JOCK STEIN says...

Celtic's form against Dundee in the League Cup quarter-final in mid-week surely proved that the team by and large had a really bad day against Hibernian at Easter Road four days previously. I am not knocking Hibs by saying that. I have said before and I repeat it—Hibs played well and won deservedly, but there is no doubt that part of the reason for their victory was our disappointing performance.

The defeat at Easter Road might have been very worrying to us if it had not been immediately followed by a good display.

A good team quickly recovers from a setback. We played badly at Easter Road and got our deserts; we played well against Dundee at Parkhead and got our reward. The lesson is plain for all to see: if you play well you usually are rewarded, if you play much less than well you usually pay the penalty.

Since our last programme Celtic, apart from the disappointment in Edinburgh, have beaten Rangers 2-0 in the League, K.P.V. of Finland 9-0 in the European Champions' Cup, and Dundee 5-1 in the League Cup quarter-final. In each of those victories our supporters, I feel confident, have had very good entertainment. Many difficult tasks lie ahead, of course. We have had recent proof that nobody lies down to Celtic; nobody hands us favours. Not that we ever want preferential treatment; we are ready and willing to take on all comers in fair combat.

It's Dundee again this afternoon—this time on League business. One promise about this fixture I can make—we shall not be resting on our laurels. Dundee are



quite formidable opponents. They were down 2-0 to us in the first League Cup quarter-final at Dens Park and rallied to a 2-2 draw. Again on Wednesday night they were down at half-time, this time by 3-0, and again they came back with a goal and would have made the score 3-2 but for a wonderful save by Evan Williams. So it will be a Celtic at full throttle this afternoon with minds firmly set on a return to the top of the League table.

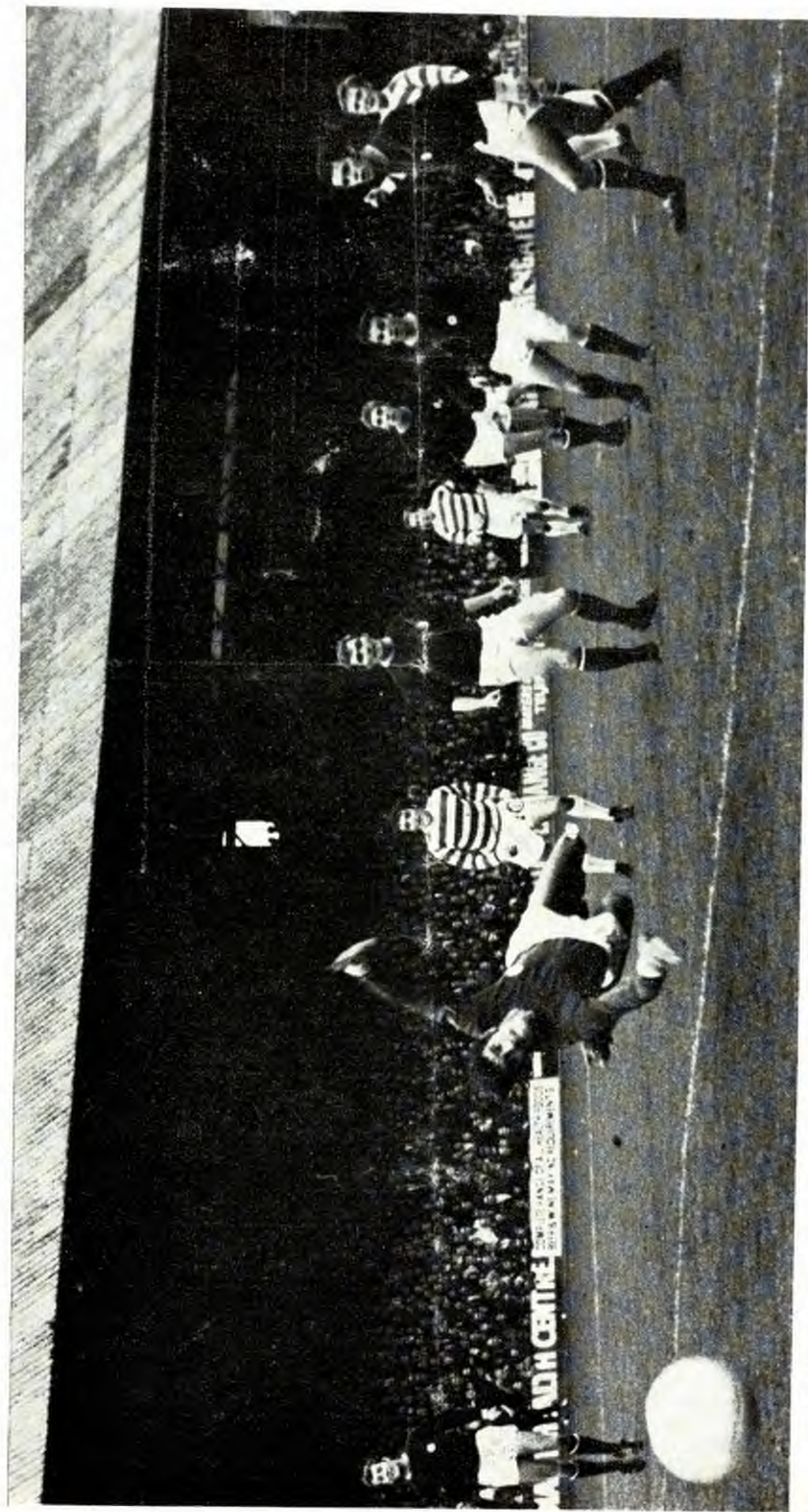

Dundee's Distinction In The League

Dundee are one of only five* clubs outwith Glasgow and Edinburgh who have won the Scottish League championship. Their single first-division title success was in season 1961-62 when they finished three points ahead of the runners-up, Rangers (54-51) and eight in front of Celtic who were third in the table.

In the following season Dundee had a splendid run in the European Champions Cup. They reached the semi-finals and lost to the ultimate winners of the trophy A.C. Milan.

Since then they have come close to a major success only in the League Cup of 1966-67 in which they lost 5-3 to Celtic in the final at Hampden Park. Since their championship winning season they have been disappointing in the league; in four seasons they have finished ninth of the 18 clubs and in the four other seasons their final position (including last season) has been sixth.

PENALTY GOAL

The Celtic-Dundee league match last season ended in a 1-0 win for Celtic through a penalty kick goal by Tommy Gemmell. The teams were:—

Celtic—Fallon; Hay, Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill, Brogan; Johnstone, Hood, Wallace, Macari, Auld. (Sub. Hughes).

Dundee—Donaldson; Wilson (R.), Houston; Murray, Easton, Selway; Gilroy, Kinninmonth, Wallace, Scott, Steele. (Sub. Campbell).

Referee—J. W. Paterson (Bothwell)

Two of that Dundee team are no longer with the club—Steve Murray (now with Aberdeen) and Billy Campbell, an Irish Internationalist, who moved to Motherwell.

Dundee's last league victory at Parkhead was in November, 1964 when goals by Andy Penman and Steve Murray gave them a 2-0 result. The player most responsible for the Celtic defeat was Alistair Donaldson, the goalkeeper, who was then in his 'teens. He made many fine saves. Only he and centre-half Jim Easton of the successful side are still at Dens Park. The teams were:—

Dundee—Donaldson; Hamilton, Beattie, Cousin, Easton, Stuart; Murray, Penman, Harley, Gilzean, Robertson.

John Cushley was transferred last week from West Ham United to Dunfermline Athletic and will probably be in the Fife club's team when Celtic visit East End Park next Saturday.

* The four other clubs are Aberdeen, Dumbarton, Kilmarnock and Motherwell.

Incredible but True

When Celtic won their first three league games of the season and did not concede a goal it was the first time in 25 seasons (in other words since the Scottish League competitions resumed after the Second World War) that they had done so.

It seems incredible but it is nevertheless a fact that only once before in that time have they won their first three league games of the season. That was in 1966-67 when they won eight matches in succession. In the first three games of that run they scored seven goals and lost one, in contrast to scoring nine and losing none this season.

Some one wrote recently that my move from full-back in the Celtic team would pose a problem for Scotland's International team manager, Mr. Bobby Brown, who might want me as a full-back in coming representative games.

I hope I am thinking along the right lines when I say that I shall be happy and honoured to play for Scotland anywhere and in any position. I hope too that I play well enough for Mr. Brown and the selectors to have confidence in me.

FIRST CONCERN

Of one thing I am certain, however. Celtic are my first concern. If they desire me to play in a particular position or in a special role which might affect my chances of International recognition then I have absolutely no complaint. My first—indeed only—responsibility is to the club.

I have not forgotten also that Mr. Brown has played me in a midfield role. I played in a midfield position against Wales last season and also wore the No. 8 shirt against England at Hampden.

My ambition from now on will be to be a member of a consistently winning Celtic side and also, if circumstances permit, a member of a successful Scottish team.
