## FROM THE MANAGER'S CHAIR

A WARM welcome to the final Old Firm match of the season and one I think everyone at Celtic Park has been looking forward to for some time.

For our last two meetings were sources of severe disappointment, as on both occasions we lost despite playing really well.

Ultimately we only had ourselves to blame for both defeats, for though we created many opportunities, we were punished for failing to convert them.

It goes without saying that Rangers, our opponents today, are a formidable outfit, something they have demonstrated by their performances in all competitions this season.

However we are very determined to prove to everyone that we can overcome them and I feel we owe our supporters a victory over our greatest rivals, in what has not been the best of seasons by this club's standards.

We set ourselves up nicely for today's clash with a well deserved victory over Hibernian in midweek and go into the game on the back of a nine game unbeaten league run.

The two Old Firm defeats we've suffered this season have followed on the back of damaging losses – to Borussia Dortmund in November, and Dundee United on Boxing Day – so I would like to view the midweek win as a positive omen.

This victory is one of four straight wins we have notched up in the past four weeks.

I believe such a run can be a platform for us to produce a confident display today.

One which will bring the kind of result we have deserved against Rangers through our performances in Old Firm games this term.

As regards Tuesday night's win, we again came up against a team intent on sitting back and hitting us on the break at Celtic Park.

Some quality play in a spell in the second half brought two well taken goals from Andy Payton in quick succession and that very good period brought us a thoroughly deserved two points.


