# MOOD OF MY MEN IS THE RIGHT ONE

THE Scottish Cup has provided great excitement and enjoyment for me, the backroom staff, players and fans over the past three seasons.

The success and resulting enjoyment was achieved by intense preparation and we have worked for tonight's tie every bit as diligently as we did for any in the recent past.

We had the slight upset of being involved in consecutive postponed Premier Division fixtures which means that this game comes after a fair period without a competitive game.

It is something we reacted to by arranging a closed doors game against Queen's Park at Lesser Hampden a week ago and setting up another with Dumbarton at Boghead on Friday.

These games were arranged with a view to giving certain players a run-out and demonstrate that no stone has been left unturned in ensuring that we have every chance of progressing to the quarter-finals of the Scottish Cup.

St Mirren have had a whole lot of pressure taken off their shoulders by league reconstruction and the consequent removal of the threat of relegation.

Like many clubs, they have players with the ability to perform well in relaxed and positive situations.

Cup-ties come into that category so we are certainly not underestimating the task which faces us.

We have worked upon what we see as their strengths as well as, more extensively, on our own.

My players have set themselves the target of achieving European qualification by their final placing in the Premier Division.

But they know only too well that it can also be gained, in addition to providing a day of glory, by proceeding through cup-ties all the way to the final at Hampden in May.

That has been achieved in recent years by treating each individual tie as if it were a final – and that is the way we shall be approaching tonight's game.

The players have a completely single-minded attitude in this regard and, while the right of anyone to success in a cup-tie can never be ignored, I feel that the mood of my men is such that they will be unrelenting in their progress towards another Hampden appearance.

Whatever problems the recent lay-off may have had, it has also been beneficial for the

likes of Anton Rogan and Chris Morris as they sought to shake off injury and a virus respectively.

I look forward to the game very confident in the ability of the players to advance to the quarter-finals.

# 'T I C TALK...

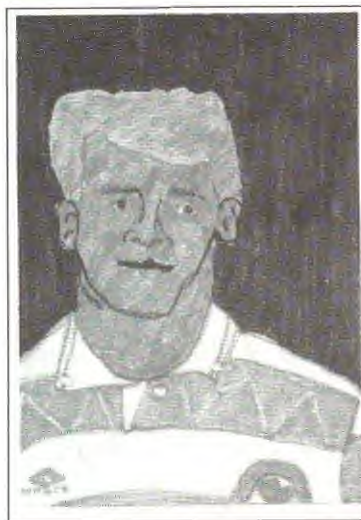
PLENTY of drawings have been rolling in to the Celtic Programme office of late and for that we thank everyone who has submitted his or her work.

Maybe our new cheerleaders will think up a "yell" for the new man. How about TIGER, TIGER, TIGER – YOU'RE GRRRRRREAT!

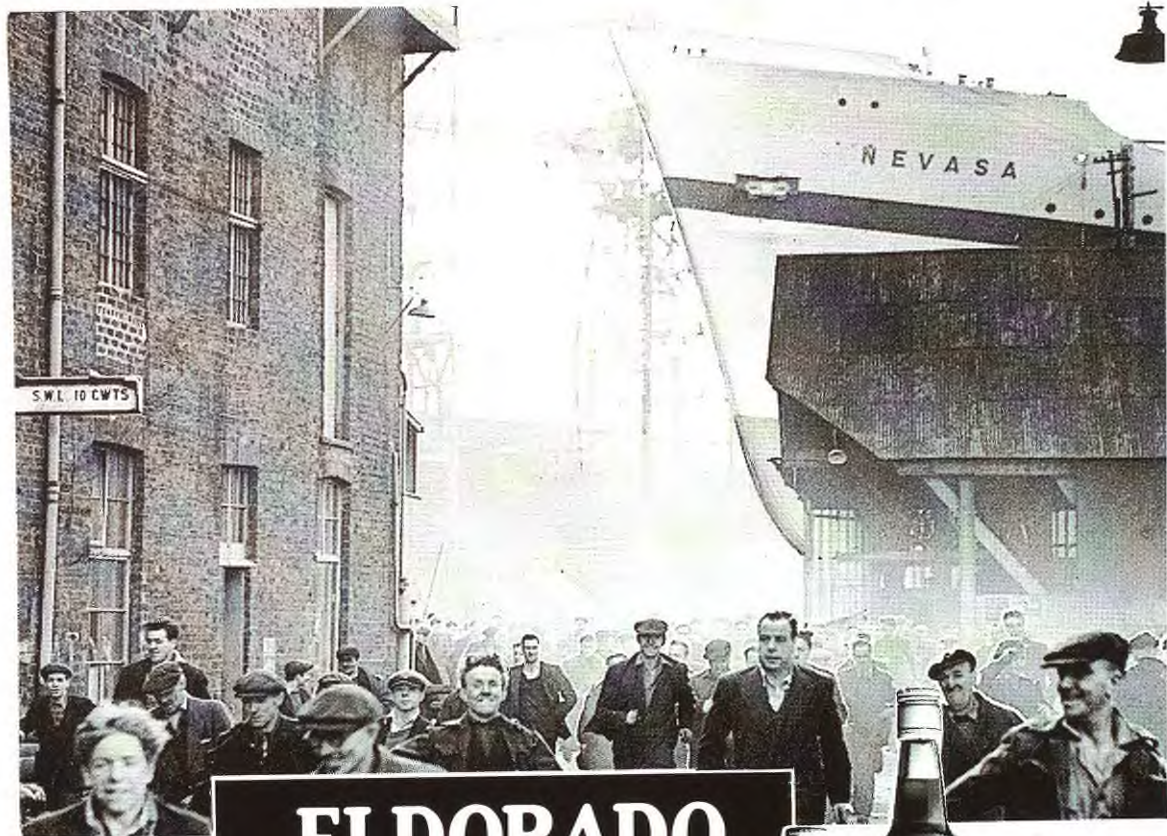
