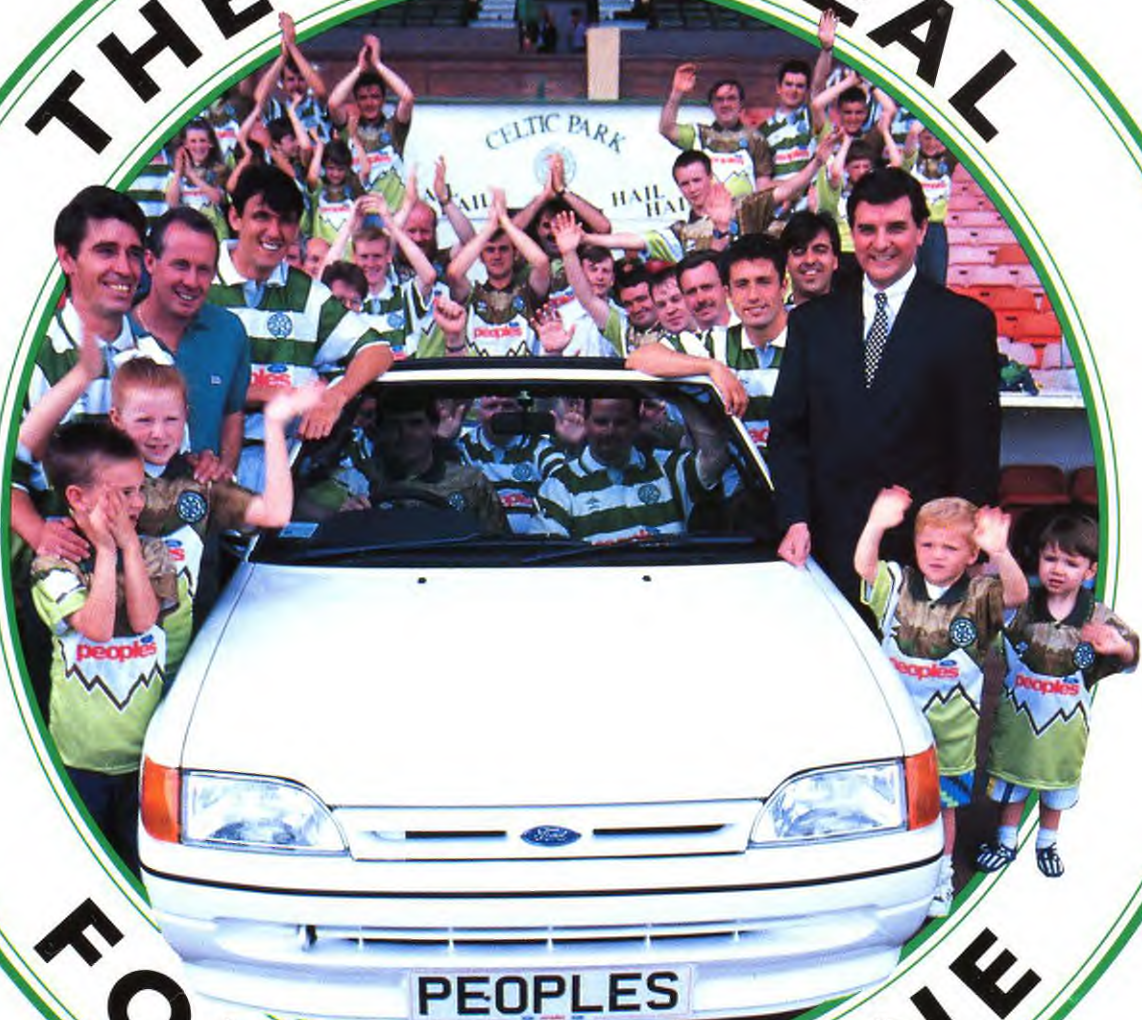

**IT was obviously very disappointing to suffer my first defeat as Celtic manager on Saturday when we lost at Aberdeen.**

However there was little or nothing to choose between the sides and I was pleased by the amount of effort my lads put in.

They gave it everything but ultimately if you do not put the ball in your opponents' net then you do not get results.

I did not think the match was a classic, with neither side reaching their best form, though I felt we opened brightly and if we had taken our chances in this period could have been a couple of goals in front.

Then Aberdeen scored, against the run of play somewhat, and this knocked us out of our stride for a time.

But all credit to my team because they showed a lot of character to get back on top, pinning Aberdeen back in the second half.

I always felt that the game might be settled by a solitary goal and this is how it worked out with Aberdeen defending their lead soundly and limiting us to half chances when we were in the ascendancy after the break.

In the final analysis I suppose our play perhaps lacked a little of the quality we have shown in our previous games but offsetting this is the fact that Aberdeen are undoubtedly the

best side we have faced so far this season.

However the match is now firmly in the past and with games in Scotland coming at a fast and furious pace it is important that we do not dwell on it.

We have to pick ourselves up for tonight's Skol Cup visit of Raith Rovers, rather than feel sorry for ourselves, as we were perhaps entitled to do after not taking anything from a match in which we played not too badly.

Tonight's match will see me reacquainted with an old friend in the form of my opposite number Jimmy Nicholl.

Jimmy and I enjoyed some rare old battles when he played for Manchester United and I for Arsenal and I hope this evening's contest turns out to be another enjoyable occasion.

Raith have been going well this season and their emphatic victory over Motherwell in the last round of the cup is a result which has put us very much on our guard for tonight's game.

We will treat them with respect and look to put on a performance which secures our place in the quarter-finals.
