CELTIC travelled to Burnley on Tuesday, September 13 and lost to Burnley by the only goal of the game.

However the actual game was overshadowed by events off the park which culminated with spectators spilling on to the playing surface a few minutes from the end of the match causing play to be stopped for several minutes.

The match itself wasn't a particularly inspiring one with Celtic having most of the territorial advantage, particularly in the first half, but failing to turn this superiority into goals.

Just after the interval George McCluskey produced an excellent chance when, following a penetration run on the left, his low cross was narrowly missed by two forwards. Shortly after this Steve Kindon looking yards offside was allowed to run clear of the defence, walk round Peter Latchford and put the ball in the net.

THE following story, written by John McPhail, appeared on the front page of the Celtic View dated September 26, 1973.

Celtic had their expected comfortable victory over Turku of Finland in the European Cup last week. They started with an early Tommy Callaghan goal but didn't hit the target area too much until the second half.

Mr Stein was very happy indeed with the result and the style of victory. He said: "We took nothing for granted and even if we took some time to get the rewards for our construction we never looked like losing."

The boss was highly delighted with the come-back displays of Deans and Davidson. He said: "Certainly the pressure was off when both came on to the field but they looked sharp and accurate in their shooting."

The injury list is clearing up and now Bobby Lennox is on the mend. But Brian McLaughlin is a different story. Mr Stein said: "He is home now but I am not looking for anything from Brian before the turn of the year."

It has also been decided not to issue tickets for this match as the board fully understand the difficulties this can cause. The stand, and the terracing, will therefore be first come first served.

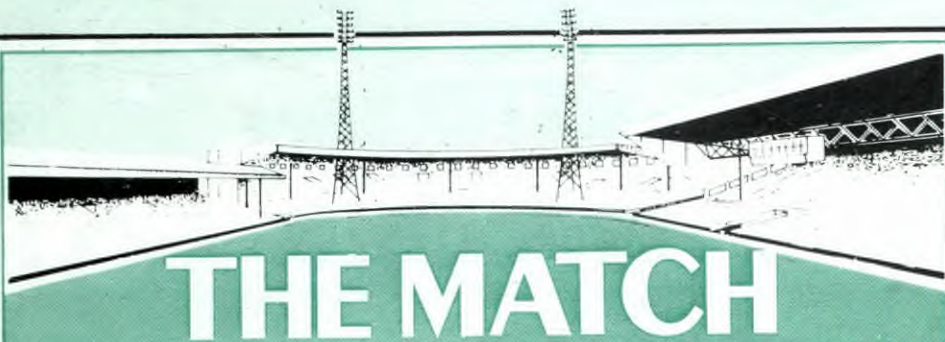

## FLASHBACK

ST. JOHNSTONE were members of the Premier League in its very first year, but unfortunately were relegated and have since played their matches in the first division.

During that season 1975-76, today's opponents met four times in the League with a total of 16 goals being scored and Celtic taking the full eight points.

The scores were 3-2 and 1-0 at Celtic Park and 2-1 and 4-3 at Muirton.

The previous season, 1974-75 each team had claimed two points, Celtic winning 3-1 at home and St Johnstone winning 2-1 on their own territory.

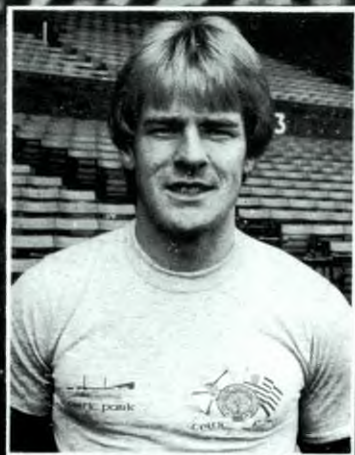
