AFTER months of speculation Liam Brady finally got his man when Pat McGinlay signed for Celtic.

It was a move which most Celtic supporters took for granted – but one which was only clinched after Spurs tried to throw an 11th hour spanner in the works.

The news had many cynics wondering if the club was about to miss out on a diehard fan who was also a top-class player.

So, after years of hearing the cliché 'I'd walk to Celtic Park in my bare feet just to play in the hoops', it's great to actually see someone practice what they preach.

**Pat McGinlay is that man. He rejected the lucrative Spurs bid and committed himself to a three-year deal with the club he has followed boy and man.**

Today, his former club Hibernian are the fitting opposition in his first competitive match at Celtic Park, as the clubs wrangle over a price tag.

It was clear that Pat would be leaving Hibernian no matter what happened as during the summer he snubbed pre-season training at Easter Road and sweated it out with Partick Thistle instead.

He was linked with a whole string of clubs – but, on Friday July 30, he finally put pen to paper and signed for the ONLY team he wanted to play for.

The signing came after a summer of deep thought when he and his family took a well-earned break from the pressures of headlines and rumours.

He said: "I took Mags and the kids, Emma and Megan, off to live it up for a fortnight in the north of Majorca and left all the speculation behind.

"It was marvellous to get away from it all and relax in the

sunshine. The weather was fantastic and the atmosphere gave me time to think things out.

"Not that there was much to think about – except the worry over whether or not Celtic really WOULD come in with a bid.
