JOCK STEIN says...

All eyes and thoughts will be on Hampden Park today. Unfortunately the concentration will not be on the playing of the game but rather on what kind of behaviour and atmosphere attaches to the occasion. This is a great pity, but in view of the happenings of the past it is inevitable.

The sooner all connected with football realise that a Celtic-Rangers match is a football match and not an event at which non-football matters take over, the better it will be for all of us. A Celtic-Rangers match can still be the greatest club game in the world, but the winners take only two points and the losers concede only two. Victory is, of course, most important for either club in the matter of prestige, but the league championship will not be won or lost on the strength of this game, which starts at the unusual kick-off time of 12 noon.

Celtic Football Club have had consultations with the police about the whole matter of behaviour of crowds and we wish to announce that they will have our whole-hearted support in whatever they do to ensure good conduct. We back the police to the hilt, in other words.

We at Celtic Park were very disappointed with the display in the midweek European Cup match. We shall require to be a much better side today if we are to be successful. We are aware that Hampden seems to be a good place for us to play only when the occasion is big, but we know also that this is not a satisfactory answer to our supporters.

The Rangers game will be our first really big test, and it will be followed in quick succession by the Bobby Charlton testimonial match at Old Trafford, the League Cup match at Stranraer, a very difficult looking match in the league at Dundee, and then the return game in Norway against Rosenborg which we have made unnecessarily hard for



ourselves. If Celtic can do well over this period they will atone for the disappointments so far this season.

Celtic and Rangers in the League

Parkhead Games of the Past

This will be the seventy-sixth Scottish League match between Celtic and Rangers with Celtic the home team. Of the 75 in the past, Celtic have won 27 and Rangers 25 and 23 have been drawn.

Those figures are proof in themselves of the exceedingly close rivalry of the clubs, though it should be noted that Celtic have taken the lead in the league games played at Celtic Park only in the last few years.

In the last eight seasons, for instance, Celtic have won five and drawn two and one has been drawn.

But that record compares unfavourably with the magnificent run of Celtic right at the start of the Scottish League. Of the first eight home league games against Rangers—from season 1890-91 to 1897-98 inclusive—Celtic won five and drew three. They won five in succession—from the second season to the sixth—which is a feat that has never been equalled.

FEW BIG WINS

There have been few instances of a victory by a large margin in "Old Firm" league matches at Celtic Park. One that will be recalled by older Celtic supporters was the 6-2 win in September 1938 when three players, Willie Lyon, Malcolm Macdonald, and Jimmy Delaney shared the Celtic goals and Bob McPhail and Willie Thornton scored for Rangers.

The teams, of whom most are still to the fore, were :—

Celtic—Kennaway; Hogg, Morrison; Geatons, Lyon, and Paterson; Delaney Macdonald, Crum, Divers, Murphy.

Rangers—Dawson; Gray, Shaw; McKillop, Woodburn, Brown; Main, Thornton, Smith, McPhail, Kinnear.

Referee—M. C. Hutton (Glasgow).

It is the only occasion on which Celtic have taken six goals from Rangers in a league game at Celtic Park.

In September 1960 came Rangers biggest league win in 64 visits to Parkhead—by 5-1. That remains the only league game in which Rangers have scored 5 goals there. The teams were :—

Celtic—Fallon; MacKay, Kennedy; Crerand, Kurila, Peacock; Conway,

Chalmers, Carroll, Divers, Hughes.

Rangers—Ritchie; Shearer, Caldwell; Davis, Paterson, Baxter; Scott, McMillan, Millar, Brand, Wilson.

Referee—H. Phillips (Wishaw).

Alec Scott, Jimmy Millar, Ralph Brand, Davie Wilson and Harold Davis scored for Rangers. Steve Chalmers had Celtic's goal.

Chalmers, still outpacing much younger opponents as a Morton player, had one of his greatest days when Celtic beat Rangers 5-1 in the New Year match of 1966 at Celtic Park. Steve scored three of the goals and Charlie Gallagher and Bobby Murdoch the others. Rangers' scorer was Davie Wilson who in two minutes gave his side a lead which they held until half-time.

The teams in this match, which was in grave danger of being postponed because of frost, were :—

Celtic—Simpson; Craig, Gemmell; Murdoch, Cushley, Clark; Johnstone, Gallagher, McBride, Chalmers, Hughes.

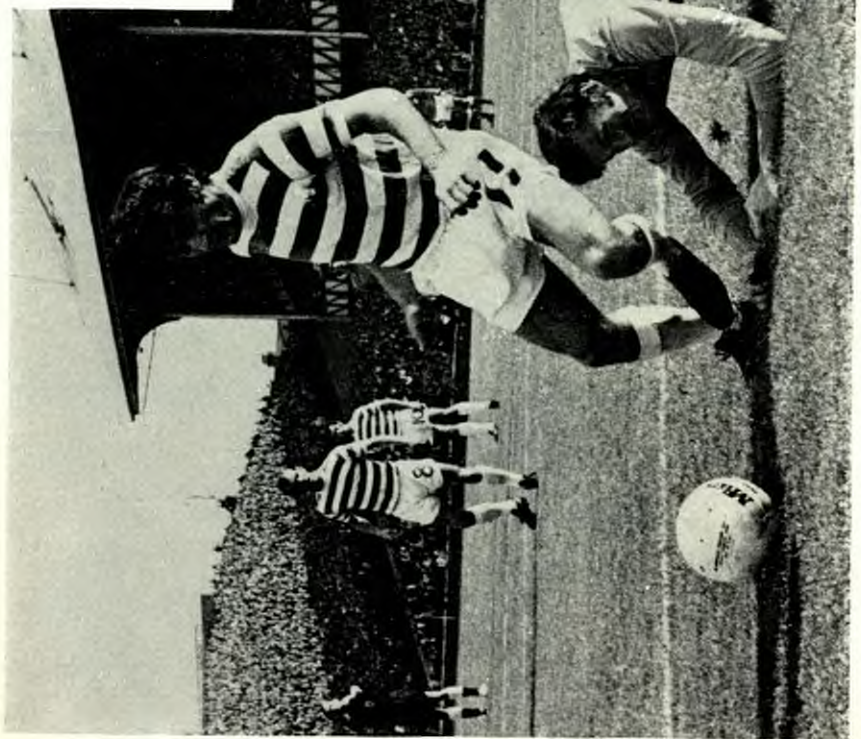

CONSISTENCY IS THE WORD

Consistency, the need for which was constantly impressed on the Celtic players from the moment that Jock Stein took over the managership, is one of the features of the modern Celtic performances. But only in recent years has Celtic consistency in the league championship topped that of Rangers in the competition.

Celtic's record achievement of seven championships in succession has taken their number of title wins to 27, which is still behind Rangers' aggregate of 33 plus one shared.

Here is the proof of the wonderful consistency of Rangers in the league, in not a single competition of which they have been worse than sixth and that only once:—

IN STEIN'S TIME

Celtic have played Rangers 32 times (excluding cup-ties that were drawn) since Jock Stein became Celtic's manager in March 1965. Celtic have won 19 of the 32 matches and Rangers 8; there have been 5 draws.

Of the 14 league games in the period Celtic have won 6 and Rangers 4; there have been 4 draws.
