JOCK STEIN says...

The first half of the League Cup quarter-final at Dens Park must have given every Celtic supporter who saw it great pleasure. For myself, I don't think Celtic have played better in my time as manager of the club. The first-half display against Dundee followed a fine performance against Clyde at Shawfield four days earlier.

But playing exceptionally well in the first half is not sufficient in itself. Some carelessness and casualness crept into our defensive play after half time at Dens and we paid a heavy penalty. Dundee made no more than three good scoring chances in the second half and cashed in on two of them. They deserve full marks for their spirited comeback, for their prospects must have seemed poor even to them when they went two goals down.

NOT DESPONDENT

I am not despondent about not winning the match and I hope our supporters feel likewise. After all, we have been introducing young players into the side and there is bound to be the odd lapse while we are undergoing such changes.

No one can dispute the fact that we have been playing some brilliant football. We shall try our utmost to continue in this vein this afternoon when we meet Rangers. I have no intention of advising my players to do anything other than play the most

"Old Firm" in Action



Ron McKinnon, Jimmy Johnstone, John Greig and Bobby Lennox are the "Old Firm" rivals (left to right) in the picture above. Greig is the only one of the four, however, who played in the last Celtic-Rangers match, the 1969-70 Glasgow Cup final at Hampden Park just over a month ago which Celtic won 3-1. The teams then were:—

Stein and Waddell in Playing Rivalry

Jock Stein and Willie Waddell have been adversaries on the playing field as well as rival managers in Scottish football. Mr. Stein's playing career with Celtic ended after an ankle injury sustained in a league game with Rangers in September, 1955, in the season after Mr. Waddell had finished his playing days for Rangers.

The last time they were in opposition on the field was on New Year's Day, 1954. The teams that day for the league match at Celtic Park were:—

Celtic—*Bonnar; Haughney, Meechan; Evans, Stein, Peacock; Higgins, Fernie, McPhail, Collins, Mochan.*

Rangers—*Brown; Young, Little; McColl, Woodburn, Cox; Waddell, Grierson, Gardiner, Prentice, Hubbard.*

Referee—*J. A. Mowat (Burnside).*

Celtic won 1-0, the goalscorer being Neil Mochan and went on to win the championship for the first time since 1938.

REMARKABLE

Celtic and Rangers have played 74 Scottish League matches at Celtic Park and it is a remarkable tribute to the closeness of the clubs' rivalry that both clubs have won 25 games and 24 have been drawn. The last

draw was on January 3 of this year when these sides played without scoring:—

Celtic—*Williams; Hay, Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill, Brogan; Johnstone, Hood, Wallace, Auld, Hughes.*

THE LAST 24 CELTIC-RANGERS GAMES

Since Jock Stein became manager of Celtic (in March, 1965) they have played Rangers 24 times (excluding cup ties that were drawn)—10 times in the Scottish League, eight times in the League Cup, three times in the Scottish Cup, and three times in the Glasgow Cup. Celtic have had 13 victories and Rangers 7; four matches have been drawn.

The league championship "score" is four wins for Rangers and three for Celtic, with three games drawn.

HARRY HOOD'S HOPE
