# Our new Dumbarton signing can go to the top



**MURDO MacLEOD, the 20-year-old from Dumbarton who makes his debut for Celtic this afternoon, is a midfield player I'm convinced is going to reach the top and have a long future with the club.**

**He has already played for Scotland at Youth and Under-21 level and his transfer from Boghead this week follows scrutiny by myself and my colleagues.**

Following the disappointing results we had in October — particularly the one against Hearts at Tynecastle last Saturday — it is important for us to have a restoration of confidence plus a return to form the squad showed earlier in the season.

That is something that we shouldn't forget. The players did turn it on then and showed they can play a bit.

What is required now is a consistency of that form.

Today is our fourth meeting with Motherwell this season. In League Cup (2) and Premier fixtures we have done well against them and a repeat of the play pattern we showed against them in two matches at Fir Park would be just the tonic that is required to lift the club and the fans.

They deserved better from us at Tynecastle and the players are well aware of that.

The fans have been wonderfully loyal so far. We've got to keep them. And the only way this can be done is show it on the field with entertaining, and satisfying performances.

I have said before that the standard I expect from a Celtic side might take time. But rest assured all my energies will be bent towards producing the best for the club.

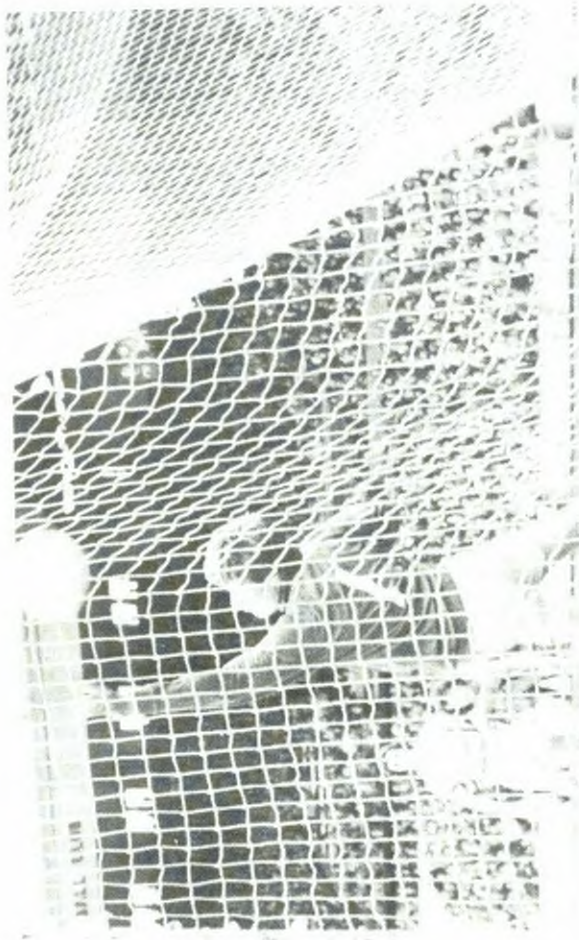

# Motherwell men meet challenge

**MOTHERWELL come to Celtic Park this afternoon, if not exactly in buoyant mood, prepared to give 100 per cent concentration and effort following the resignation in midweek of manager Roger Hynd after a ten month reign at Fir Park.**

Coach John Hagart who has assumed temporary command of the team commented:

"The players have buckled down well to their preparation for today's task considering the situation."

Hagart, himself highly experienced in the pressure pot of the Premier League, has within the club ranks a number of senior professionals who can be relied upon to meet the current challenge to the 'Well.

### FORMIDABLE

It is a formidable one. They are at the foot of the table and six points adrift of second bottom Hearts and Morton.

Yet the overall record with Celtic in the Premier League works out at 50 — 50 up until today's meeting. And this season they have reserved some of their best — and most successful — matches for away fixtures in the League and League Cup.

It is at Fir Park that they've not

hit a winning pattern. The pressure has mounted in recent weeks and Manager Hynd tendered his resignation.

It was a difficult decision but the parting was achieved without animosity. It was an honourable resignation by a man of integrity totally committed to football.

### REVOLUTIONISE

His diligence and industry on behalf of Motherwell was considerable and while results have been less than satisfactory manager Hynd retains complete faith in his football message and methods.

He wanted to "revolutionise" and candidly admitted that "in revolutions there's a casualty. This time it happens to be me."

He felt another year was necessary "to get the full results of our efforts". But courageously he took his resignation decision this week because he believed "it was in the best interests of the club.

Now the club looks around for a new manager. But the game goes on and the weight of the situation falls on the Motherwell players at Celtic Park this afternoon.

"I'm certain they will tackle the task with great spirit", says John Hagart.

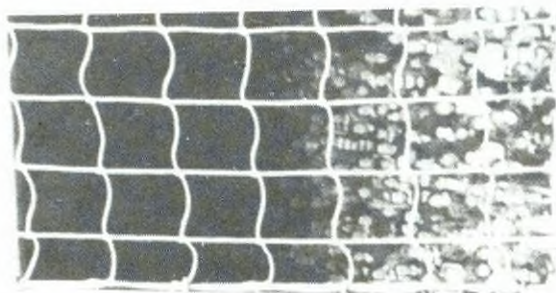
