CELTIC maintained their unbeaten run in the Premier League on Saturday September 9 when they took the current league champions on at Celtic Park and won convincingly by three goals to one.

Celtic went in at half-time leading by two goals and looking to be on the right road for a convincing victory. At the start of the second half Rangers were going all out to reduce the leeway and with Celtic not quite back in stride they scored in the 49th minute when Derek Parlane smacked the ball past Peter Latchford.

Joe Craig came on for George McCluskey and it was from a terrific run and inch perfect pass from the big striker that Tom McAdam restored Celtic's two goal lead. Then with the game still flowing from end to end, Gordon Smith hit the crossbar and in the ensuing scramble the referee adjudged that Roy Aitken had used an arm and awarded a penalty kick.

Alex Miller, who had replaced Alex McDonald minutes earlier, hit the ball low and firmly to the left side of the goal. Peter Latchford anticipated the direction of the shot, dived to his right, and brought off a magnificent save.

TEN years ago in the Celtic View dated September 5, 1973, John McPhail wrote this story on the front page.

Celtic will have a representative in Switzerland this week to see World Cup stars Eladio Reyes and William Quisandira in action. The Peruvian internationalists, both from Municipal Lima, were lined with the Parkhead club at the week-end. Mr Stein told me: "Our contacts in South America have sent good reports on both players and we are certainly interested in bringing them to Celtic Park. Reyes is a prolific goal scorer and has won 42 caps for Peru. He is 24 and he could be the experienced man we are looking for. Centre-half Quisandira is also 24. Both played in the last World Cup competition in Mexico.

HAVING qualified for the quarter final of the League Cup with home and away victories recorded against Morton, Partick Thistle and Rangers, the League games started with Celtic playing Clyde at Shawfield.

Goals by Brogan, Lennox and Gemmell got Celtic off to a flyer in defence of the championship. The teams on September 7, 1968 were:

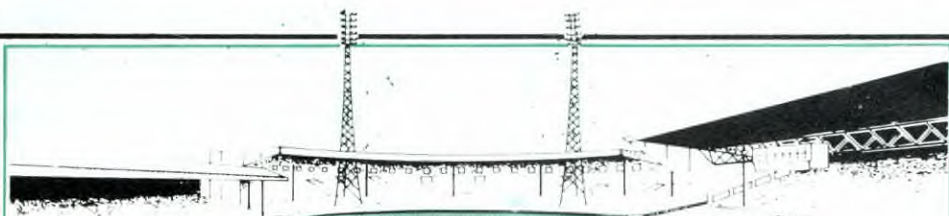

THE last time the Old Firm met on League duty was on Saturday May 14, 1983.

This is how that second half went. Charlie Nicholas pulled one back from the penalty spot when Davie Provan was felled by John McClelland. A brilliant header from Tom McAdam had Celtic on level terms. Rangers were now on retreat. That unbeatable Celtic midfield of McStay, MacLeod and Burns would not allow them to get back into the game. That was after an hour of football. Twelve minutes later Celtic took the lead for the first time and the bravery, accuracy and spectacle of Frank McGarvey's header were typical of the spirit shown that afternoon. The fourth was another penalty scored by Charlie Nicholas.
