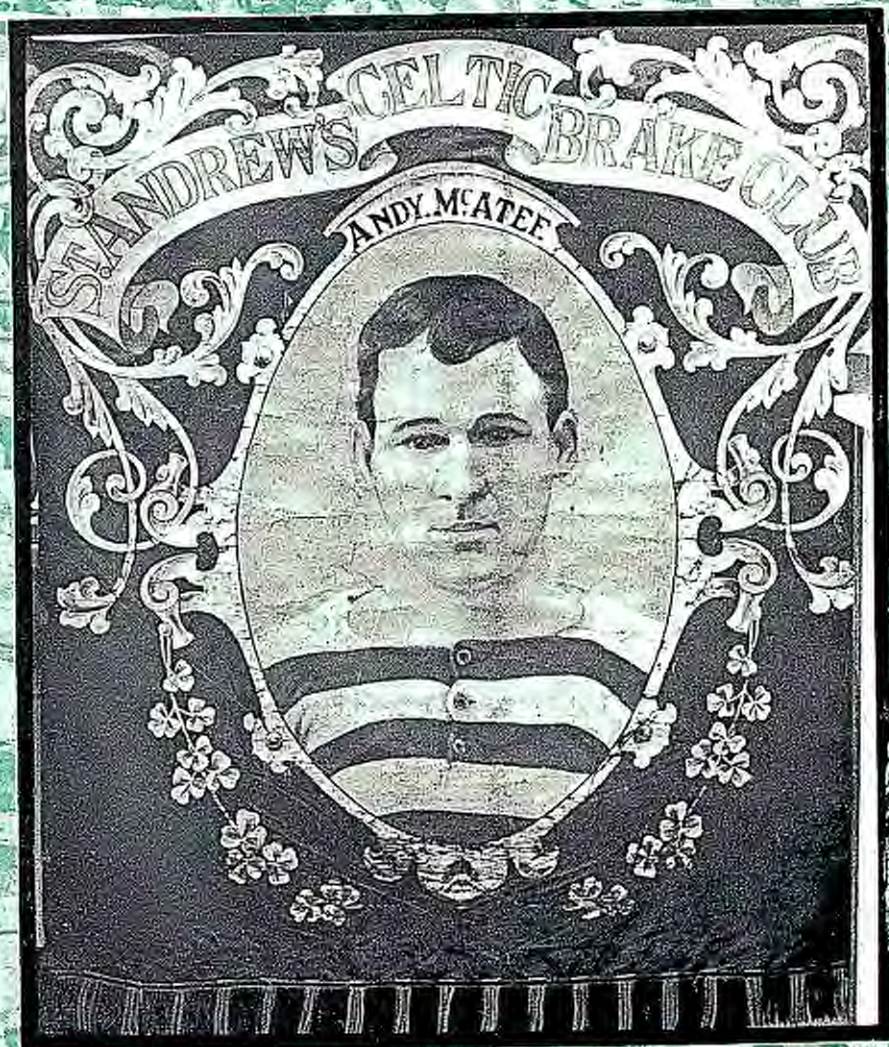

THE defeat at Tynecastle on Saturday October 28, 1978 completed an October of Woe for Celtic as far as the Premier League is concerned.

In the early stages of the game there was nothing to suggest that Celtic were going to surrender the points so meekly. Then just seven minutes after half time Drew Busby opened the scoring for Hearts with a great shot from about 25 yards.

With 25 minutes to go Hearts were reduced to ten men when Robertson was sent for an early bath by the referee. Three minutes after the ordering off incident Hearts scored a second goal and it was one that Peter Latchford will want to forget about as soon as possible.

Drew Busby fired in another shot from the same range but lacking in force and direction of the shot with which he opened the scoring. Peter Latchford dived to his left and appeared to smother the ball on the bounce but to the consternation of the Celtic team and supporters the ball slid under his body into the net.

CELTIC'S three goals against Hearts at Tynecastle on Saturday October 27, 1973 was the second time they had scored three times in a league match that season. The last treble was against Dunfermline in the opening league match of the season.

Top scoring game was against Clyde at the beginning of September when five goals were scored without reply. In the other five league games the team had scored two goals in one game (Motherwell) and single goals in the other four.

A surprising feature about the league goals in that no fewer than ten Celts shared the sixteen goals scored, excluding one own goal. The full list of league goals scorers was — Dalglish 3, Lennox 3, Deans 2, Wilson 2, Callaghan 1, Connelly 1, Hood 1, Johnstone 1, McCluskey 1, McGrain 1.

CELTIC continued their League programme with a visit to Cappielow to play Morton. The result and team was:- Morton 1 (Harper), Celtic 1 (McBride). Celtic: Simpson, Craig and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and McBride; Wallace. Lennox and Hughes. Twelfth man Chalmers.

Commenting on a game, John McPhail wrote in the 'View' — "The attack must regain their striking action. I take the view that lately they have lost the scoring touch in the goal area, and again at Greenock on Saturday, chances were made and missed.

"The rhythm and fluency that marked their earlier season performances has temporarily gone, I say however that they can quickly return, if the front line can just crack a couple of balls into the net. Top marks again to full backs Jim Craig and Tommy Gemmell. They both played brilliantly, and with a match or two behind him Bobby Murdoch too can come back to his best."

ONE Hibs player who has happy memories of Celtic Park is Mike Conroy who once played in Celtic's midfield.

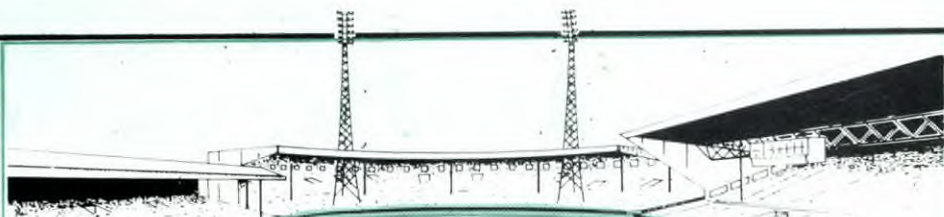
In this picture we see him on a very happy day when he signed from Port Glasgow Juniors.

Jim Melrose, Mark Reid, Frank McGarvey and Paul McStay scored the other Celtic goals.

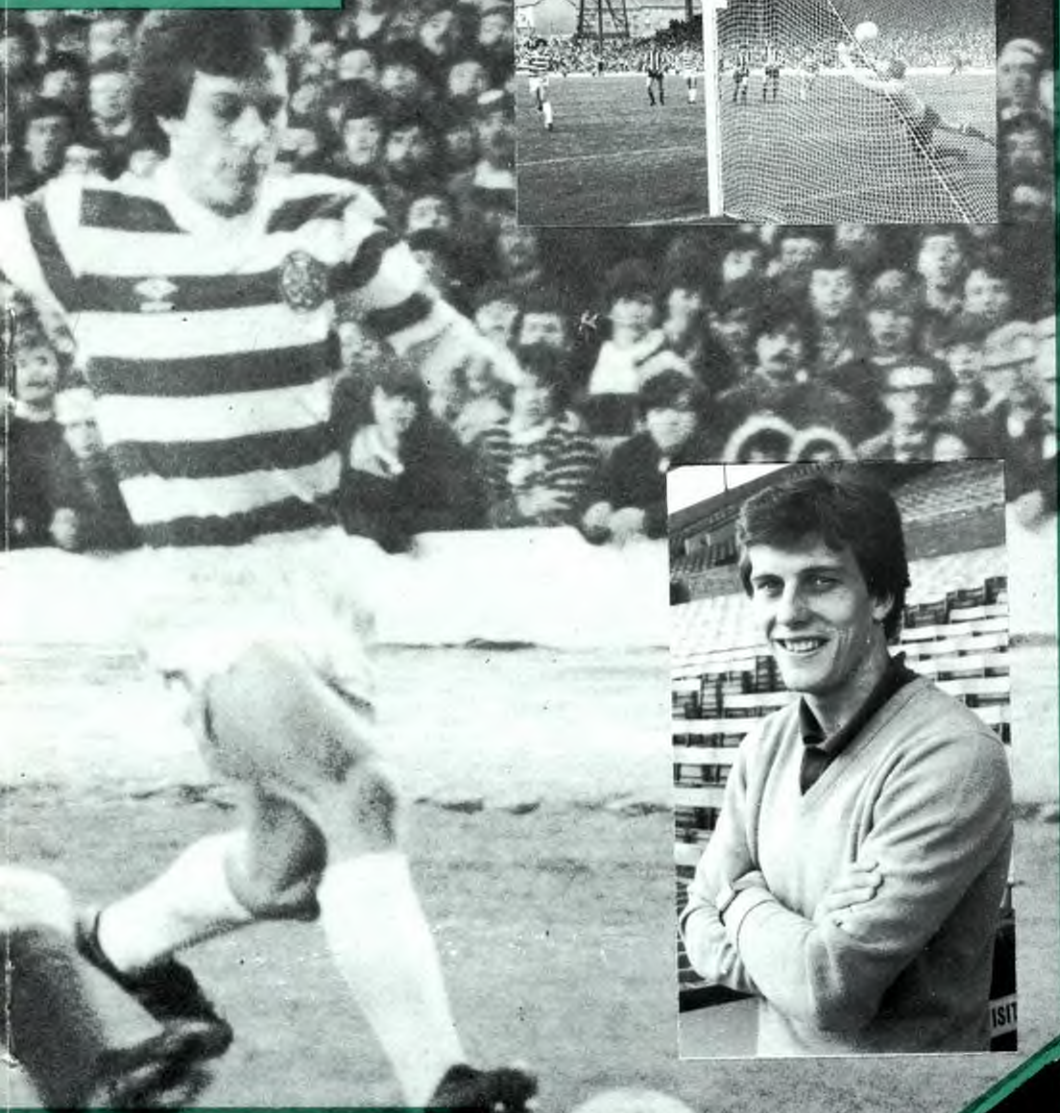
