DUNDEE'S last visit to Celtic Park for a Scottish Cup tie was on February 6, 1978 when they came up against Celtic in a real goalscoring mood.

Tommy Burns delighted the vast majority of the 22,000 crowd when he put Celtic ahead with a splendid goal. However, slack covering at a free kick allowed Eric Schaedler to run 40 yards to a through pass and score from close range.

Then six minutes from half time Roddy MacDonald restored Celtic's lead. In 48 minutes, Alan Sneddon, making his first team debut, placed a beautiful ball in front of George McCluskey to score number three. Tom McAdam scored the fourth in the 50th minute from a Roy Aitken pass then Alan Sneddon again made the opening for George McCluskey to make it five.

Alfie Conn set up Tom McAdam to score number six. Then with just nine minutes left, George McCluskey ran through the Dundee defence to complete his hat-trick and make it 7-1. The teams were:

CELTIC: Latchford, Sneddon, Burns, Munro, MacDonald, Aitken, Glavin, Edvaldsson, McCluskey, McAdam, Conn. Subs: Wilson, Craig.

DUNDEE: Donaldson, Caldwell, Schaedler, Shirra, McPhail, Philip, McDougall, Sinclair, Pirie, Williamson, Scott. Subs: Redford, McKinnon.

Other cup meetings include a 2-1 victory for Dundee on January 25, 1947 at Dens Park, Celtic gaining revenge nearly 20 years later when they met at Dens Park again on February 23, 1966 winning by 2-0. Hampden Park was a regular meeting place during the 70s. The first was on March 14, 1970 Celtic winning 2-1.

On February 26, 1972 at Celtic Park, Celtic won comfortably by 4-0. The following season in the semi finals the first game ended 0-0. In the replay Celtic won 3-0 after extra time.

On April 3, 1974 at Hampden Park in the semi finals again, Celtic won 1-0. For the third year in a row they met at Hampden Park in the semi final Celtic making it three victories in a row with another 1-0 victory. They missed each other in 1976 but met at Hampden Park in the semi final on March 30, 1977. A victory for Celtic by two goals to nil.

FACT FILE ON . . .

DUNDEE

TOM CARSON — Signed at the start of the season from Dumbarton, Tom is a big, strong and reliable keeper. Played 22 times this season.

BOBBY GEDDES — Asked for a transfer earlier in the season because he was unable to command a place in the first team. Bobby has only made 11 appearances this season including the last League games here when Celtic put five past him.

GEORGE McGEACHIE — George has been at Dens Park since 1977 having signed from Bo'ness United. He has been used in central defence and midfield in the past but this season he has turned out 33 times at right-back.

TOM MCKINLAY — Tosh signed for Dundee in 1981 from Celtic Boys' Club. He has lived up to expectations, developing into one of the most skilful full-backs in the Premier League. He has been capped at Youth and Under-21 level. He has made 30 appearances and scored one goal this season.

JOHN McCORMACK — John arrived at Dens Park in a straight swap which took ex-Celt Peter Mackie to St Mirren. He started the season at centre-half but at the turn of the year moved to midfield. He has only missed two games and has scored four times this season.

JIM SMITH — Joined Dundee in 1980 from Greenock Juniors. Jim is a tall, determined and skilful central defender and has formed a good partnership with Bobby Glennie. He has made 16 appearances and scored once this season.

BOBBY GLENNIE — Bobby is the second longest serving player at Dens — having been signed from Aberdeen in 1978. He has served as club captain in previous seasons and is a tough tackling no-nonsense type of player. Bobby has only missed three matches this season.

RAY STEPHEN — Ray has developed into a skilled midfield or forward man since his first appearance during the club's promotion

surge of 1980-81. Scorer of the first goal in Dundee's 2-0 victory over Celtic in February. He has made 32 appearances and scored eight goals this season.

JOHN BROWN — Signed for Dundee from Hamilton Accies in 1984 for £50,000. John has had rave reports this season for his performances in midfield and has scored vital goals including the winner against Rangers in the previous round of the 'Scottish', and the equaliser last Saturday. He has made 30 appearances and scored nine goals this season.

GRAEME HARVEY — Graeme joined Dundee in January in a straight swap, with Colin Harris going to Hibs. He made his debut at Ibrox and scored his first goal for Dundee the following week against Hearts in a 3-3 draw. He has gone on to make nine appearances and scored two goals.

ROBERT CONNOR — Joined Dundee from Ayr United during the close season. Robert is a left sided midfielder man and has adapted well to Premier League football. He has only missed two games this season and has scored twice.

ALBERT KIDD — Arrived at Dens Park in 1981 from Motherwell after spells with Brechin and Arbroath. Albert is finding it hard to keep a regular place in the side resulting in him only starting in 12 matches and he has been on the bench for 13. He has scored three goals this season.

LEX RICHARDSON — Lex joined Dundee in a straight swap which took Eric Sinclair to Love Street. He is another unable to get a regular first team place having only played five times from the start but he has been listed 17 times as substitute. He has scored once this season.

WALKER McCALL — Much travelled Walker signed for Dundee in 1983 from Hong Kong club South China. The big striker is struggling this season and has been in and out of the side starting in 14 games and nine as substitute. Walker has scored three goals this season.

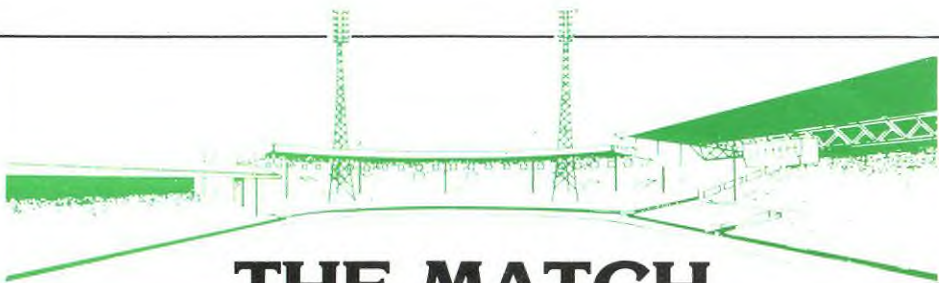

THIS TIME LAST YEAR ...

... we played Aberdeen at Celtic Park in the re-arranged League Cup semi-final second leg. With a goalless first leg at Pittodrie the tie was there for the taking for either side.

The first half was typical of recent Celtic-Aberdeen matches with most of the play taking place in the midfield area. Both teams played the first 45 minutes with four men in the middle of the park and this resulted in few scoring opportunities for either side.

At the start of the second period Davie Hay sent on Davie Provan to replace Graeme Sinclair and this gave Celtic some much-needed width up front. After 54 minutes the only goal of the game was scored when Tommy Burns was tripped by Doug Bell and the referee immediately pointed to the penalty spot. Mark Reid grabbed the ball but had to wait some minutes as the Aberdeen players protested. This didn't bother Mark as he placed the ball on the spot and then drove it into the back of the net to put us into the final.

After this Celtic went from strength to strength and the only time the Dons looked like scoring was with three minutes remaining when Pat Bonner pulled off a great save from a John Hewitt volley. So the final and aggregate score was CELTIC 1, ABERDEEN 0, and Rangers awaited us in the ninth Old Firm League Cup final.

LOOKING BACK



FIVE YEARS AGO ...

Saturday, March 8, 1980

ALTHOUGH the game wasn't a particularly good one Celtic looked to be on top right from the beginning and in the early stages Jim Casey, deputising for the suspended Roy Aitken, had a couple of shots saved by Roy Baines.

This seemed to shake the Celtic team into action because within a minute they had taken the lead. Murdo MacLeod was the man who made the goal with a beautifully flighted ball to the far post for Jim Casey to head home. The second goal came just one minute before half-time and a super goal it turned out to be. Davie Provan started the move with a long pass from midfield to Alan Sneddon on the right wing. The full back cut it back to Jim Casey and he threaded a neat ball through to John Doyle on the bye line. John rounded two defenders before cutting back a perfect ball for George McCluskey to crack into the net. The second half was just a few minutes old when McLaughlin brought George McCluskey down in the box and from the resultant penalty kick Bobby Lennox hit a post.



TEN YEARS AGO ...

Saturday, March 8, 1975

CELTIC were on Cup duty away from home against Dumbarton. The teams were: DUMBARTON: Williams; Muir and Watt; C. McAdam, Cushley and Ruddy; Cook and Bourke; F. McAdam; Graham and Wallace. Subs. Celtic won through by a Ronnie Glavin goal and a Paul Wilson goal against a Tom McAdam counter for the home side. The following Wednesday, the *Celtic View* wrote: Celtic face one of their toughest tests of the season

All this adds up to a tense, action packed match — and one Celtic MUST win if they're to keep in contention for the championship. There will be no team announced until just before tonight's kick-off. This will give some of the key players who look knocks in Saturday's gruelling cup-tie with Dumbarton time to recover. Saturday's game left a lot to be desired but the Celts did enough to qualify for the semi-final of the Cup.



FIFTEEN YEARS AGO ...

Saturday, March 7, 1970

LINE-UPS for the league match were: DUNDEE UTD: Mackay; Rolland and Cameron; Gillespie, Smith and Henry; Wilson and Scott; Gordon, Mitchell and Dunne. Twelfth man W. Smith. CELTIC: Williams; Hay and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Hood; Wallace; Callaghan and Lennox. Twelfth man Auld.

Celtic's 2-0 win, both goals by Billy McNeill, strengthened their position at the top of the league. Within the next few days work started on the terracing of the new east enclosure. The only bleak spot on the Celtic horizon was the defeat of the reserves at Celtic Park by Aberdeen on the same afternoon in the quarter-final of the Second Eleven Cup. The Celtic team which went down by 3-0 was: Fallon; Craig and Gorman; Dalglish, Connelly and Cattanach; McBride and Davidson; Quinn; Macari and Wilson. Twelfth man White.

IT'S A FACT

- ☆ THIS is the 21st Scottish Cup tie between Celtic and Dundee. Of the previous 20 we have won 14, drawn 4 and lost 2, scoring 42 goals and conceding 12.
- ☆ **DUNDEE have won the Scottish Cup only once and that was in 1910 when they beat Clyde 2-1. They have appeared in 3 other finals losing to Celtic in 1925 by 2-1, Motherwell in 1952 by 4-0 and Rangers in 1964 by 3-1.**
- ☆ CELTIC and Dundee were drawn against each other no fewer than 7 times between 1970 and 1978, including 5 semi-finals. Celtic won every tie.
- ☆ **DUNDEE have only ever beaten us twice before in this competition; in 1894-95 when they beat us 1-0 at Dens Park and in 1946-47 when they beat us 2-1 again at Dens.**
- ☆ THE last time we met Dundee in the Scottish Cup before Saturday was in 1978 when we won 7-1 at Celtic Park, our biggest Scottish Cup win over them.

It was the same score at 3-2 when Falkirk were our visitors in the Cup a week ago tonight and happily we were winners again.

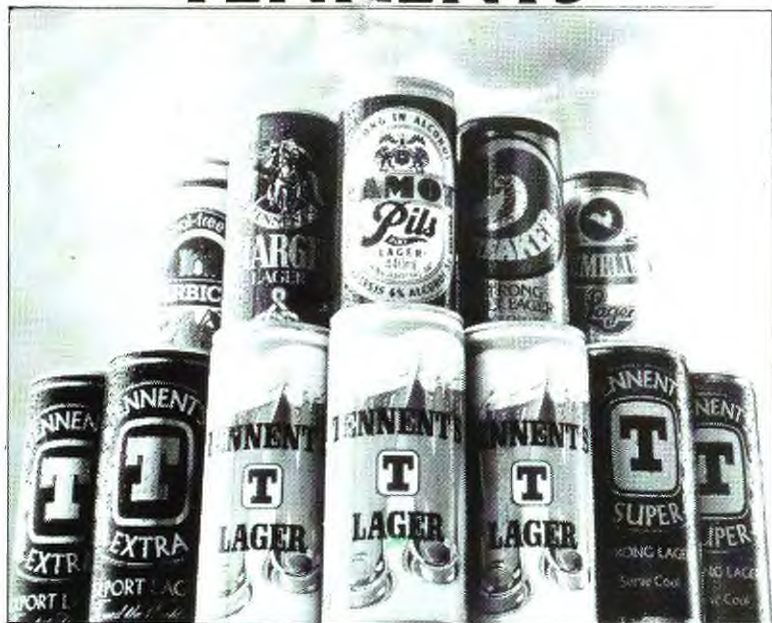

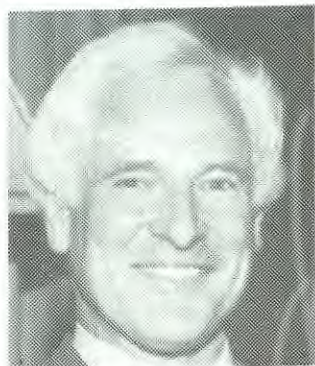
