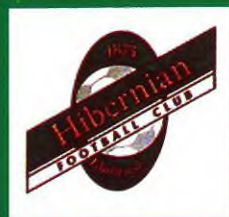

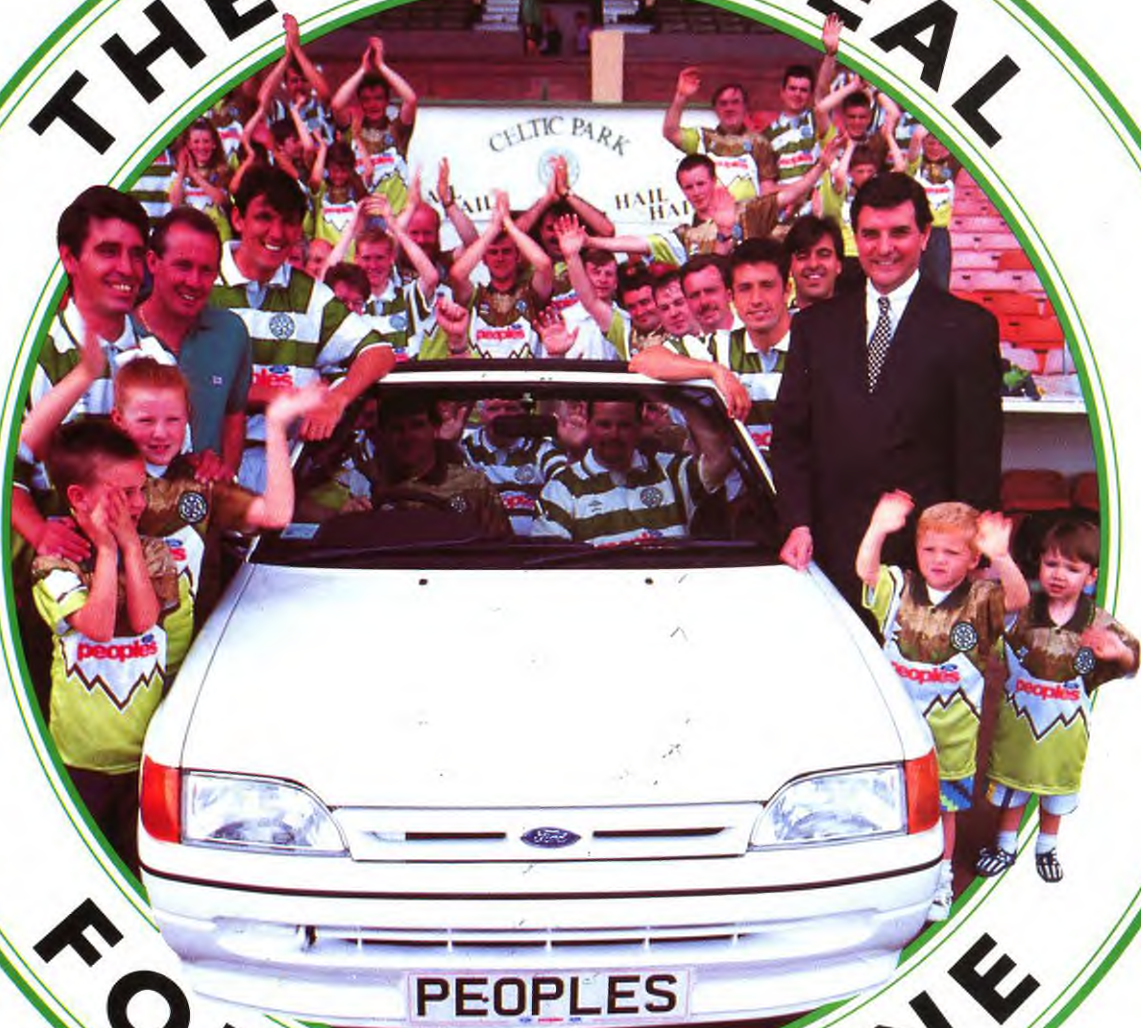

On the subject of our fans, I would like to say how much their tremendous backing in recent times has been appreciated.

I believe we have proved to them that we CAN be genuine title contenders and I would like to think that we will be able to count on their continued 100% support, which we really need in the important days which lie ahead.

More Soccer Shorts by Jack Rollin. Published by Guinness £6.99.

JUST when you thought it safe to go back to the book shop, Guinness have unleashed the follow-up to Soccer Shorts!

It is packed with 26 chapters interspersed with special features looking at the funny side of football and the peculiarities that occur from time to time.

Among the oddities thrown up in the book is: "Pat Bonner, Celtic's Republic of Ireland international goalkeeper in the 1990 World Cup, played for Leicester City in the 1975-76 FA Youth Cup."

Full of items which are bound to crop up in pub quizzes and the like, it introduces new questions rather than answering existing ones.

Illustrated by David Arthur, the anecdotes and facts combine to make for an amusing and informative read.

If you feel the need know that a football XI can be played in 39,916,800 different formations, or that Peter Millar of Motherwell was booked five times in as many league and cup games against Celtic in 1973-74, then this is the one to ask for in your Christmas stocking!

This is needless and distasteful and has no place at Celtic Park.

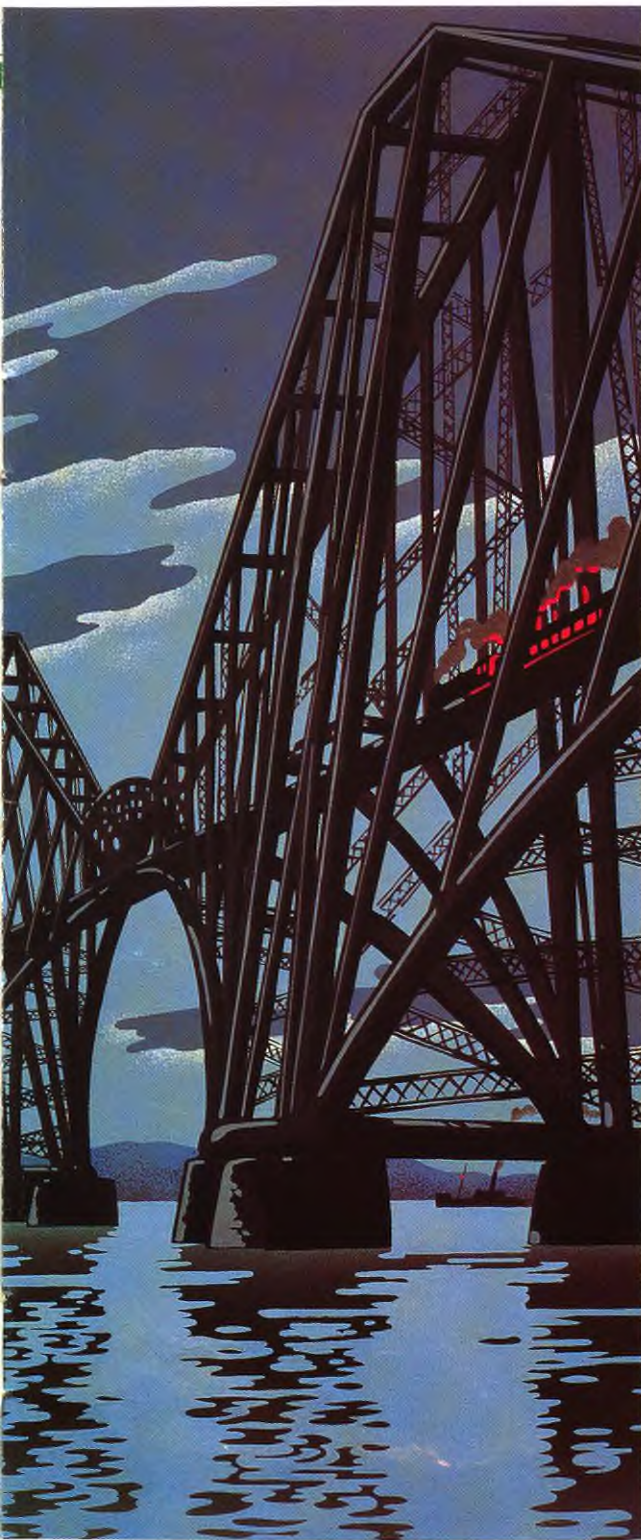
We would urge all supporters to CUT THIS OUT and sing only songs which befit the club's great traditions.

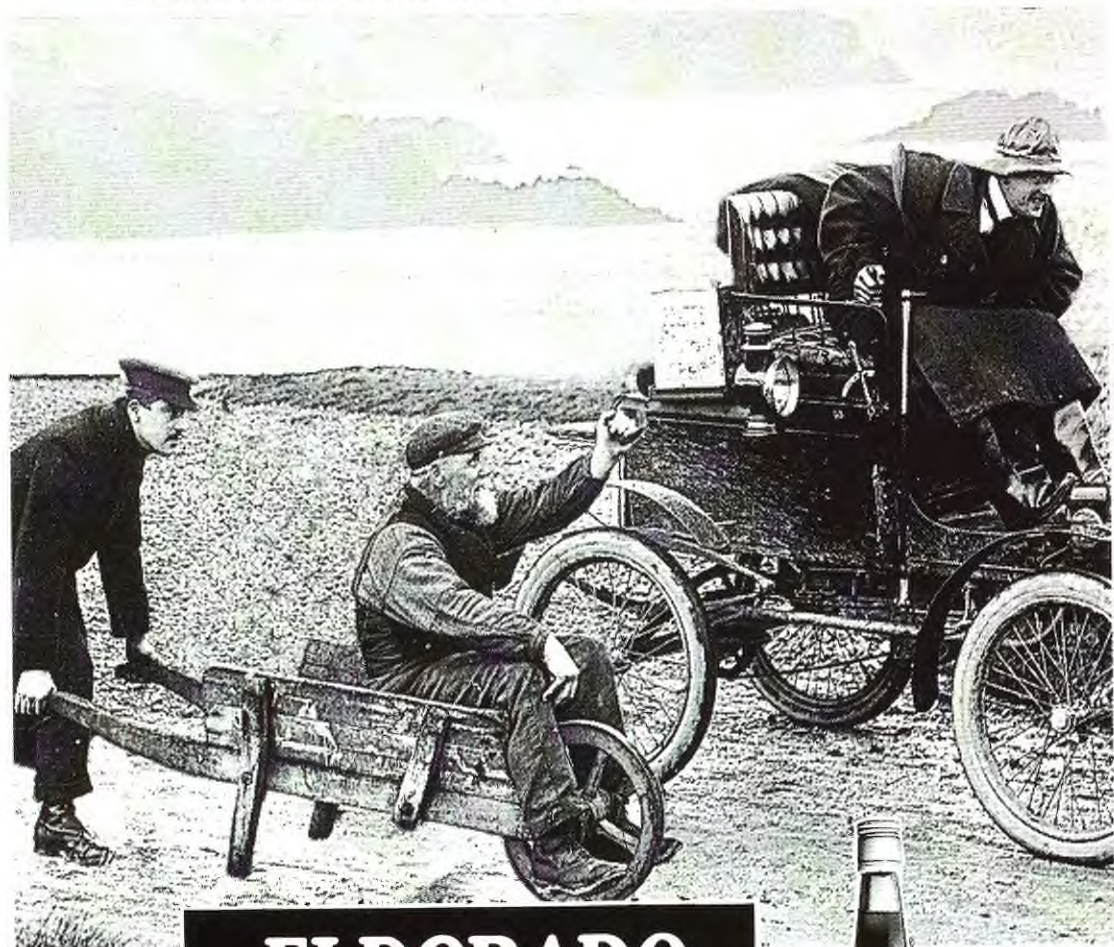
