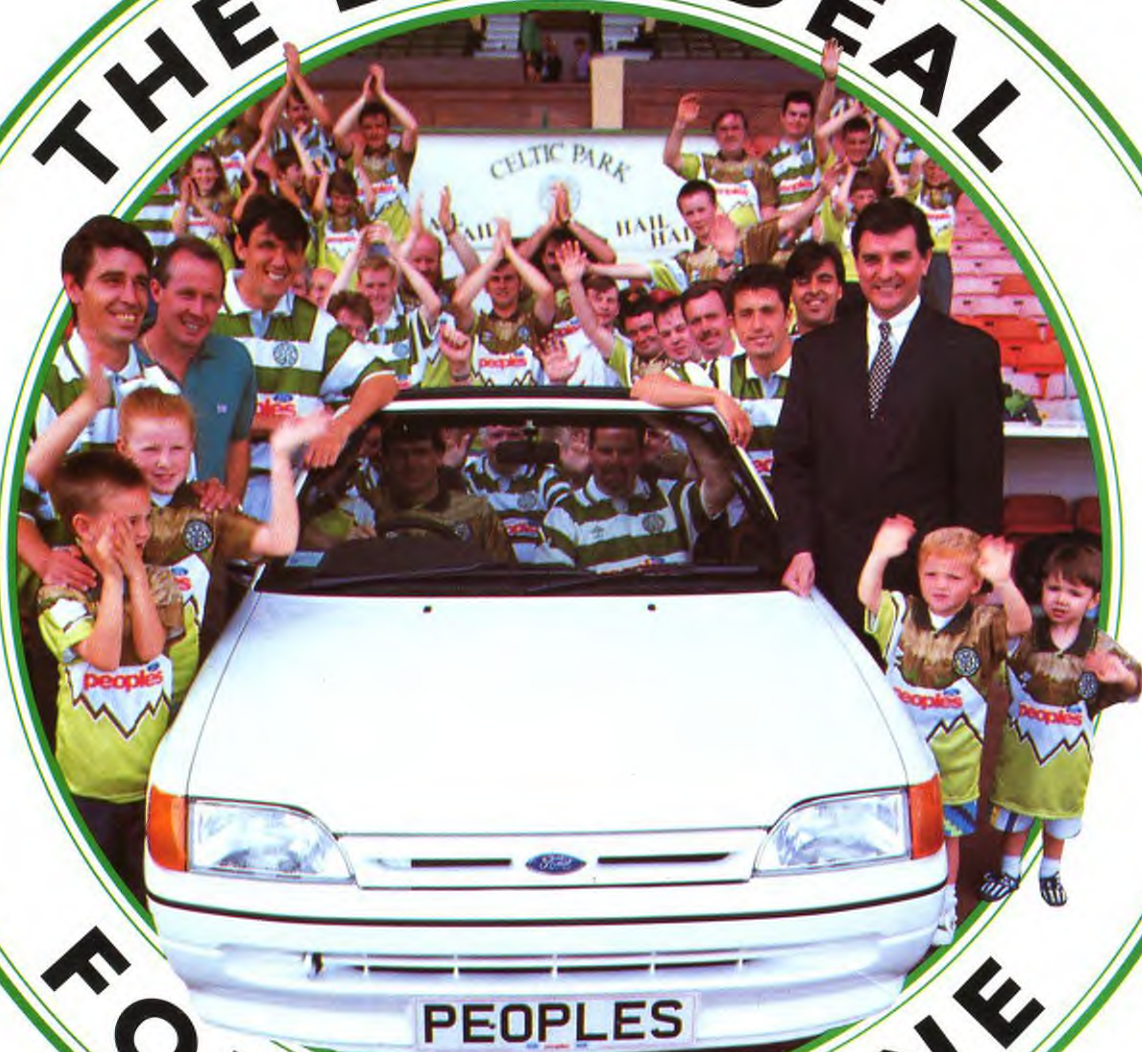

OUR matches against Dundee United this season have been, without exception, tremendously enjoyable footballing encounters.

However, it is unlikely that Jim McLean and his men will share my enthusiasm for our meetings over the past eight months.

As we have claimed five points from a possible six in our three league meetings and eliminated United from the Scottish Cup, the Tannadice side will be badly wanting to turn the tables on us.

It is our firm intention, though, to make it seven points from a possible eight this afternoon and keep up the pressure in the race for second spot.

Indeed, after our fine win last Saturday, we have even given ourselves an outside chance of the championship and for any hope of this we must win every game from now to the end of the season.

Of course, our main trophy hopes rest on the Tennents Scottish Cup semi-final against Rangers on Tuesday and, with this match in mind, I will probably make changes to last week's starting line-up.

I will do so without trepidation because I have complete confidence in every member of the first team squad.

It has been very pleasing for me that, whatever way I have shuffled the side to cope with the playing conditions in specific matches, the contribution of every

player chosen has been tremendous.

How well the team has been playing is perhaps best demonstrated by the fact that this week we had no fewer than 11 Celts on international duty.

I believe it is a very great honour to represent your country. That is certainly the way I felt about playing for mine, and I would never stand in the way of any player in my charge receiving international recognition.

Undoubtedly, Tuesday night's semi-final is a very big match for us and one everyone at the club is looking forward to.

We received an enormous psychological boost from beating Rangers so convincingly last Saturday.

Of course, the note of caution is that cup matches are one-offs but we will still be looking to repeat our Ibrox display of 11 days ago.

Sadly, I feel I must condemn, in the strongest terms possible, the acts of vandalism which took place in the Broomloan Road Stand last week.

Such actions do nothing but tarnish the good name of the club and in this instance, detracted from an excellent win.

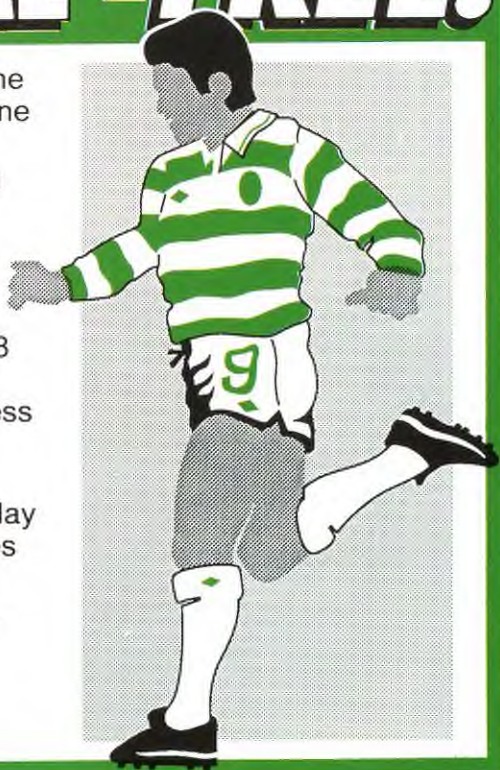

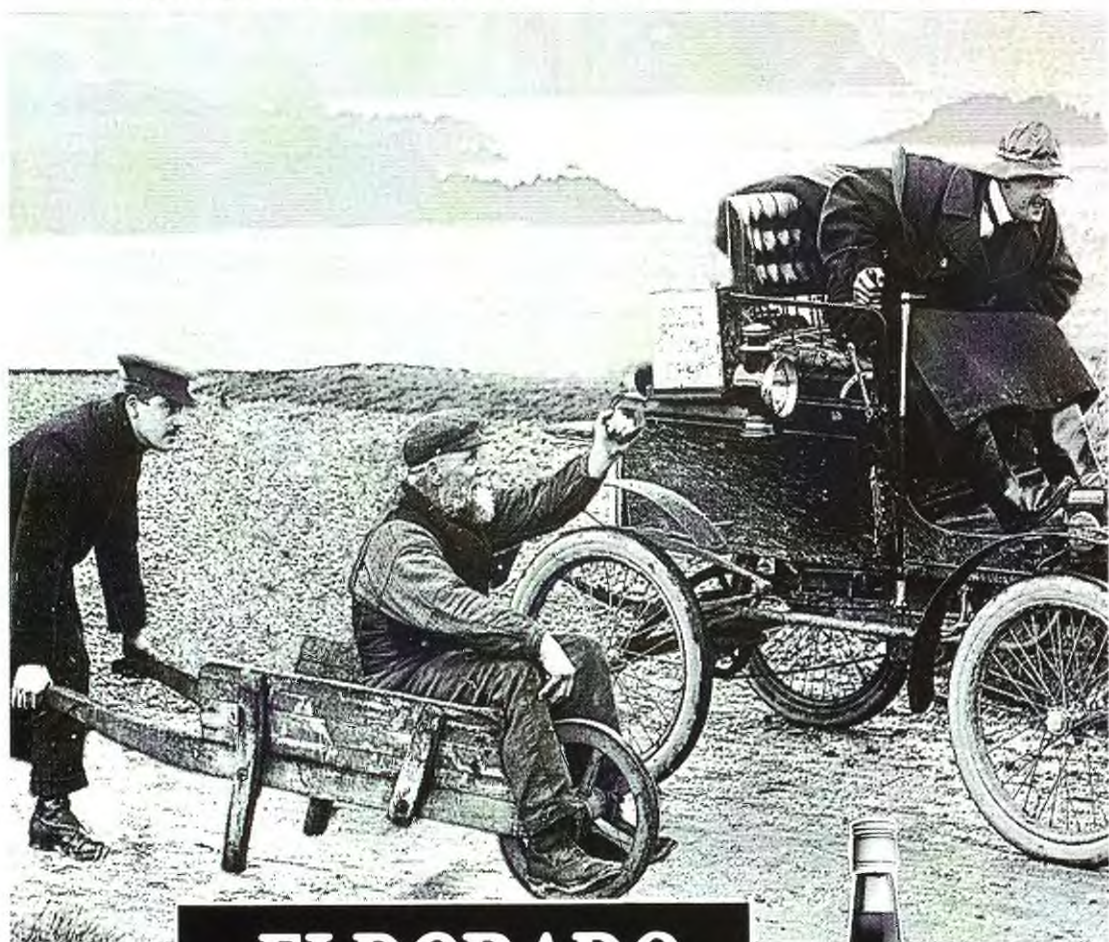

**IF, by Tony Mowbray's own admission, the early stages of his Celtic career have been something of a "stop-go" affair, recent weeks have seen the emphasis switch firmly to the green light mode.**

His excellent performance last Saturday, in a near-faultless display from Celtic's back four, confirmed that the rugged defender is coming good and ready to prove himself a shrewd acquisition for the club.

Now with his, well-documented injury problems firmly behind him, it is with a great sense of relief that Tony reflects on his first five months as a Celt.

"You could say that I didn't exactly enjoy the ideal start to my Celtic Park career," Tony concedes.

"When you come to a new club you are keen to show people what you are capable of but I have been largely denied the opportunities to do so.

"I've only played in ten matches in almost five months and these have been in clusters.

"I played a mere two matches before suffering an achilles injury and missing out for the next six then, on returning, managed to play in only three games before being sidelined again for eight games with an ankle knock.

"So it is certainly great to be playing again and to put several months of frustration behind me," he states.

However, he does admit that the extended period he spent on the sidelines has not been without its effect.

"I must say that at the moment I still feel as if I'm not 100% fit.

"In view of the number of weeks I was out and unable to

train, it shouldn't really be surprising that I feel as if my season just beginning.

"At the moment, I feel as if I'm chasing the game at times and not quite picking up the pace of matches as I would like.

"However, by playing regularly this will sort itself out, though it may be that I will reach peak fitness just as the season ends!" Mowbray smiles.

Tony, of course, is being rather hard on himself.

For there can be no doubt that the authority he demonstrated in helping shackle the Rangers strikeforce in last week's Old Firm game suggest he will be a crucial figure for the club between now and the end of the season.

Especially next Tuesday, when he looks set to take part in one of the biggest games of his professional career, as Celtic attempt to beat Rangers for the second time in 11 days and book their place in the Tennents Scottish Cup final.

"I'm really looking forward to it. It is the kind of game that no player needs to be motivated for," he says excitedly.

It is appropriate that Mowbray should be preparing to do his bit for Celtic in the club's biggest game of the season.

Because it is a peculiar quirk of fate that almost all the games the powerful centre-back has turned out in for the club have been against the top teams in the country.

"I've yet to play in an easy match!" he chirps, in response to this.

"Every game I've played, including the ones against what might be called 'lesser lights' such as Motherwell and Morton have been tough affairs," the 28-year-old claims.

## Successful

But ultimately successful ones, with the club on a winning run which stretches back to January 18.

This, he likes to think, has much of its foundation in solid defence, the team having conceded only three goals in its last 12 matches.

"No successful team lets goals in willy-nilly, and we certainly have not done so in recent months, clocking up an impressive number of clean sheets.

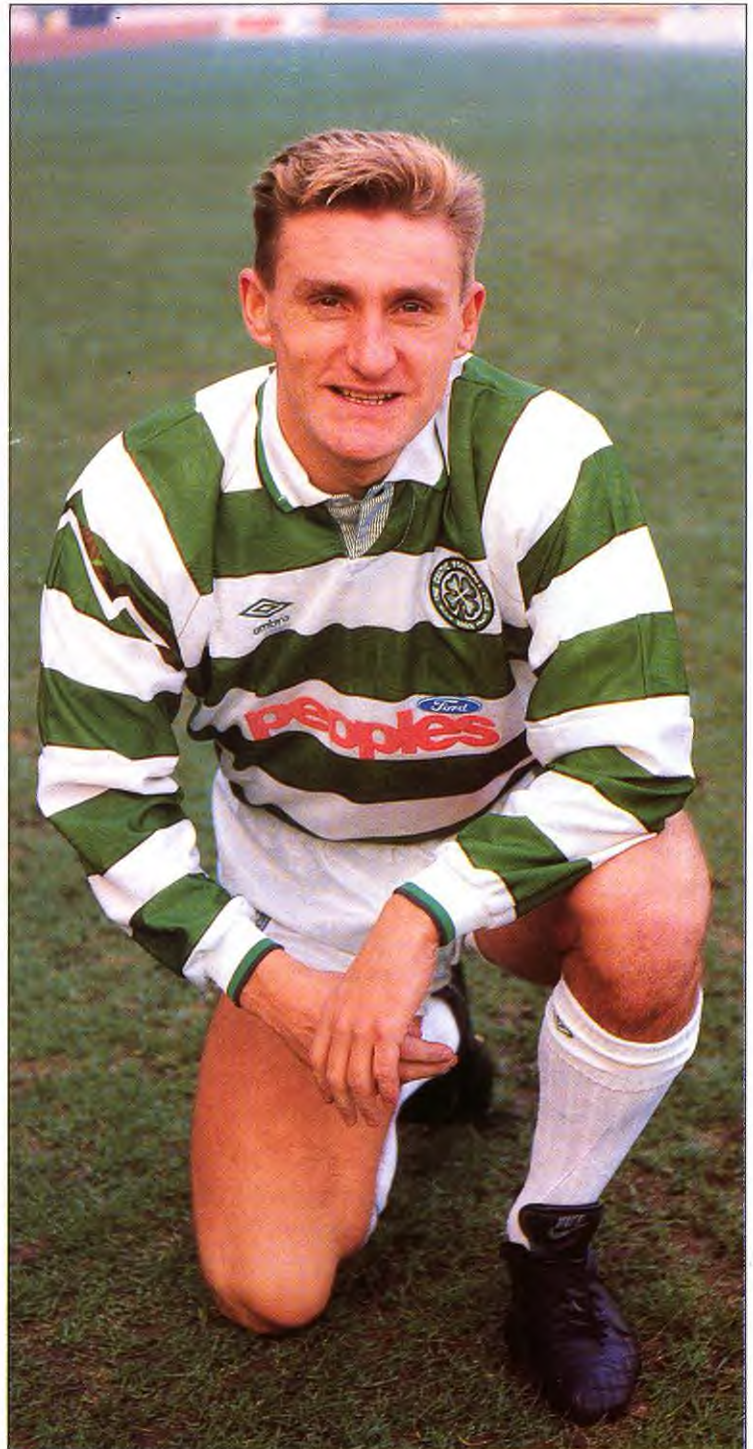
"I'd like to think the competition for places has been a factor in this.

## Qualities

"There is Derek Whyte, Gary Gillespie and me, all with our own individual qualities we can bring to a defence, vying for two positions.

"The games ahead will show whether then manager will continue to perm us on a game to game basis or opt to try a build-up a settled defensive partnership between two of us.

"It is a nice position for the boss to be in and, as long as it is a situation which keeps producing results, it is good for the club too," says the Saltburn-born Englishman.

# ABOUT TODAY'S GAME

■ **CELTIC** are just two short of 50 Premier Division goals against Dundee United at Celtic Park.

■ **IF** Celtic avoid defeat today it will be the first time since 1980/81 that they have remained unbeaten against United in the four league meetings.

That season Celtic won all four clashes.

■ **WITH** Celtic having won five points off United this season already, it is the first time since 1981/82 that they have come out on top in the four league meetings.

■ **TOMMY COYNE'S** goal against the Tannadice club on their visit here back in October, was Celtic's 100th league goal at Celtic Park against United.

■ **THE** highest goal aggregate for a season of Celtic and Dundee United matches could well be broken today.

The record stands at 15 in the first ever Premier Division season, but with 14 goals scored in the first three meetings this term that landmark could well change.

■ **CELTIC'S** highest goal total against United for a season could also be broken today.

At present it stands at 10 goals but in the three meetings so far they have netted nine goals.

■ **THE** average attendance of Celtic v Dundee United Premier Division matches at Celtic Park is a healthy 27,083. At Tannadice the average attendance is 15,189.

A HIGHLY successful youth policy is the foundation on which **Jim McLean** has built unprecedented success for Dundee United over the past couple of decades ... and the flow of accomplished young players shows no sign of abating.

The fact that no fewer than six Tannadice starlets have contributed to the success of Scotland's under-21 side in the European Championship is an indication of the young talent at McLean's disposal.

And it is worth noting for the future that a further clutch of United-bound youths were involved in the Scottish under-16 side's home and away wins over Bulgaria in their European Championship.

It could be argued that, as yet, great promise hasn't quite been turned into genuine achievement in terms of silverware for the club or senior international caps for United products, the masterful **Maurice Malpas** apart, since the heady days of the early 1980s.

However, stars in the current crop such as **Ray McKinnon**, **Duncan Ferguson** and unlucky leg break victim **Billy McKinlay** have the ability to make progress in that department possible.

Manager McLean's shrewd moves into the transfer market have resulted in the arrival of several quality performers from across Europe and even South America as well as Britain.

The involvement of **Dave Bowman** and **Jim McNally** — ironically signed from Nottingham Forest in a joint deal — in the midweek Scotland squad was evidence of the boss's acumen, as was **Mika-Matti Paatelainen's** in the opposition ranks.

Dutchman's **Guido van de Kamp's** attack of the jitters on United's last visit to Celtic Park on Scottish Cup duty has resulted in a first team return for the steady **Alan Main**, who has lost just two goals in the past five outings.

The 24-year-old former under-21 internationalist will make his 100th competitive appearance for the

## TODAY'S VISITORS

IT has been another season of promise-not-quite-fulfilled for Jim McLean's band of talented youngsters and dedicated pros ...

An improvement on fourth spot in the Premier Division looks to be beyond them and involvement in the Tennents Scottish Cup, a source of so much hope and ultimate agony in recent years, is no more than a fading memory.

And yet a fairly settled United side has enjoyed useful form in the past month, a 1-0 defeat inflicted by Alex MacDonald's Airdrie storm-troopers being the only blemish in a run of six games since Celtic eliminated the Tannadice side from the cup in a Parkhead thriller on February 11.

A 2-0 Pittodrie win over Willie Miller's Aberdeen meant that United finished with seven points out of eight in clashes between the sides now rather redundantly termed the "New Firm."

Perhaps the biggest source of satisfaction this term has been the continued development of Duncan Ferguson, the rangy and talented striker whose fine individual display in Scotland under-21s' midweek heroics confirmed the belief that the Stirling-born youngster is a quality full internationalist in the making.

club since joining from Elgin City if he turns out today.

Regulars in the full-back berths in recent weeks have been Scotland under-21 star **Alex Cleland** and Dutchman **Freddy van der Hoorn**.

Just 21, Cleland has made some 80 first team appearances for the club while van der Hoorn, 28, has been a revelation in his 2½ seasons at Tannadice.

A former team-mate of van de Kamp at BVV den Bosch, he operated on the right side of the defence to pick up old rival Hans Gillhaus in the game at Pittodrie last week but has generally been used on the left recently.

Equally comfortable in a sweeper role and capable of midfield duties too, he is typical of the versatility which abounds in United's ranks.

Another glowing example of that is Malpas, the 29-year-old Scotland regular. Widely recognised as a left-back, he has been playing in central defence recently for both club and country. A marvellous example of the one-club pro, he has made well over 500 appearances for United.

His regular partner in the centre recently has been 23-year-old **Brian Welsh**, scorer of his side's goal in the 1-1 December draw between the clubs at Tannadice. Never a long term fixture in the United side, he has played in the past six games.

**Ian Grant Johnson**, 20 last week, has retained a place in midfield since making his debut against Dunfermline on March 7 and has made enough of an impression to suggest that his run could be extended to the end of the season.

The recent return of Jim McNally and a safe passage through his Scotland debut for Dave Bowman could spell a switch to the bench for young Johnson, though.

Former Celt McNally, now 28 and intermittently involved in the senior Scottish squad, was out for a few weeks with injury and suspension but is now ready to add to his over 250 appearances for the Tannadice club.

Bowman hasn't been quite as big a hit at United since the pair moved back north together but his first taste of senior international

involvement at the age of 28 this week was deserved reward for great consistency over the past year.

Also likely to feature in midfield in the gifted Ray McKinnon. Out of the picture at the start of the campaign because of pre-season tour indiscretions, his quality couldn't be ignored for long and his presence has been all the more vital in the absence of Billy McKinlay.

Powerful Finn Mika-Matti Paatelainen has enjoyed something of a renaissance since the turn of the year. The 25-year-old has been fielded on the left wing recently and has often been an unsettling influence on Celtic defences. Scored United's goal in the February cup-tie between the clubs.

**Duncan Ferguson** and Argentinian **Victor Ferreyra** have formed the regular strike force in recent weeks, a useful blend of target man and nimble incisive striker.

Twenty-year-old Ferguson's talents are not limited to those of the average 6'3" centre-forward, though. He is mobile and has excellent touch on the ground. One of the best prospects in Scotland.

Ferreyra's impact on Scottish football has not been great but he has undoubted ability and indicated recently that he is finding his feet.

Such is the size and versatility of the United squad that McLean is always able to surprise everyone with a team selection and there are several others who could feature today.

Defenders **John Clark** and the evergreen **Dave Narey**, midfielders **Gary Bolland**, **Michael O'Neill** and **Allan Preston**, winger **John O'Neil** and strikers **Darren Jackson** and **Paddy Connolly**, scorer of four goals in a midweek reserve game, are just a few effective options the manager could use.

**It was 7.15 pm on a fine, early summer's evening.**

Hardly anyone walked the streets. The scene resembled one of those from a film of the aftermath of nuclear war.

No cars, no lorries, very few — empty — buses. Cats lay in the middle of the street, sunning themselves and licking their faces, puzzled by the lack of humans.

But behind curtains there was tension and gripping atmosphere. Kids were told to be quiet, uninterested adults had enough



appointed captain and led the team to the Coronation Cup in 1953 and a League Championship and Scottish Cup double the following year.

A cruel ankle injury shortened his playing career but he was kept at Celtic Park to bring on the youngsters.

In 1960 he became manager of Dunfermline Athletic, brought them success, moved on to Hibernian and then, in January 1965, the darkest of dark hours in Celtic's history, was recalled to Celtic Park.

It was odd that the funeral of Sir



sense to do the same, as televisions everywhere were shouted at.

"That must be full time now! Blow your whistle, referee!" were along the lines of what was bellowed in the direction of the square boxes.

Meanwhile, in the Stadio Nazionale in Lisbon, the cause of these goings on, the European Champions' Cup final between Celtic and Inter Milan, was nearing its conclusion.

The Celtic bench was tense, expectant and hushed. A figure got up and hobbled away, unable to take any more.

It was the very man responsible for it all. He would soon be a hero, a demi-god, a saint ... if only that referee would bring the match to an end!

Jock Stein had begun his footballing career with Albion Rovers in those grim war days and immediately after.

He then moved to Llanelli in Wales where his career seemed to be petering out until a surprise invitation to return to Scotland and play for Celtic was received.

Celtic was not Jock's original love but, as he was to say later, it became his greatest and most long-lasting.

He played well enough, although never a world-beating centre-half, and impressed everyone with his leadership ability.

So much so that he was

**Jock Stein was the figure behind the events in Lisbon. David W Potter is the man paying tribute.**

Winston Churchill had been held the previous Saturday for the circumstances of Stein's accession in 1965 were not entirely dissimilar to those of Churchill in 1940.

He was not necessarily the first choice of the establishment and pride had to be swallowed but he was clearly the man of destiny.

History has proved that in both cases.

The final whistle did go in Lisbon and Stein became a national celebrity overnight.

Although selflessly disclaiming credit, which he felt should go to the players, Jock must have known that without him there would have been no show.

His tactical knowledge, discipline based on respect rather than fear, his ability to motivate and get that little bit extra out of his players, were qualities second to none.

In more senses than one, he was a big man. In any conversation, on a television chat show or in a casual encounter on a train, Jock was the dominant figure.

He made his point forcibly, he could on occasion be vitriolic and fierce, yet his anger lacked any nastiness or bitterness.

Beneath it all lay a gentle, compassionate man.

The most obvious difference between Celtic pre-Stein and Celtic with Stein was that, when The Big Man was at the helm, the club

expected (and was expected by everyone else) to win.

This was largely due to Stein's excellent public relations, particularly where the Press was concerned.

He was not entirely immune from the persecution complex which has prevailed at Parkhead since 1888 but was shrewd enough to realise that, if he helped the Press, they would help him.

He held open days for the Press at Celtic Park, who naturally splashed their back pages, usually the week before the start of the season, with pictures of the super-fit and super-confident Celts.

Any newspaper short of a story would phone Jock and one would be available; anyone who wanted to could wander out to the east end on a Sunday and would find Jock ready and willing to talk to them.

He had the ability to knock Rangers off the back pages, as well as out of tournaments.

If he suspected that Rangers were going to dominate the Daily Express or the Daily Record one week, he could send the newspaper some story they would have to take.

Thus a generation began to grow up with the idea that Celtic on the back page and winning tournaments was the norm and that anything else was a deviation.

The nine-in-a-row sequence of League Championship wins will probably never be equalled.

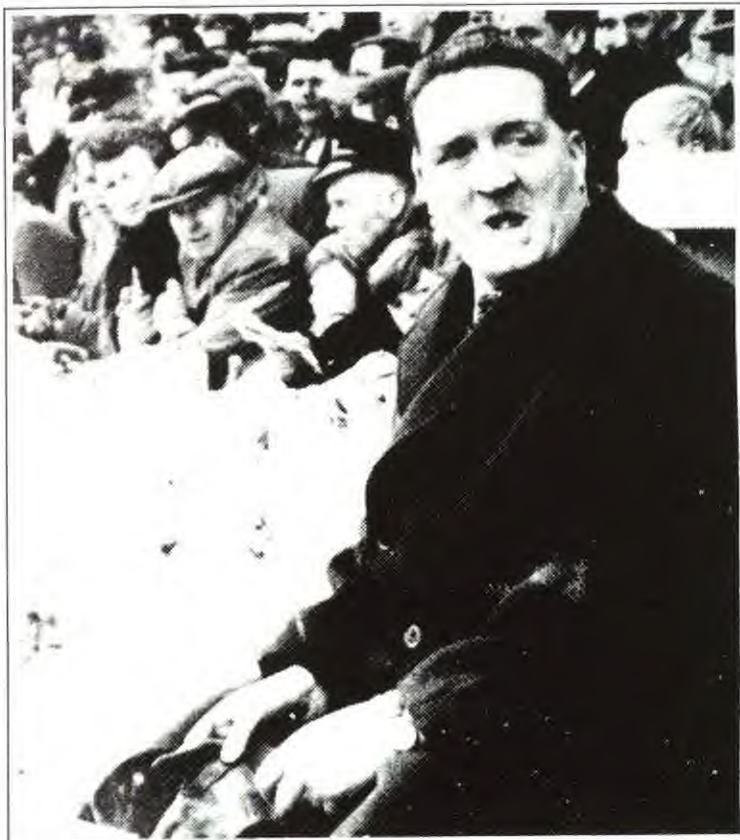
The greatness of this achievement lies in the undeniable fact that some of the teams, particularly in the latter years, were not necessarily championship-winning material.

That they did so was a tribute to Stein's ability to create among the players a self-fulfilling belief and, conversely, to convince the opposition, even Rangers sometimes, that they were defeated before they started.

And behind all that there was the human Stein.

The man who wept when he heard of the serious nature of a young player's injury; the man who sent a football to a seven-year-old boy with polio to encourage him to walk, run and re-develop his leg muscles.

This was also the man who took a



side of European Cup finalists to Fraserburgh to play a charity game for the dependents of fishermen who lost their lives.

Deeply conscious of his mining background, there was never anything snobbish about Stein.

"These people out there," he used to tell his players, "are the ones who matter."

So much did they matter that, on one cold winter's day when a game at Dens Park had been called off, the great Stein himself stood by the side of the road outside Glasgow to flag down supporters' buses.

At Arbroath one day, when a crowd of misguided youths in green scarves started chanting some nonsense about a paramilitary organisation, Stein himself jumped the fence, went in among them and told them to shut up.

On another occasion, a wayward

youth tried to invade the park only to be frog-marched back by a massive iron grip.

He died at Ninian Park, Cardiff on 10 September 1985, seconds after the full-time whistle which had seen Scotland well on their way to the Mexico World Cup.

The Tartan Army was hushed and, at every ground on the following Saturday, respects were paid to the great man.

At Parkhead, as one would expect, there was an eloquent and even tearful silence, but, more significantly, at Kilbowie Park, Clydebank where Rangers were the visitors, the boys in blue stood up and bowed their heads respectfully.

This man, you see, was good-enough and big enough to transcend sectarianism.

There will never be another Jock Stein.

# Reserve Scene...

**"SMALL of stature but has the skill to make the grade" — A quote from the penpic of young Craig Haldane.**

The youngster falls into the category which has, for decades, been the expected image of a typical Celtic winger.

At 5'7" tall, he certainly makes up for his lack of inches with a burst of speed which can fox defenders and a willingness to battle for the ball which belies his height.

Though he joined the groundstaff at the turn of the year, he actually made his Celtic debut while still on an S form.

He relates: "I started against Stranraer in the Reserve League West.

"It was a bit nerve-racking but I eventually settled in and enjoyed the experience."

His natural role is playing on the wing but that night he was fileded at left-back. How did that affect his performance?

"It was a bit shaky at the start but I was talked through the game and that helped a lot. Also, winning 6-1 was a bit of a boost, especially on your debut.

"The coaching at Celtic Park has helped me tremendously as well. The

difference between boys' club training and full-time training is like night and day.

"So dropping back from my preferred role on the left wing to full-back was made easier."

The winger played for Eastercraigs

before joining Celtic Boys' Club and has also won representative honours for East Kilbride Schools.

"I've played about 10 games for East Kilbride Schools but I've left school now so obviously that is in the past," relates Craig.

However, his full-time education finished, he now attends college on a day-release basis.

"Every Thursday, I go to the JCS College in Springburn," says Craig.

"I take Leisure and Recreation studies plus Health and Safety. At the end of the course, I hope to gain a City and Guilds certificate."

So what are his duties on the groundstaff at Celtic Park? "It's all the usual stuff like boot cleaning. But everybody has to start at the bottom and I don't mind it," insists the winger.

With six appearances so far in the Reserve League West, he is quick to point out that he is definitely looking for more and, on the subject of high and low points of a budding career, he says:

"I haven't had any low points yet but I am sure they will come. The highlight so far was playing in the Glasgow Cup final even though we lost out on winners' medals."

## ...Progress Report

Two days later, St Mirren came to Barrowfield with former Celts Lex Baillie, Mark Reid and Jim Beattie in their team.

On paper, the visiting side appeared strong but a young Celtic side took the honours scoring two first-half goals without reply. Gerry Britton and Brian McLaughlin scored the goals which earned Celts' first West win in four

games.

It was also the side's first clean sheet since November and only their fourth for the season, setting them up for the visit of Rangers on the Saturday.

However, two goals from John Spencer cancelled out a glorious third minute chip from Gerry Britton to give Rangers the points, albeit the scoreline couldn't dampen the spirits of the Celtic fans.

As Rangers' clincher crossed the line, news of Charlie Nicholas' goal at Ibrox came over the radio and Spencer turned, arms raised, to be greeted by hordes of celebrating Celtic fans... and a rather subdued Rangers end!



# Remember when...

**EXACTLY 50 years ago today, March 28 1942, Celtic were away to Hibs in Section two, match five of the mini-Leagues that used to constitute the first round of the League Cup.**

Believe it or not of the team of '42, they had already tied the section up with four wins out of four since February 28.

Queen's Park had been seen-off at Hampden 2-1 by two Frank Murphy goals, the second in the last minute; Hibernian, Matt Busby and all, had lost 4-2 at Parkhead and two weeks before the match in question, Johnny Divers scored just on the whistle's final peep to defeat Hamilton Acas 1-0 at Celtic Park.

Playing at centre that day was new recruit from Glasgow Perthshire, cleek-legged John Riley.

The papers said Johnny Crum was missed and Riley did not fit, so last week, just to show them, John hit four against Queen's Park in a 6-2 win.

Nevertheless, his stay at Parkhead was not to be long. He moved to Clyde in 1944 and on one bad day for Celtic, he and fellow-reject Hughie Long combined to tear their old team apart and make it the great Willie Miller's turn to pick the ball six time out of the net.

Celtic's team this day at Easter Road: James Culley; Bobby Hogg and Harry Dornan; Malky McDonald, Willie Corbett and Big Joe McLaughlan; Jimmy Delaney and Johnny Crum; John Riley; Johnny Divers and Frank Murphy.

The Hibs team is worth quoting because Willie McCartney set out to do for Hibs what had happened for Celtic in 1938.

There was an excitement about Hibs in 1942 which lasted well into the 1950s: Crozier; Davie Shaw

and Hall; Busby, Baxter and Sammy Kean; Gordon Smith and Johnny Cuthbertson; Willie Finnigan; Bobby Combe and Jimmy Caskie.

It was a great match of football and Celtic lost it 1-0 to a goal from that wily old fox Finnigan, 12 minutes before half-time.

Matt Busby says somewhere he never had to look for Willie Finnigan or Finnigan for him; they were locked-on to each other's passes and intentions with such a precision it was almost electronic.

Jimmy Delaney played despite his dodgy left arm which kept him out of the game from April 1939 to August 1941, still uninsured but he was here, there, everywhere, trying to salvage a point of lift Celtic to victory.

This was pre-Welfare State and if the limb went again medical treatment would cost a substantial sum.

The SFA would not cap him because no assurance company would take the risk.

Celtic supposedly had a gentleman's agreement; if there was a new break they would meet the hospital bills.

But Delaney was nothing if not a winner. The arm held and he went on to glory with Scotland in 1946, Manchester United in 1948 and Derry City in 1954 to crown his great days at Paradise.

By the way, that Celtic Park turf down there today is 100 years old

this month.

It was 100 years on March 19 last since Dartmoor old boy Michael Davitt bedded-down the sod of shamrock-bearing Donegal turf specially-imported to knit and prosper with the home element.

Wonderful games and equally memorable names have scarred that old pitch and yet every year thanks to such as Chief Groundsman John Hayes, Will Quinn or Charlie Docherty of today, we have a brand new bowling green each August!

It's a sobering thought that without the volunteers who created two Celtic Parks (the club was threatened with the law for improvements to the first), that is the emigrant Irishmen so expert at toil with barrow, shovel and spade, there would have been no Celtic FC in 1892, 1942 or 1992.

The club belongs to them.

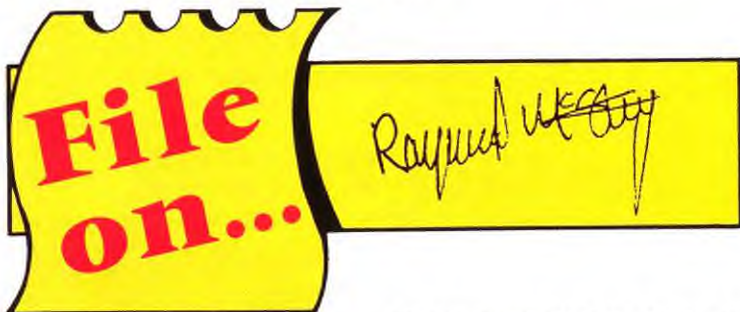
