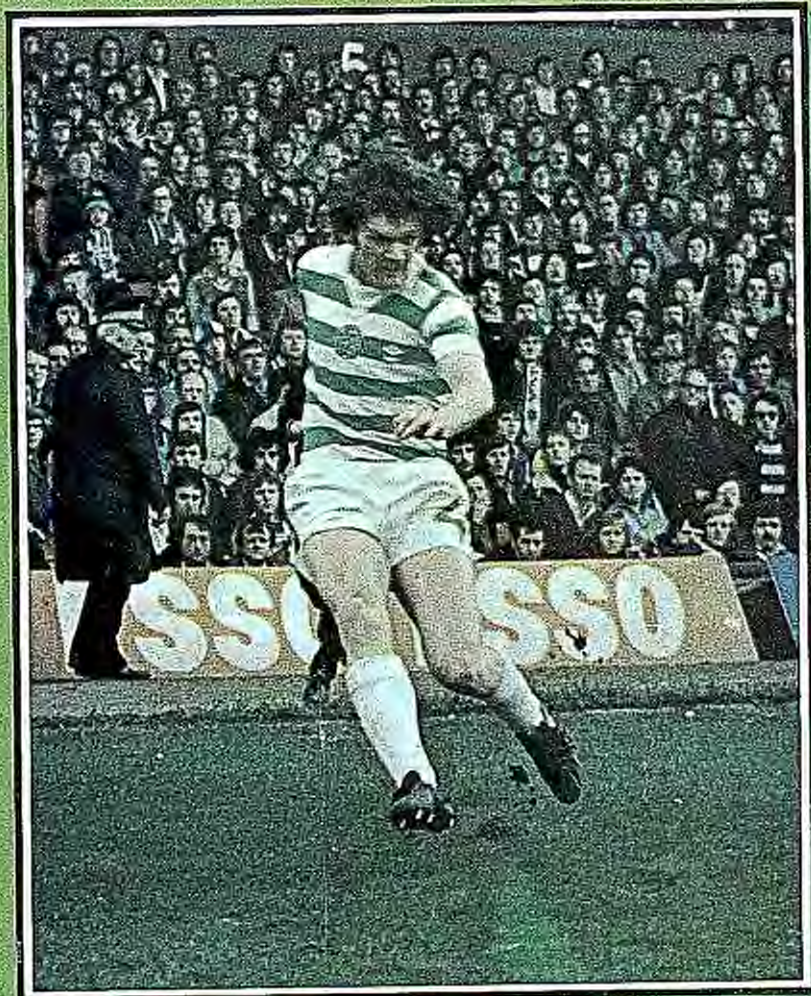

A continuation of the Pittodrie game will please everybody

TONIGHT'S League Cup tie with Aberdeen is one I've looked forward to ever since the final whistle blew on the "first half" at Pittodrie a fortnight ago.

That was a smashing game and if tonight's 90 minutes hits the same heights well, there shouldn't be a dissatisfied fan at the finish.

Mark you, we might have to continue the contest beyond the hour and a half. That's how close I feel it can be.

Celtic's task is clear. We've got to win by two goals to march into the semi-final. Recently, our support has been a trifle apprehensive about our performances.

The Dundalk affair in the European Cup was a bit of a stutter, but thankfully that's behind the players as the performance at Tannadice at the week-end showed.

I know the Premier League has taken a bit of "stick" from some quarters, but the standard of play that Dundee United and Celts served up must surely have pleased the fans.

The first leg tie between the Dons and ourselves at Pittodrie two weeks ago was another fine match and a lot of people have told me that they anticipate a continuation of this standard tonight.

Of course, I don't want the result to run on the same lines. The Celtic players know the situation. **THEY MUST PUT AWAY THE CHANCES THEY CREATE AND FINISH THE NIGHT TWO GOALS AHEAD OF ABERDEEN.**

Fulfilling that task will require our very best form and concentration through the entire match. Aberdeen lost to Morton at the week-end. Clearly they'll be smarting a bit from this and certainly eager to get on to the winning trail again.

Nevertheless, this Celtic squad seems to find a little extra when the task looks formidable. On the evidence of the first Aberdeen game and the Dundee United result this hard-working, enthusiastic and skilful Parkhead squad can make the semi-finals of the Cup.

Dons and Celts get cap call

A TOTAL of seven Celtic and Aberdeen players have been named in Scotland's full international and Under-21 squads to meet Belgium next week in the European championship matches.

Aberdeen defender Willie Miller is in the main squad and selected for the Under-21's are goalkeeper John Gardiner, defender Alex McLeish and Gordon Strachan, one of the over age men in the player pool.

Celtic's Under-21 squad members are George McCluskey, Murdo MacLeod and Roy Aitken who may well get a call to the main group if injury problems crop up for Scotland. Roy has had full international squad experience.

TONIGHT'S match will be played to a finish. If the sides are level after 90 minutes referee Brian McGinlay will set them off on 30 minutes extra time and if that doesn't bring a decision the teams will go into a nail-biting penalty kick procedure.

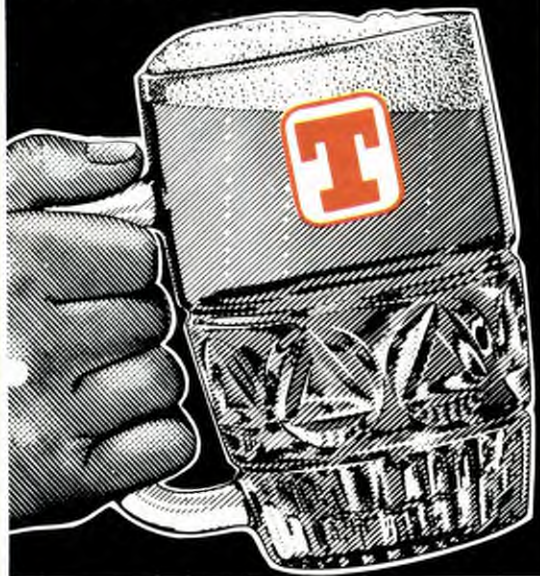
