JOCK STEIN says...

The league competition is in as interesting a state as it has been for many a day, and we are delighted about that. This afternoon we welcome to Celtic Park one of the clubs who are helping to increase the interest. Dundee are probably playing better than they have done since the days in which under the managership of Bob Shankly they won the championship and went on to reach the semi-final of the European Cup.

Dundee have a reputation for playing entertaining football and they are always popular visitors. They have been making impressive progress, and last week's 4-0 win over Falkirk gives us all the warning we need.

We did not play so well as we can at Easter Road last Saturday, but at the end of the week we could consider the events and be satisfied. After all we had reached the final of the League Cup for the eighth time in succession and we had gained two important points against Hibs in the league. Some people didn't think much of our performance in the League Cup semi-final; indeed there was a concentration in some quarters on alleged lack of luck of our opponents. We must remember that semi-finals of cup competitions rarely provide top-class football; both teams are not surprisingly anxious to make the final and inclined to alter their style.

Hibs under Eddie Turnbull will, I am sure, be more than a little concerned with the leading places in the league, and his successor at Pittodrie, Jimmy Bonthrone, is doing a great job for Aberdeen, who are our next league visitors.

John Prentice is entitled to think that his team will be challenging for honours, and altogether the league position is very healthy.



The game is better too for the success in midweek of Scotland and ex-Celt Tommy Docherty. We at Celtic Park welcome all the signs of improvement in competition and the brighter International scene. We shall, of course, be making our own contribution—principally for our supporters.

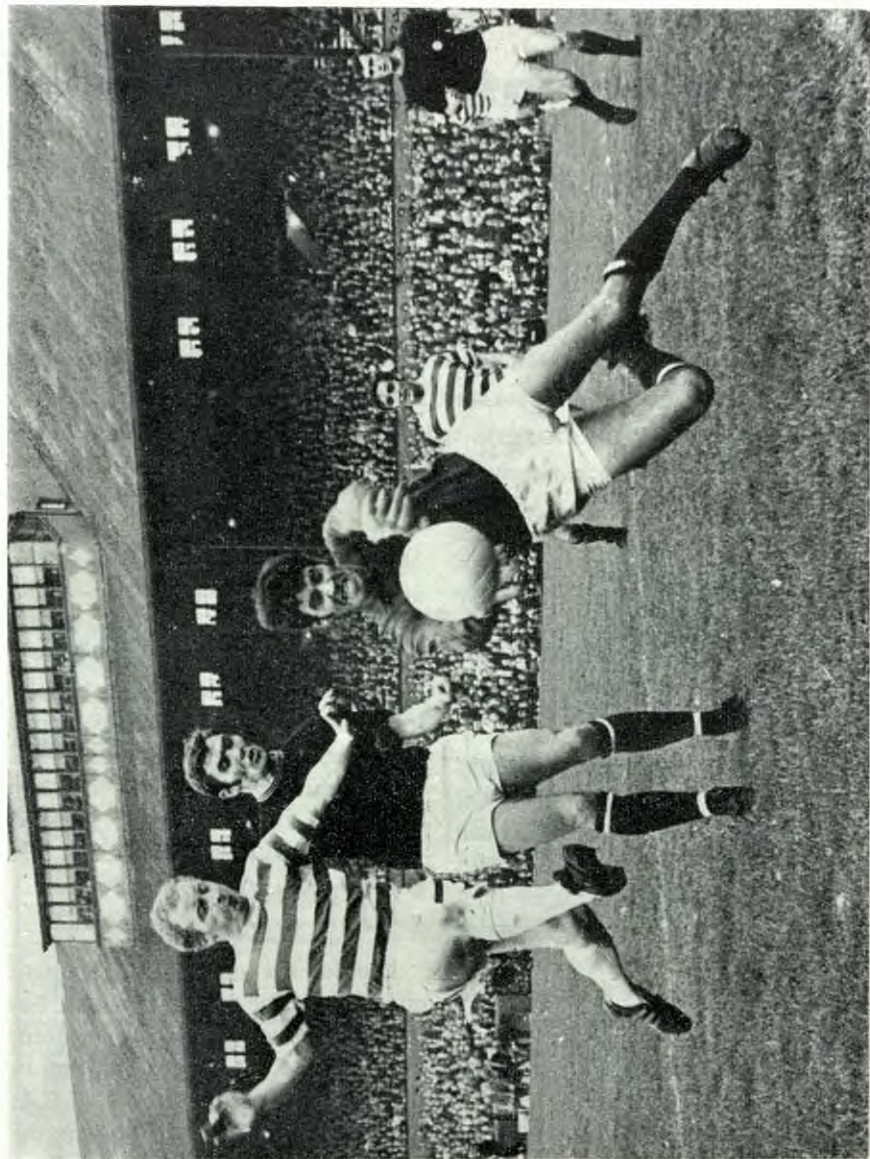

Dundee at Celtic Park in the League

Dundee come to Celtic Park today in fifth position in the league, which was their final placing in last season's competition. Finishing fifth in 1970-71 has been their best league performance since they won the championship in 1961-62, and Manager John Prentice has gathered such an assembly of fine young players at Dens Park that an improvement on last season seems reasonably certain.

Celtic Park has not, however, been one of Dundee's favourite grounds. Of the 24 league matches they have played there since the war, they have won only three. Six have been drawn and Celtic have won 15, including 10 of the last 11.

Dundee's last league win at Parkhead was seven seasons ago. On November 14, 1964, a day which will be remembered by the spectators more for the dreadful weather than for the quality of the play, Dundee won 2-0, the scorers being Andy Penman (now with Rangers) and Steve Murray (now with Aberdeen) one of the most skilful midfield players in the country. The teams were:—

Celtic—*Fallon; Young, Gemmell; Clark, Cushley, Kennedy; Johnstone, Murdoch, Chalmers, Maxwell, Hughes.*

Dundee—*Donaldson; Hamilton, Beattie; Cousin, Easton, Stuart; Murray, Penman; Harley; Gilzean, Robertson.*

Referee—*N. Watson (Glenrothes).*

Only Fallon, Gemmell, Johnstone, Murdoch, Hughes, and Donaldson are still players for the clubs.

That was Celtic's first home league defeat of the season. The game was also only the fourth since the war in which Celtic failed to score against Dundee in a league game at home.

The last six fixtures between the clubs at Celtic Park have resulted (from 1965-66 onward) 5-0, 5-1, 5-2, 3-1, 1-0, and 3-0.

U.E.F.A. Cup

Dundee are one of five Scottish clubs who have won first-round ties in European competitions. Aberdeen, Dundee, and St. Johnstone are in the second round of the U.E.F.A. (formerly Fairs) Cup, Rangers in the second round of the European Cup-winners Cup, and Celtic are in the second round of the European Champions' Cup.

Dundee have been drawn against Cologne, the German club whom they eliminated on their way to the semi-final of the European Champions' Cup in season 1962-63, and we wish them a successful run in Europe this season.

GEORGE CONNELLY

George Connelly is one of only two players who have not missed a first team match since the start of the season (the other is Tommy Callaghan). Now in his seventh year at Celtic Park, this tall, well-built young man who began his senior career as a boy on the ground staff at Parkhead, may now have settled into the position in the team in which his great ability can be of best service to the club.

He is what is known nowadays as a midfield player and at times a "sweeper" or second centre half, but he is more of a specialist in another respect.

What his manager looks for from him especially is the building of attacks from the rear. "When we are a bit bogged down in attack" says Jock Stein, "we look for George changing the pattern with long, accurate passing".

Connelly has played in 17 matches (nine in the League Cup, six in the league, and two in the European Cup) since the season began. Last season six of the Celtic players had more first-team appearances than he had—Evan Williams, Jim Brogan, Davie Hay, Billy McNeill, Jimmy Johnstone, and Harry Hood.

If he escapes injury George will not be far from the top of the first-team appearances list at the end of this season.

TAKE CARE!

Remarkable Figures

When Celtic lost their last home league game (against St. Johnstone) their chance of even approaching a club record in the post-war years vanished. Before the match of a fortnight ago Celtic had a 100 per cent performance in the league this season—four wins in four games. Only once before since the league competitions proper were resumed in 1946-47 have Celtic achieved that—in 1966-67 when they beat Clyde (away), Rangers (home), Dundee (away) and St. Johnstone (home) in their first four fixtures.

In that season Celtic went to December 31 and their seventeenth league game before they were beaten—2-3 by Dundee United at Tannadice. They had won their first eight matches.

Not even in the following season, in which they established a record points aggregate of 63 for the 18-club league, did they start as well as they did in 1966-67 or as they have done so this season.

Only six times in the 26 seasons since the war have Celtic avoided defeat in their first four league games, and over the period they have lost and drawn more games than they have won, as the following table shows:—
