deans scored for Celtic. Hearts' scorers were Derek Renton and Jim Brown. The teams were:—

Heaviest Defeat

Hearts' heaviest defeat by Celtic in many years was their 5-0 beating at Celtic Park in the league in February 1969. Bobby Lennox, Willie Wallace, Bobby Murdoch, Jimmy Johnstone and Jim Brogan scored the goals. The teams were:—

HEARTS IN THE LEAGUE

Hearts come to Celtic Park in fourth position in the league table and only four points behind the leaders Celtic. It is far from impossible that they reach their highest place in the table at the end of the season since they last won the championship 13 seasons ago.

Their final position in the last 12 seasons have been :-

They were runners-up to Kilmarnock in 1965 after losing to them in the final match of the season at Tynecastle. Only Killie could have prevented them winning the title, for Hearts started the match two points ahead of Killie and with slightly better goal average. But the Ayrshire club, whose manager was then Willie Waddell, now of Rangers, won 2-0 and took the championship with goal average of 1.87 to 1.83.

Consistency

From 1949-50 to 1960-61 Hearts were magnificently consistent. In those 11 seasons they brought the total of their league

championships to four by winning the title twice, and they were runners-up three times. Their placings in those 11 seasons were :-

In 1959 they won the championship by 13 points (from Rangers) and that margin remains a record for the 18-club league. Their aggregate of points, 62, was a record until Celtic broke it in 1968 with 63.

First Competition

Hearts are one of the founder members of the Scottish League. Of the 11 clubs who began the first competition in season 1890-91 only Celtic, Dumbarton, Hearts, Rangers and St. Mirren are still members of the Scottish League. Renton, one of the original 11, played only five games before they were suspended by the Scottish Football Association. Renton along with Abercorn, Cambuslang, Cowairs, Third Lanark and Vale of Leven no longer exist. Hearts, formed in 1873—15 years before Celtic—finished sixth in the first Scottish League competition, the joint winners of which were Dumbarton and Rangers. Celtic, from whom four points had been deducted for fielding ineligible players, were third with 21 points to the joint winners' 29.
