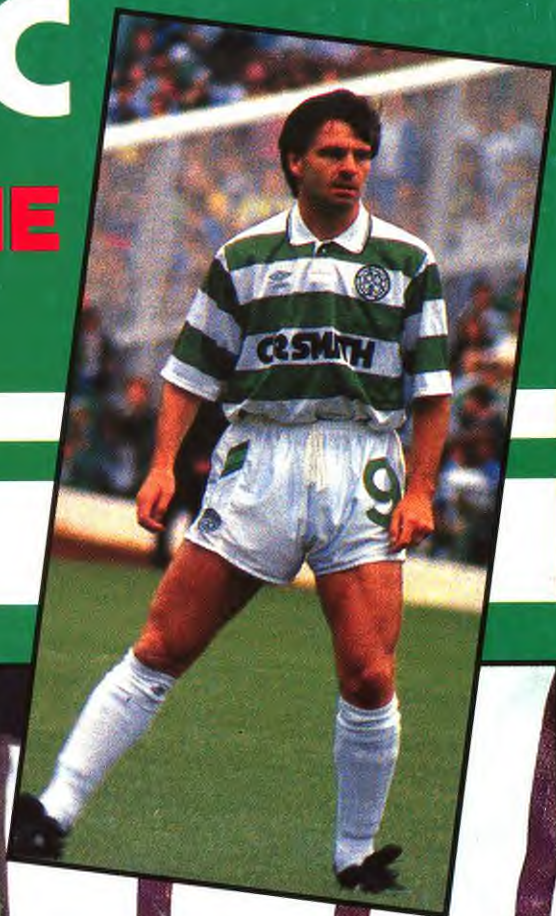

CLUB DIRECTORY

THERE is no getting away from the fact that we go into today's game against Dunfermline on the back of some deeply disappointing performances.

Our Scottish Cup semi-final replay exit at the hands of Motherwell was a shattering blow to everyone involved with the playing staff at Celtic Park while last Saturday's league defeat by Dundee United was another important one-off game which again found us wanting.

The outcome is that we almost certainly have to rely on the efforts of others if we are to avoid a second consecutive season out of European competition.

That is not an acceptable state of affairs for a club of Celtic's standing.

I believe that this club must be represented in Europe on a regular basis and, in order that we achieve this, we have to be aware that periods in a season when we record victories are not sufficient.

We have to produce the sort of concerted performances which ensure us consistency of results rather than sporadic bursts of success.

I look back to the period leading up to the Skol Cup final when we recorded a series of good results similar to that of February and March only for it too to peter out into a totally unproductive spell.

Today's game is the first of four which are all about pride, both professional and the club's.

It is essential that we consolidate fourth spot in the Premier Division to give ourselves the chance of qualifying for the UEFA Cup if Dundee United are successful in the Scottish Cup final.

We have to set ourselves a target of winning each game as it comes up, starting with today's visit of Dunfermline.

Iain Munro's side has made it anything but easy for us in our meetings this season and indeed recorded a 2-1 victory here in

December during another of our bad spells.

Our target has to be to end a run of five games without a victory and start a run of results which we hope will see us finish a tremendously disappointing term with something concrete.

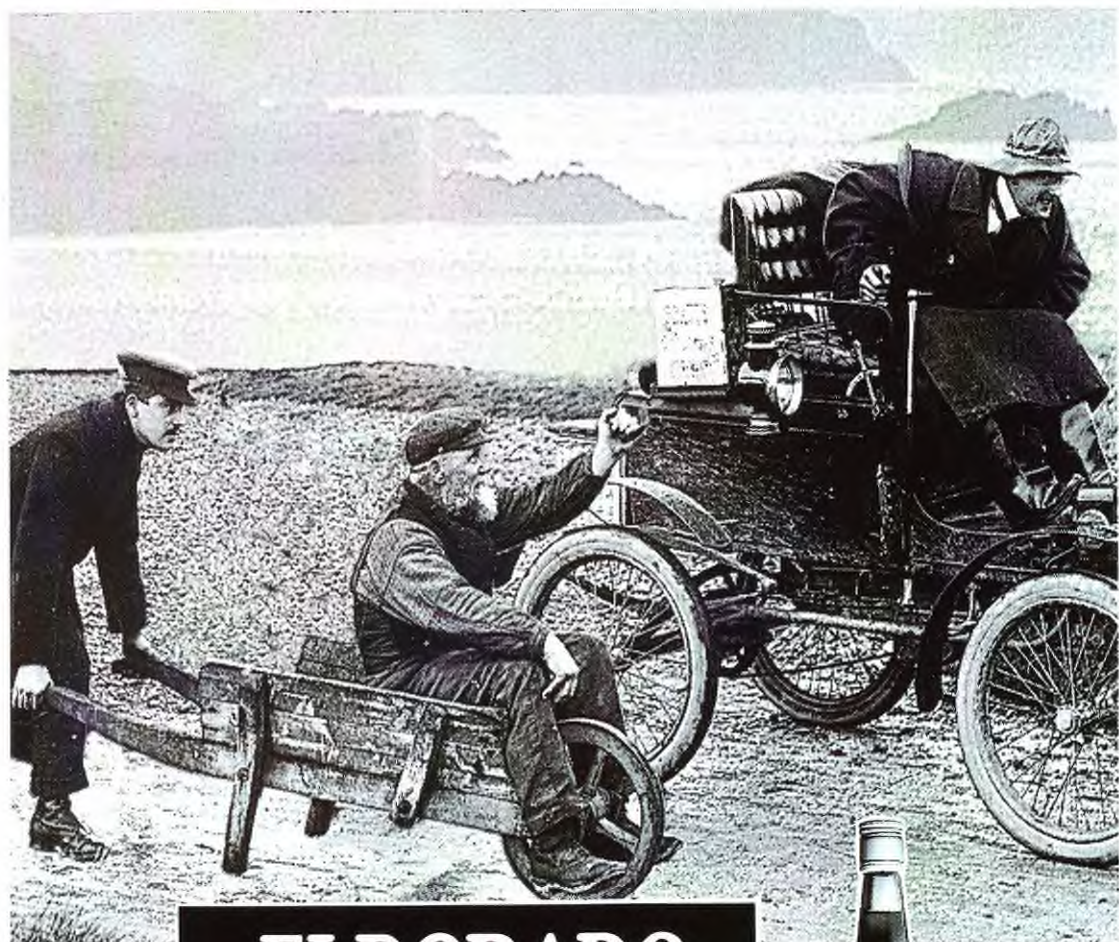
