Facts about Ujpest Dozsa

Our visitors tonight, Ujpest Dozsa from Hungary, are no strangers to Glasgow having played at Celtic Park just seven months ago and held Celtic to a 1-1 draw in the process.

The Ujpest club was formed as an athletics club in 1885 although it was some time later before football was introduced into their sporting activities.

Winning promotion in 1903 UTE, as Ujpest Dozsa were then known, have retained their first division status ever since, excepting for one brief season in the second division in 1911.

The sports section of the club has also gone from success to success with an average of over thirty athletes being selected for each of the last three Olympics in Tokyo, Mexico and Munich.

Ujpest Dozsa won the Hungarian League championship for the third successive time last season and for the twelfth time in the club's history. If three title wins in a row seems to pale into insignificance when compared with Celtic's seven on the trot, it's worth recording that Ujpest have also won their National Cup competition in the same three seasons.

The Ujpest Dozsa Sports Club is now the sporting organisation of the Ministry of Interior of the Hungarian People's Republic, which is the State police.

Although the sports complex covers just about everything from ice hockey to lawn tennis it's on the football field that Ujpest have made the greatest impact on the European sports scene.

A look through the following record of Ujpest Dozsa in European Cup competitions gives an indication of the experience they have built up in the last few years.

Hungarian Praise for Celtic

The morning after Celtic's victory over Ujpest Dozsa in Budapest last year the Hungarian press were unstinting in their praise of Celtic, a few examples of which read:—

"We haven't seen anything like them for a very, very long time."

That was how the Hungarian sports daily newspaper "Nepsport" summed up the feelings of the local fans after the first clash between Ujpest Dozsa and Celtic in Budapest on March 8, this year.

The daily "Magyar Memzet", another paper, added—"No football team anywhere in the world would be able to stand its ground against Glasgow Celtic in a match like last night's, when, playing with great gusto, they beat Ujpest Dozsa 2-1."

It went on—"Celtic are a tough, well disciplined and well balanced side with stamina and go. They will just not yield the initiative to the other side."

Another paper, "Nepszabadsac", praised Celtic, saying—"They had superior technique, teamwork, skills and speed . . . the works in fact. Every player was a defender or an attacker as the momentary situation required."

Imre Kovacs, Ujpest's coach, also praised the visitors. "So fast, so incisive," was his comment.

Well they might, for Celtic were terrific in the torrential rain that fell during the game on March 8 of this year.

Horvath, a great player for the home team, will remember this match for two entirely different reasons.

First, under pressure by Brogan, he scored a spectacular own goal to set Celtic up, then equalised with an equally spectacular effort.

Then came the winner from little Lou Macari who must have chased, harried, and run countless miles for the cause . . . with great success.

The teams in Budapest were: *Ujpest Dozsa*—Szenhahalyi; Nosko and Maurer; Juhasz, E. Dunai and Horvath; Fazekas and Zambo; Bene; A. Dunai and Toth. *Celtic*—Williams; McGrain and Brogan; Murdoch, McNeill and Connelly; Hood and Hay; Dalgligh; Macari and Lennox.

Move the calendar on two weeks—and Celtic got the fright of their European Cup lives, at Parkhead.

After only five minutes had gone striker Dunai scored and shocked the 75,000 fans roaring Celtic to go for the kill.

Still the crowd roared. But the biggest cheer of the night came in the 53rd minute when Jimmy Johnstone came on as substitute for the injured Jim Brogan.

Within 10 minutes equality was restored—and Celtic had their noses thrust in front again.

The man who took the goal was little Macari, again picking his spot with commendable coolness when all about him was hysterical.

Before that Celtic had not been impressive. After the goal they were tremendous.

Celtic's team was unchanged from the one that got the great victory in Budapest and Ujpest's only change was at full back where Kaposzta replaced Nosko.

The European Cup final this season will be played on Wednesday, 30th of May, 1973, in Belgrade. This will be the first occasion in which the European Cup Final has been played in an Eastern European country.

The Quarter Final European Cup ties will be played on March the 7th and 21st, 1973.

In the event of a draw after two games in the European Cup competitions extra time will be played after the second leg match. If the teams are still level after the period of extra time the tie will be settled by penalty kicks.

The return game with Ujpest Dozsa will be played in the Ujpest stadium in spite of the fact that the whole of the stand roof was destroyed in a recent gale. Any hope of obtaining the Nep stadium disappeared when Honved were drawn at home on the same night against Beroe Zagora in the UEFA Cup.

Celtic's two games against Ujpest Dozsa will bring their total number of games played in the European Cup to 44. As the table below shows Celtic will then be in joint third place with A.C. Milan in the table of appearances in Europe's top tournament.

Mr. STEIN'S MESSAGE

Celtic manager, Jock Stein, talking about tonight's game, said, "We'll start with care". That doesn't for one minute suggest that Celtic will be employing defensive tactics in the 1st leg of this Second Round European Cup tie.

The Celtic boss explained it thus:— "We're playing this game at Celtic Park tonight to get the advantage of our own ground and the atmosphere which a European match always generates at Parkhead. That doesn't mean, however, that we'll throw discretion to the wind from the first whistle. If we start looking for goals in an all out rush we can leave ourselves exposed in defence. Secondly, in the event of our offensive tactics failing to produce quick results some desperation could creep into our game and completely upset our rhythm.

"At the start of the game Ujpest Dozsa will be given the respect they deserve and we'll build our pace up gradually as the game progresses.

"Our supporters can help by keeping behind the team throughout the match with encouraging support even if things don't happen as quickly as they would like."

Congratulations to Scotland's team manager and his team for their fine win in Denmark last week.

With goals counting in the event of a tie, Scotland's 4-1 win could be invaluable in their bid to reach Munich in 1974.
