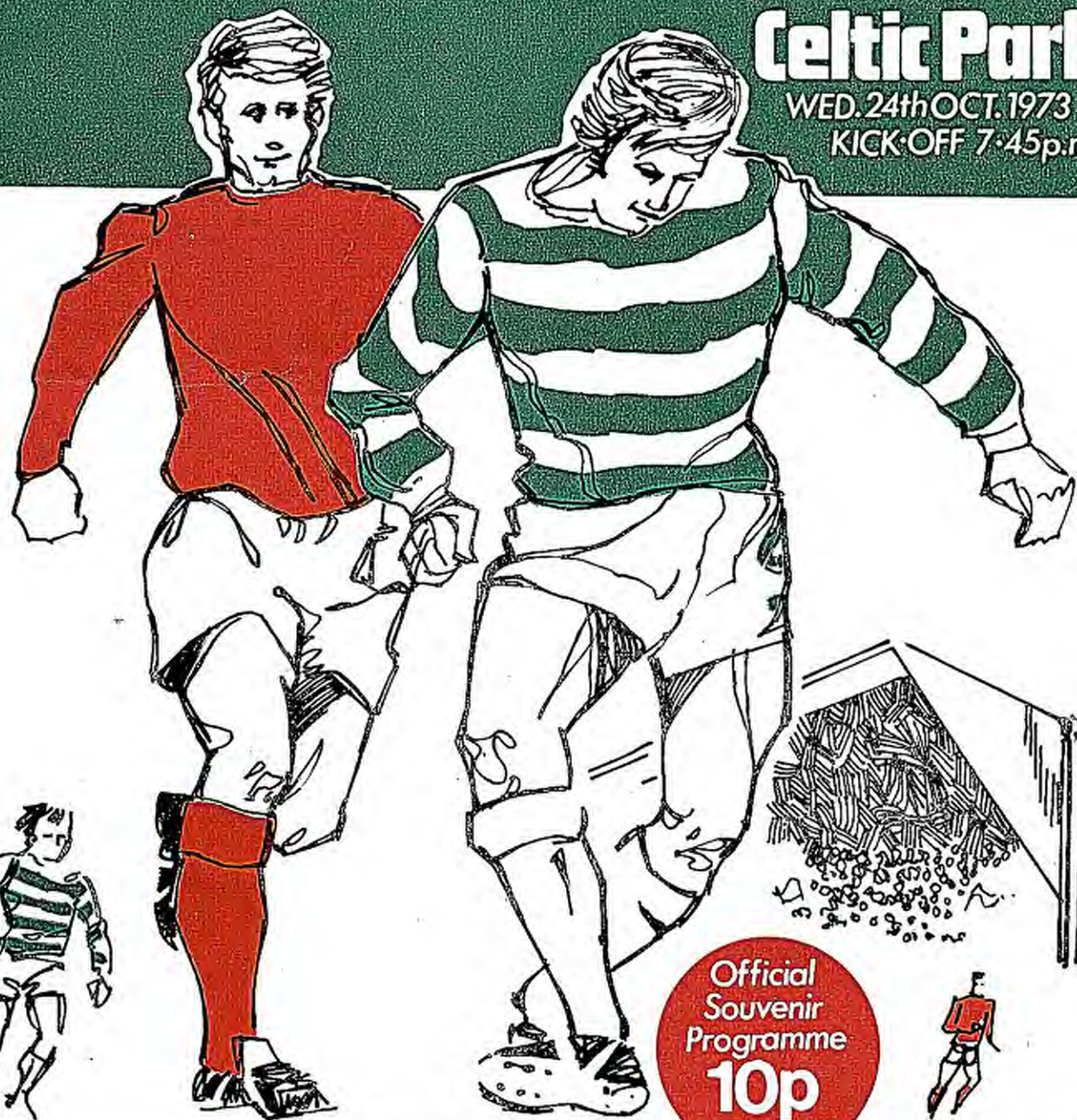

# Some Facts About Vejle Boldklub

If the Vejle Sports Club had continued with the sport for which it was originally founded, a visit to Glasgow by the club would have been for a match at Hamilton Crescent or Shawholm.

Yes, it's perfectly true, the Vejle club was first started as a Cricket Club in the year 1891; within a few years, however, the club changed to football and it has remained thus ever since.

Tonight's visitors first attained top league status in 1956 and since then have won the Danish League Championship three times, 1958, '71 and '72, and a hat-trick of National Cup successes in 1958, '59 and '72.

Eighteen players have been capped for Denmark in the history of the club including three of the present playing staff.

The Vejle Stadium has a capacity of 20,000 and the club officials are confident that the ground will be packed for Celtic's visit if tonight's game is a reasonably close contest.

Rangers played in Vejle in a tour match in 1959 just after the locals had won the League and Cup double for the first time and the game finished in a 2-2 draw.

A more recent game involving a Scottish club was when Partick Thistle visited the Jutland town in a pre-season friendly this summer and lost the match by three goals to two. The winning goal in this game was a controversial one scored with the last kick of the ball. Vejle were awarded a free kick on the edge of the penalty box. The player taking the kick placed his fist under the ball and lifted it off the ground for a team-mate to shoot home.

The Partick Thistle players all claimed for an infringement but the referee blew his whistle for the end of the game and the goal stood.

Manager David McParland described the Vejle Stadium as a very neat and compact ground and the playing surface as first class.

"Vejle were a good side against us," Mr. McParland said, "well drilled and good on the break. I think they will give a good account of themselves although Celtic will be too strong for them."

## Where Our Visitors Come From

Vejle is an ancient town that received its charter in 1372. The name comes from the word "wæthæl" which means a crossing place in water—a fjord. Clearly the town grew up around a fjord across the river called Vejle A or the river called Sonderaen. The scenery that surrounds the town, the steep, wide-stretching hills along the lovely fjord often causes people to call it "The town in the mountains" and, indeed, it looks like that although Denmark has no mountains.

The Vejle of today is, therefore, very much a tourist centre and the starting point for excellent tours to some of Denmark's greatest tourist attractions, like the old military road, the valley called Grejsdal, the burial mounds and the runic stones at Jelling, the safari park called Loveparken, Legoland and Randbol Heath.

With 50,000 inhabitants, Vejle is also a modern commercial and industrial town. European Highway 3, the railway, shipping and an airport are in or near the town, and behind it a production area of 100,000 people exporting bacon, nuts and bolts, chewing gum, textiles and various other things to all parts of the world. This gives the town the liveliness and the modern facilities that go with a brisk economic life. From ancient times Vejle has been South-east Jutland's trading centre, and it is alive with flourishing business today.

Vejle is Denmark's cheapest town to do business in, and it offers entertainment, and amusements in plenty. The town has many good restaurants with entertainment, comfort and excellent food provided.

Apart from Celtic's European Cup match with BK 1903 of Copenhagen in 1971 the club's only other game against Danish opposition was in 1965 in the Cup Winners' Cup.

Their opponents on that occasion were Aarhus—a town situated just 40 miles or so from Vejle on the coast of Jutland.

Celtic qualified for the next round on a 3-0 aggregate but only managed a 1-0 win in the first leg in Denmark.

The Celtic line-up on that occasion, November 3rd, 1965, was:—Simpson, Young and Gemmell, Murdoch, McNeill and Clark, Johnstone and Gallagher, McBride, Lennox and Hughes.

Joe McBride scored the only goal of the game.

Vejle Boldklub are solely a soccer club and have no part in the organisation of other sports. The club has a membership of 800 all of whom are involved in the playing, training, coaching or administrative side of the club.

### JOCK STEIN SAYS . . .

Tonight we face Vejle Boldklub, the champions of Denmark, in the first leg of the European Cup second round and the Danish side will be treated with the respect they deserve.

Compared with some of the more illustrious names left in the Champions Cup Competition, Vejle may not be considered to be the strongest opposition, but that opinion is not shared by me or by the Celtic players.

In last season's Danish league our opponents emerged as champions, for the second year in succession, by a margin of six points and scored an average of three goals per game.

Against Nantes in the first round of the competition they drew 2-2 at home and then won 1-0 in France. In my opinion these performances couldn't have been achieved by a bad side.

Our aim tonight is to get a result which takes the strain out of the trip to Denmark in two weeks' time. Goals will be our objective tonight and the fans can help by getting right behind the team from the start of the game.

The directors and management of Celtic Football Club appeal to all spectators to do everything in their power to try to avoid trouble or accidents in the ground. They appeal to spectators to refrain from hurrying, particularly when they are ascending or descending sloping areas. Please be especially careful when leaving at the end of the match. Younger spectators are asked to help the elderly and handicapped. Please also pay attention to the advice and instructions of stewards and police.

# PEN PICTURES OF SOME OF OUR VISITORS

**NIELS WODSKOU (Goalkeeper).** Very competent goalkeeper who has made 215 first team appearances for the Vejle club. Niels is a teacher by profession.

**JENS JORN JENSEN (Full back).** At 25 he is the club's regular right back now and has chalked up 115 first team games. Was an outstanding defender in the game in Nantes when the French side attacked non-stop in an unsuccessful bid for an equaliser. Away from football he works as a fitter.

**FINN HANSEN (Full back).** Joined Vejle last year from the second division and has made the left back position his own. He has played 53 games for the first team and is 25 years old. Everyday occupation—a clerk.

**FINN JOHANSEN (Right half).** Has been plagued by injuries this year, but is reckoned to be back to fitness again. The 27-year-old shopkeeper is a most experienced player in the mid-field.

**FLEMMING SERRITSLEV.** The captain of the side and also a very versatile player who can play either in defence or in mid-field. Another school teacher, he has played 117 times for the Danish club and is aged 26.

**NEILS CUR HUTTEL.** The 28-year-old left half who spent from 1967-1972 playing professional football with the Washington Whips in America and with Karlskoga in Sweden. Before going to America he played ten matches for the Danish under-23's. Away from football he works as a clerk.

**TOMMY HANSEN (Forward).** Only 23 years old but one of the best deep-lying forwards in the Danish game. Has played in ten under-23 teams and last month won his first full cap for Denmark. Another clerk in his everyday job.

**JORGEN MARKUSSEN (Forward).** The 25-year-old school teacher is the most capped player in the team. He has played 185 games for Vejle and has won ten under-23 honours as well as 11 full caps. Plays centre forward and he is tremendously fast and direct.

**OLE FRITSEN (Forward).** At 32 is now in the veteran class, but is still a very good footballer. Between 1966-72 he played professionally in Holland with Gvan Groningen. Has played six times for the Danish under-23 team and has won six full national caps. He is a school teacher by profession.

**KARSTEN LUND (Forward).** This outstanding outside left, reckoned to be the club's best player, will not play in either of the games against Celtic. A broken leg which he suffered in the game in Nantes is likely to keep him out of football for 4-6 months. Aged 29 he has played 310 first team games for Vejle and won ten under-23 honours and five caps for Denmark. Would have won many more caps but asked not to be selected again because of his heavy commitments on the Vejle committee. Yet another teacher by profession.

**PAULMAILAND (Goalkeeper).** The reserve goalkeeper has only played a handful of first team games. Aged 29 he works as a clerk from Monday to Friday.

## THREE FORMER PLAYERS

Three former Vejle players—Allan Simonsen, Ulrick Le Fevre and Johnny Hansen—are now playing professional football with European Clubs.

Twenty-year-old Simonsen recently signed for Borussia Munchengladbach and Le Fevre has joined Bruges from Borussia.

Bayern Munich's right back Johnny Hansen has become the German sides regular right back.
