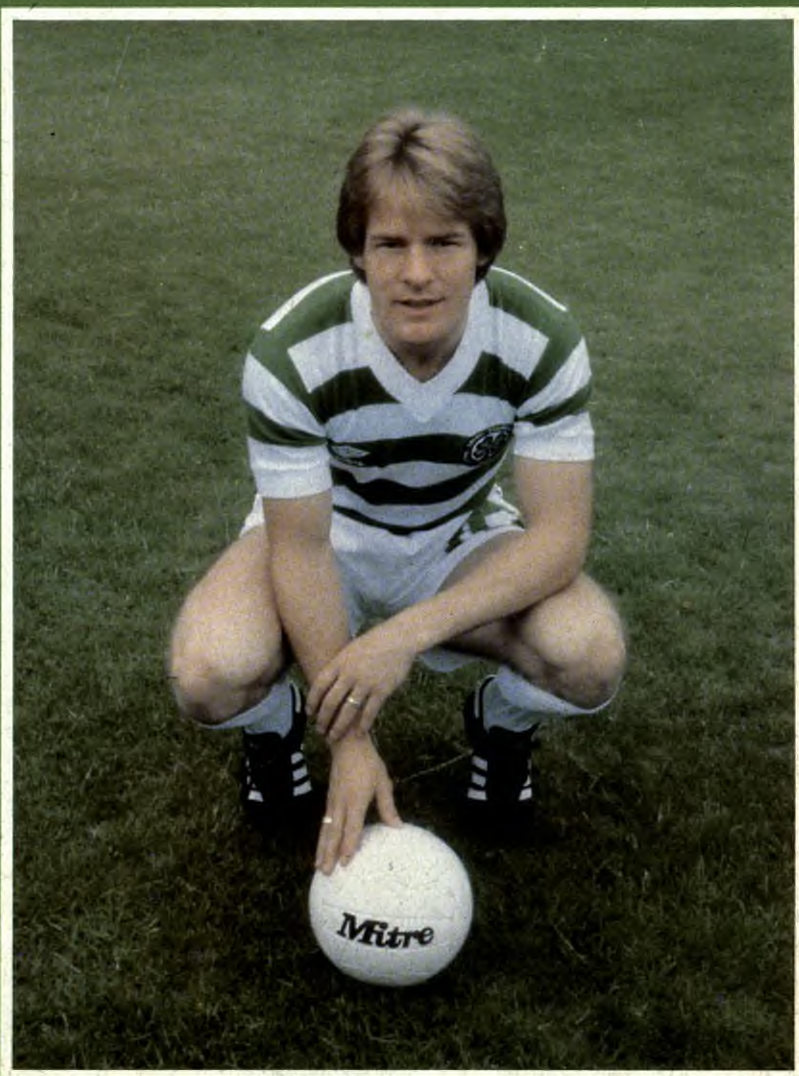

The tie had to go into 30 minutes of extra time before we got the result, but it was not an inspiring show by us. Bonner, Burns and an industrious display from Davie Provan was about all we could take from the game.

DESERVED MORE

Injury to Danny McGrain upset things a wee bit, but really the fans who turned out on an atrocious night of weather deserved much more.

They played their part by their attendance and their vocal efforts to inspire the squad.

Today we have Kilmarnock at Parkhead in a Premier League championship fixture. We had a good result against them at Rugby Park and we'll need to step up things to win against them again, despite their lowly league placing.

We've certainly got to make amends, so far as the fans are concerned, for the Monday display against Thistle.

Formation of the team for this afternoon's action was taken fairly late because of injuries to Danny McGrain and Murdo MacLeod. They had to undergo match day fitness tests.

I was in England this week along with assistant manager John Clark and chief scout John Kelman. It wasn't a signing mission. We took in a couple of games in which Anglo-Scots were involved and they were the players we wanted particularly to see. This check-up trip can have its usefulness in the future.

The scoring exploits of Charlie Nicholas in September brought him the Mackinlay's Personality of the Month award.

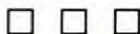
A couple of days ago Bobby Lennox handed over the rewards . . . £100 cheque, a Caithness glass decanter and an outsize bottle of the cratur.

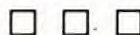


The season hasn't been as sparkling bright for the ever-green Bobby Lennox. He is only now nearing complete fitness following an injury at the start of the campaign. But he
