IT WAS floodlight robbery on Wednesday, October 4, 1978, at Celtic Park when Motherwell took a 1-0 lead in the first leg of the League Cup third round tie. In the early stages of the game Celtic played well and it was one-way traffic towards the Motherwell goal in which Dave Latchford was in inspired form.

The first half was punctuated by a series of stoppages for fouls and bookings as the referee struggled hard to get on top of the match without ever really succeeding. Motherwell's Latchford brought off some excellent saves during the game but on three or four occasions he would have had no chance had the finishing efforts been struck more accurately.

Following an incident in the 65th minute McLaren and Alfie Conn were given their marching orders. The only goal of the game was scored when Willie Pettigrew ran on to a short pass back from Andy Lynch and beat Peter Latchford with a low shot.

ON OCTOBER 10, 1973 this story appeared on the front page of the 'Celtic View':

Manager Jack Stein has handed out a stern warning to his players . . . "Don't underestimate Vejle — even though they are not the most glamorous team in the competition." The Celtic boss spoke to his players after flying to see the Danish champions in action.

He also told the 'View': "Some people may think the Danes will be easy. But we won't subscribe to this line of thought. In some ways it might have been better if we had been drawn against a more glamorous side. Then there would have been no grounds for possible complacency."

Despite his caution Mr Stein feels Celtic will go into the draw for the last eight next March. "By then we should be settled and perhaps with fewer injury problems, better prepared to play the big names in the competition," he said.

AGO

ON Wednesday, October 2, 1968, Celtic played St Etienne of France in the second leg of their first round European Cup tie trailing by 2-0 from the first game played two weeks earlier. Celtic's task was made all the more difficult with the knowledge that the loss of a goal would make their task almost impossible. The details of this game read as follows:

Celtic 4 (Gemmell, Craig, Chalmers, McBride), St Etienne 0 — Celtic: Simpson; Craig and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Wallace; Chalmers; McBride and Hughes. Subs. Fallon, Clark, Lennox, Connelly, O'Neill.

Celtic retained their winning form three days later when Dundee United came to Celtic Park in a league match. This time the margin was 2-0, and the details were: Celtic 2 (Murdoch, Gemmell), Dundee United 0 — Celtic: Simpson; Craig and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Wallace; Chalmers; McBride and Hughes.
