THE large crowd at the Celtic v Burnley Anglo-Scottish Cup-tie were shocked as Celtic lost for the second time to the Lancashire team. Trailing by one goal from the first match at Turf Moor, Celtic started the game in brisk fashion and they looked quite good in the early stages.

Then in a sudden breakaway the English side caught Celtic's defence too square and Paul Fitcher had a clear run on goal Roy Aitken, unable to get a tackle in, pulled the player down outside the box. From the resultant free-kick Brennan gave Burnley the lead. Five minutes later Burnley broke away once again and scored a second goal to hoist their aggregate lead to 3-0.

Andy Lynch scored from the penalty spot in the 68th minute but despite terrific encouragement from the crowd the Celtic team couldn't produce the sparkle or the pace to give themselves a real chance of a comeback.

There will be a penalty kick competition at half-time involving three Lisbon Lions, Tommy Gemmell, Jimmy Johnstone and Bobby Lennox.

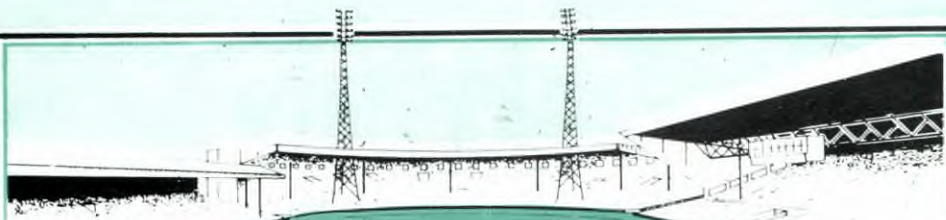
Jim Fallon is known to be a great Celtic supporter and he is looking forward to this game very much. Tickets costing £1.00 are available from Kilbowie Park now.

CELTIC defeated **St Mirren** in the Premier League on Saturday, September 30, 1978.

Ten minutes from half-time Davie Provan ran across the park with the ball and from the left wing position released a brilliant pass into the path of Tommy Burns. Copland upended Burns in the box and from the resultant penalty Andy Lynch gave Celtic the lead. In the 75th minute Alfie Conn rounded the 'keeper to make it 2-0.

St Mirren grabbed a consolation eight minutes from time with a header from Derek Hyslop.
