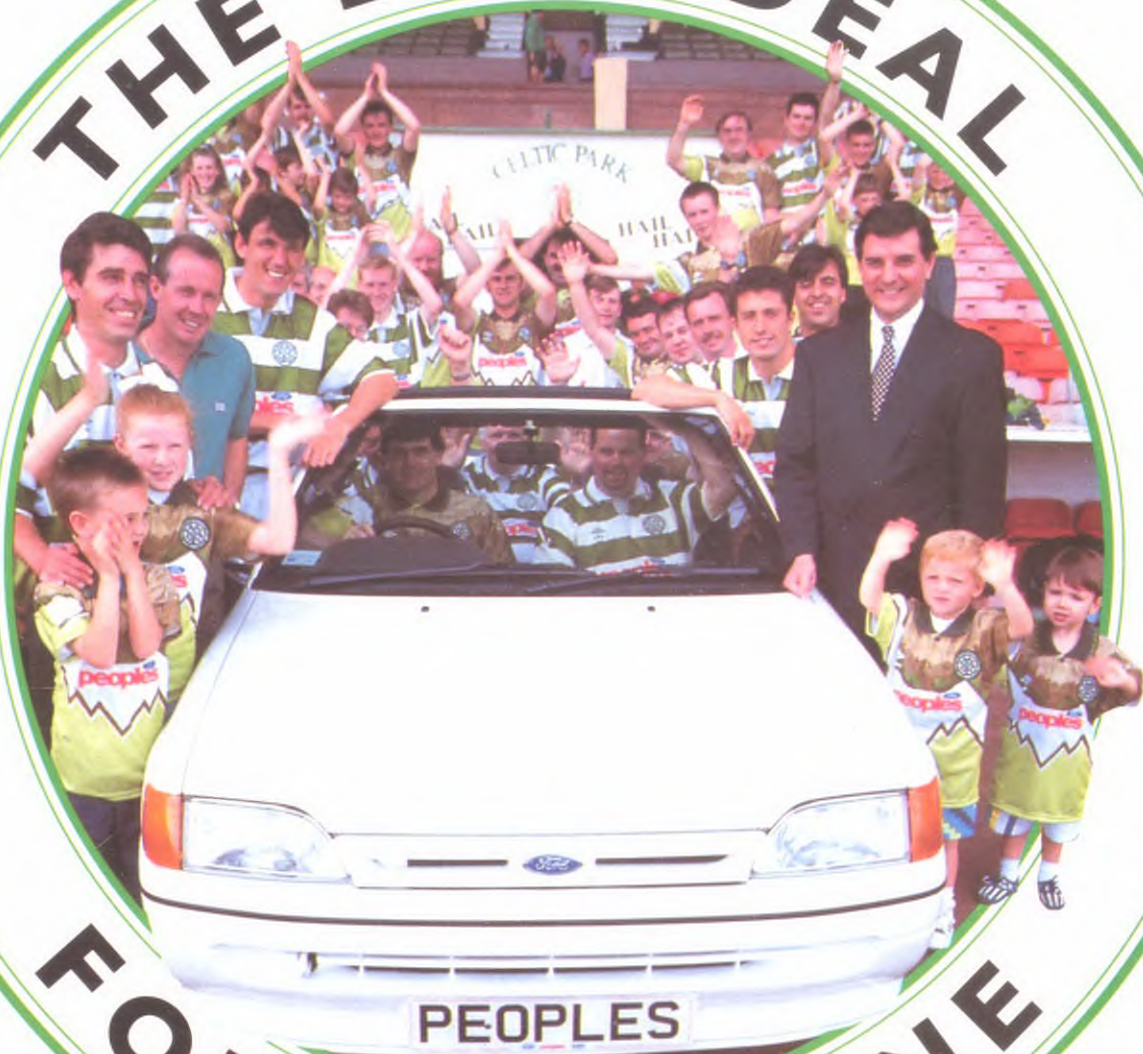

AS with my notes for the Rangers' programme four days ago, I have had to compile this address without the benefit of commenting on recent matches.

I can only say that with our form in the lead-up to the holiday period I was hopeful that we would be entering today's match with a real chance of challenging for the leadership of the league.

At time of writing Hearts are league leaders and as such must command our upmost respect. After they defeated us at Tynecastle in November I stated that I believed they had the quality to go all the way in the title race.

Their form since that match would only seem to confirm this and manager Joe Jordan certainly has his men playing in a way that seems to suit their strengths.

He has been able to field a settled side for the greater part of the season and there has been great vigour, enthusiasm, and very importantly plenty of skill in the performances of the Edinburgh men this term. Unquestionably, they

thoroughly deserve top spot in the league.

I only hope we can repeat the result we achieved against them on their last visit here — while, at the same time, producing a better quality display — and that this sees us finish a vital period of the league programme in some style.

Many people were surprised that when I took up office here I stated my belief that a trophy could be captured in my first season in the job.

However nothing has happened in the intervening months to change my mind though undoubtedly a lot will depend on games I do not know the outcome of at time of writing.

Our target in the games over the holiday period was to keep in touch with that aim. It was my job to make sure that is what happened and I believe in the players' ability to have done so.

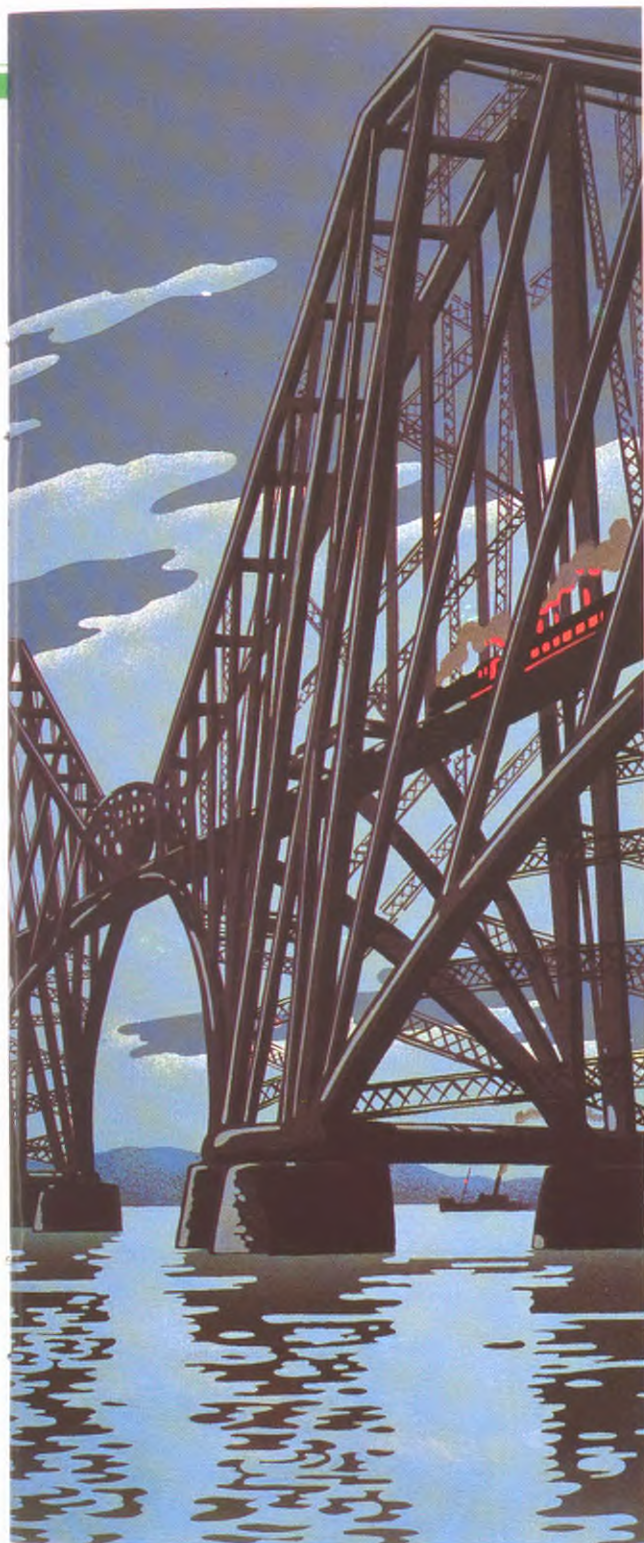
