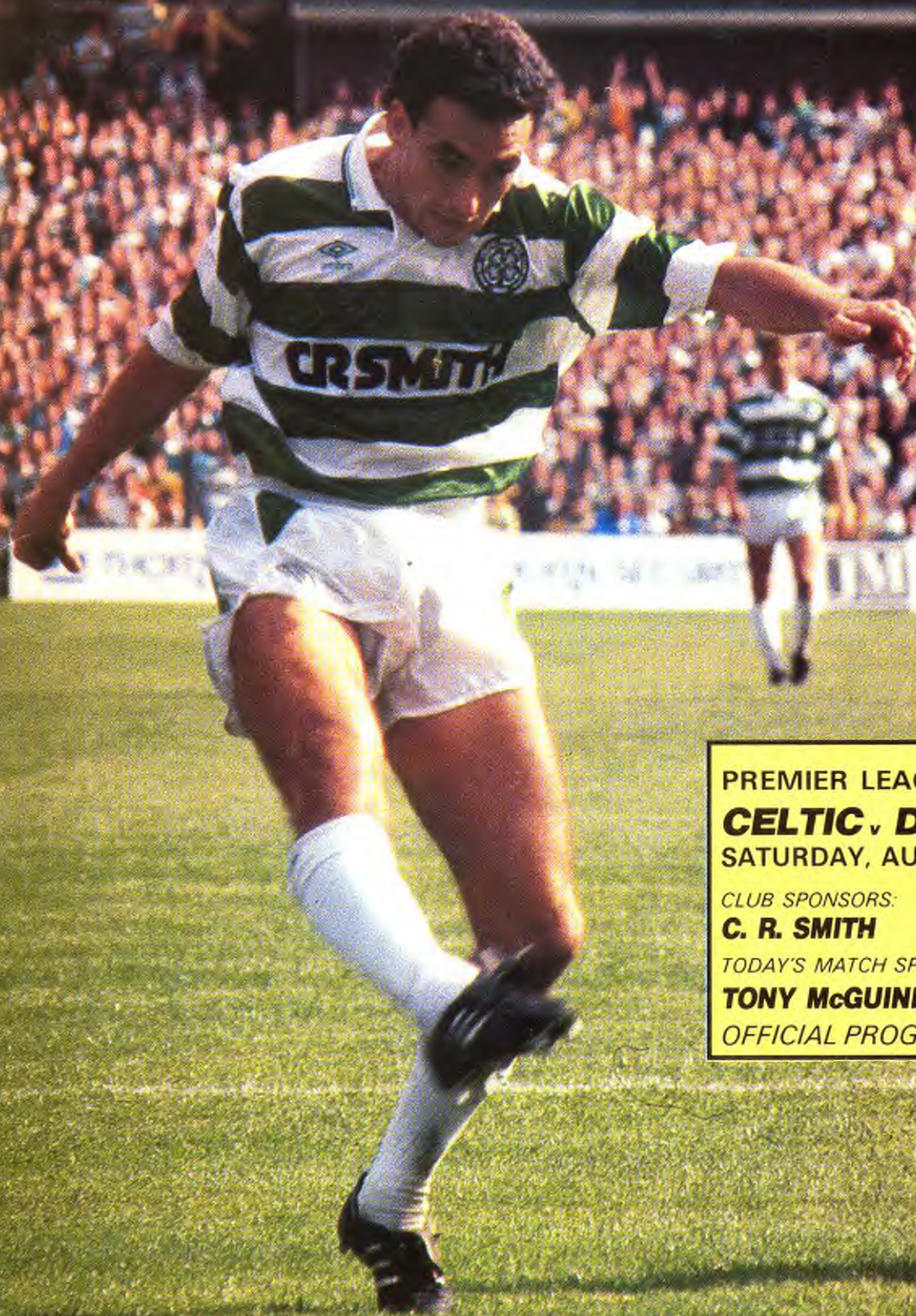

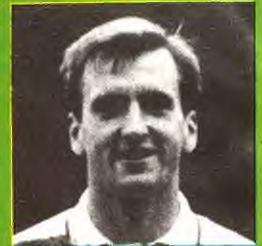
## AROUND THE CLUB
