A PREVIOUS MEETING

EACH of the teams in the First Division having played four games, when Dundee United visited Celtic Park on October 5, 1968 they came as league leaders with full points. With five points from two victories and a draw, Celtic were in sixth place.

The sides lined up as: **CELTIC:** Simpson, Craig, Gemmell, Murdoch, McNeill, Brogan, Johnstone, Wallace, Chalmers, McBride, Hughes. **DUNDEE UNITED:** McKay, Rolland, J. Cameron, Gillespie, Smith, Wood, Hogg, Reid, K. Cameron, Mitchell, Wilson.

Three days earlier, at Celtic Park, Celtic had overcome a 2-0 first leg defeat by beating St. Etienne 4-0 to progress to the next round of the European Cup and a two leg tie with Red Star Belgrade.

The winning habit continued in the league meeting with Bobby Murdoch and Tommy Gemmell scoring to no reply by the visitors.

In the league meeting at Tannadice on January 18 later in the season Celtic won 3-1 as they swept towards the league title.

From the Manager...

Like ourselves, Dundee United have had good spells and as recently as Wednesday night had one of their poorer games. We can be sure, however, that they will raise their game for coming to Celtic Park.

At the time of writing I had not yet decided on a team line-up, that will come later in the week, but Davie Provan is the only player who is not available for selection.

Young midfielder Tony Shepherd has gone to Norwich on loan, while Paul Chalmers has returned from his period with Bradford.

WE would ask supporters who are sitting at the very back of the upper stand to leave via the exits at the top of the stand and thereby lessen the number of people leaving through the mid-stand exits.

Dundee United's season so far

UNITED'S league season started at Ibrox on August 10, in the worst possible way with a 1-0 defeat, then it took a 1-1 draw with Aberdeen before they recorded their first league win, a 2-0 victory in the Dundee derby at Tannadice on August 24.

Three days earlier they had won by the same score away from home when they put Alloa Athletic out of the League Cup. Eamonn Bannon and Richard Gough had scored in that victory and Gough was on the scoresheet again in another 2-0 League Cup victory this time he was joined by Ian Redford as they disposed of Clydebank at Tannadice.

Back in league action on the last day of August, a John Clark goal was enough to give United full points against Motherwell at Fir Park.

In September, United played six games in three different competitions. They won three of them and lost three. The first victory was in the League Cup when Ralph Milne scored twice to knock out St. Mirren who had replied once. Next Clydebank collected no points from a league visit to Tannadice when Sturrock and Milne goals gave United a 2-1 victory.

A league defeat followed at the hands of Hearts at Tynecastle, then it was into the UEFA Cup and a 5-2 away victory to Bohemians through a Sturrock hat-trick and two by Bannon.

The scheduled league match with Celtic at Tannadice on September 21 was cancelled, so United's next match was the first leg of the League Cup semi-final when they lost 1-0 at home to Aberdeen. The Dons recorded victory by the same margin at home on October 9 to progress to the final.

September closed with a 1-0 defeat at the hands of St. Mirren in a league match at Love Street. Scoring four goals in the first five days of October, United drew both of their matches, each ending 2-2, to go through to the next round of the UEFA Cup with a 7-4 aggregate score and collect a league point in a home meeting with Hibs.

After their exit from the League Cup, United hosted a league meeting with Rangers and an Eamonn Bannon penalty goal could only earn them one point. Seven days later, Sturrock and Redford scored at Pittodrie, but the home side scored three times to deny United any points.

On October 23, United beat Varder Skopje 2-0 at Tannadice and completed the task two weeks later when a Paul Hegarty goal gave them an away leg 1-1 draw and took them into the UEFA Cup third round draw.

Between these ties United came to Celtic Park and won 3-0 through Davie Dodds first goal of the season and two from Bannon. Then a Richard Gough goal gave them an equal share of the goals and the points in a league match with Hearts at Tannadice.

Next followed four victories, three in the Premier League and one in the first leg of their UEFA Cup third round tie. Motherwell at Tannadice and Dundee at Dens Park each fell to 3-0 scores, then goals by Milne and Dodds gave United a 2-1 win at Clydebank.

Neuchatel Xamax provided the opposition in the UEFA Cup and managed to score at Tannadice in reply to goals by Dodds and Redford. Two weeks later United lost 3-1 away from home in a game that went to extra time to go out of the UEFA Cup.

Another 1-1 draw with Rangers followed on December 14, then a Bannan penalty and a goal from Sturrock gave United a 2-1 victory over Aberdeen at Tannadice and two days later they picked up two more points beating Celtic through another Bannan penalty.

The old year ended with a no-scoring draw with Dundee on December 28 at home. For their first game of the new year, United were at home again on January 4 to beat Celtic 4-2 through two

goals from Dodds, a Bannan penalty and a goal by youngster Kevin Gallacher.

Seven days later Tynecastle was the scene for a 1-1 draw with Hearts, Bannan scoring again. Clydebank were on the receiving end a 4-0 scoreline at Tannadice the following Saturday when Bannan, Dodds, Hegarty and Redford each found the net.

United's Scottish Cup campaign started on January 25 and for the second week in a row they romped to a 4-0 victory, this time Tom Coyne with two, Redford and Bannan from the penalty spot defeating Morton.

The four weeks of February saw United in action six times, with four league matches and a Scottish Cup tie that went to a replay. In the league they drew 1-1 with St. Mirren in Paisley, beat Hibs 4-0 at Tannadice, drew 1-1 at home to Rangers and beat Hibs 1-0 at Easter Road.

Their Scottish Cup tie with Kilmarnock on February 15 ended 1-1 at Tannadice, four days later a Paul Sturrock goal gave United victory at Rugby Park.

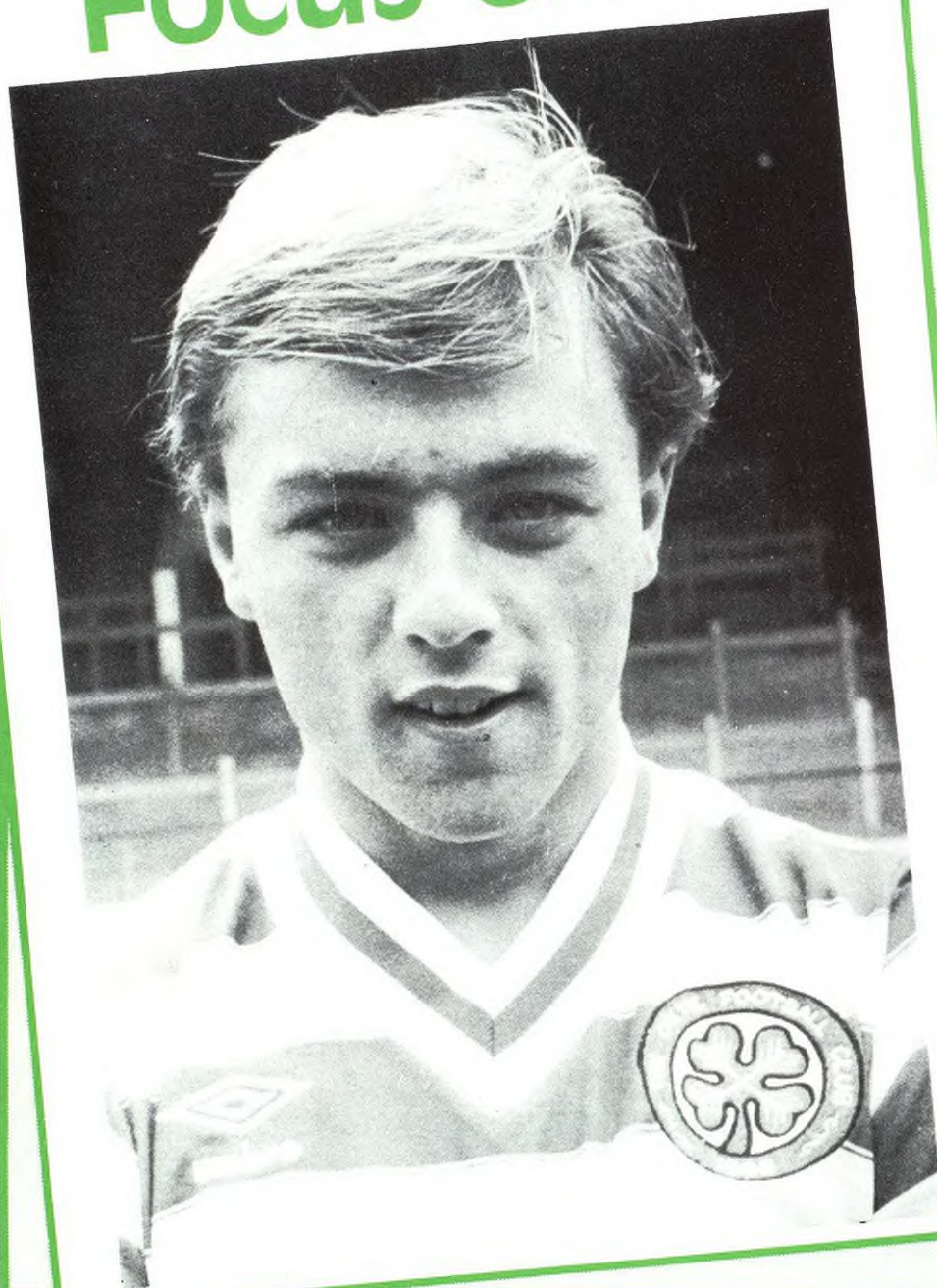
