JIM GALLACHER Dependable goalkeeper who completed his 150th clean sheet for Clydebank from just over 500 appearances.

JOE DICKSON Attacking full back who recently scored his first goal for the club. This goal proved to be the winner V Aberdeen earlier this month.

JIMMY GIVEN Ever present this season Jimmy is a midfield player recently converted to full back he is the spot kick expert for Clydebank.
