JOCK STEIN says...

To-day's game with Hibernian in the league is a vital one for Celtic—but no more vital than any of the league championship matches on the long haul to a title win.

It doesn't matter whether you beat Hibs or a less glamorous side the reward is still the same—two valuable league points.

Since my last programme piece of a fortnight ago we have played three games, two in the league and one in the League Cup.

In the league game with Motherwell we won a very hard fought game in which Jimmy Johnstone showed a return to something like his very best form.

The second clash with Motherwell, which saw us start with a 2-1 lead from the first leg, was most disappointing from the point of view of missed chances. We lost the game by the only goal of the match and even a penalty kick award failed to produce the goal we always looked like scoring, but didn't.

Attractive

Whatever else can be said about our two League Cup clashes with Motherwell they have produced two highly entertaining games which will make the third game at Celtic Park a very attractive game for all football enthusiasts.

Last Saturday's return to league football took us to Angus for our match at Dens Park. In winning this game with an early Tommy Callaghan goal we won two points which we failed to get last season.



To-day's visitors are always doughy opponents as they showed earlier in the season when they beat us in the final of the Drybrough Cup at Hampden.

In the league table the Easter Road men are only one point behind us for the same number of games and they are certainly one of several teams who are making a spirited start to the 1973-74 league campaign.

As I have said before we at Celtic Park welcome the challenge which at the end of the day can only make for more exciting matches and in the process give the game a much needed shot in the arm.

HIGHLIGHTS OF PREVIOUS MATCHES WITH HIBS

The clash of the 'greens' at Celtic Park should attract a large attendance to-day because Celtic games with Hibs are generally matches to remember.

With the Hibernian Drybrough Cup final defeat still fresh in their minds Celtic will be particularly keen to record a win over their Edinburgh rivals.

The last meeting between the two clubs in a league game was at Easter Road at the end of last season where Celtic won in splendid style to clinch their eighth successive league championship title.

SPOTLIGHT

But it is to the corresponding home league match of last season we focus the spotlight. The match was played at Parkhead on December 23rd of last year and was being billed as a league decider despite the fact that the league was still short of the half-way mark.

The team line-ups were:—

Celtic—Williams, Hay and Brogan, McCluskey, McNeill and Connelly, Johnstone and Deans, Dalglish, Callaghan and Hood. 12th man Lennox.

Hibs—Herriot, Brownlie and Schaedler, Stanton, Black and Blackley, Edwards and O'Rourke, Gordon, Cropley and Duncan. 12th man Hamilton.

Referee was Mr. Gordon of Newport-on-Tay.

Hibs came to Glasgow highly boosted as the team most likely to end Celtic's League Championship monopoly. In the event the Easter Road men were a shade lucky to share the points and remain four points behind Celtic at the top of the

league table. The goal scorers were Alan Gordon for Hibs and Kenny Dalglish. Even after Jimmy Johnstone had to go off with a nasty leg cut Celtic still looked the likelier side and only dour and resolute defending by Hibs kept the Celtic forwards at bay.

UNEXPECTED

An earlier meeting of the two clubs, played on the 14th March 1964, produced a very comfortable 5-0 win for Celtic even if the margin was somewhat unexpected. Of the two sides that lined up on that occasion only the respective captains Billy McNeill and Pat Stanton, will be wearing their club's colours in to-day's game.

The teams in 1964 were:—

Celtic—Fallon, Young and Gemmell, MacKay, McNeill and Kennedy, Johnstone and Murdoch, Chalmers, Divers and Hughes.

Hibs—Simpson, Fraser and Baxter, Stanton, Grant and Preston, Hamilton and Quinn, Scott, Martin and Grant.

Although Jimmy Johnstone is still in the Parkhead scheme of things his recent suspension keeps him out of to-day's action.

Although Hibs haven't won a league game at Celtic Park since September, 1969, they have a better record than most against the Celts in recent years.

Of the last 27 meetings of the two clubs in league matches at Parkhead, Celtic have won 14 and Hibs have recorded eight victories.

The five other games, including that of last season, have ended in draws.

SOME FACTS ABOUT HIBS

Hibernian Football Club was formed in 1875 although it became defunct for about three years before being re-established again in the 'nineties. Apart from starting league football in the second division they have only been out of the first division once since, when they were relegated in 1930-31. Two seasons later they won promotion and have remained in the top league ever since.

The Easter Road ground has a capacity of 60,000 of which about 3,000 are seated. Record attendance for the ground is 65,840 in a game against Hearts in 1950, but crowd restriction wouldn't permit such a high attendance again.

Record transfer fees paid paid to

the club—£100,000 from Rangers for Colin Stein in 1968 and £100,000 from Arsenal for Peter Marinello in 1970.

Record fee paid by Hibs—£35,000 to Partick Thistle for Arthur Duncan in 1970.

Hibs have won the Scottish League Championship four times, including two successive seasons at the start of the 'fifties. They have won the Scottish Cup twice and last season won the League Cup for the first time in their history.

Greatest number of league goals for the club in one season (42) scored by Joe Baker in 1959-60.

Most capped player in history of the club Lawrie Reilly with 39 Scottish caps.

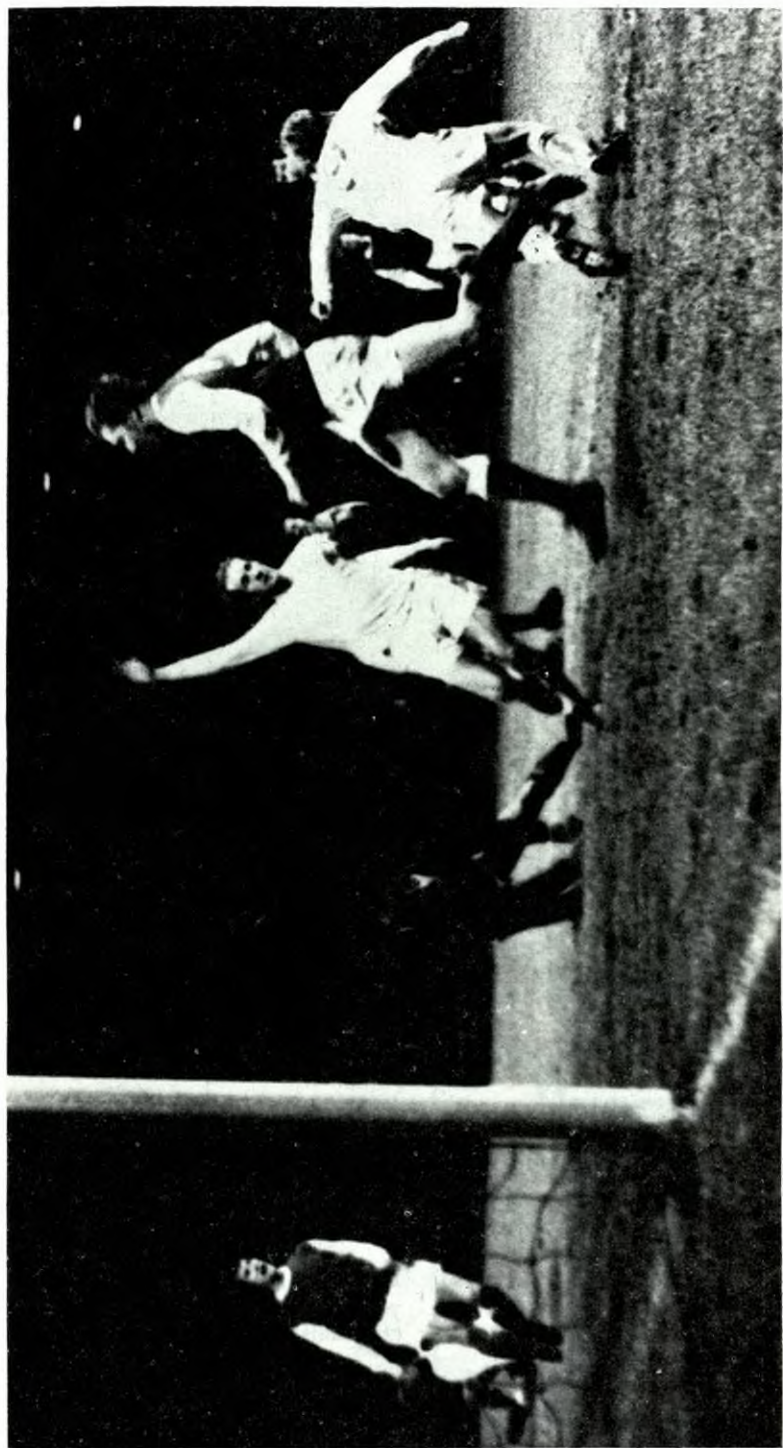
