

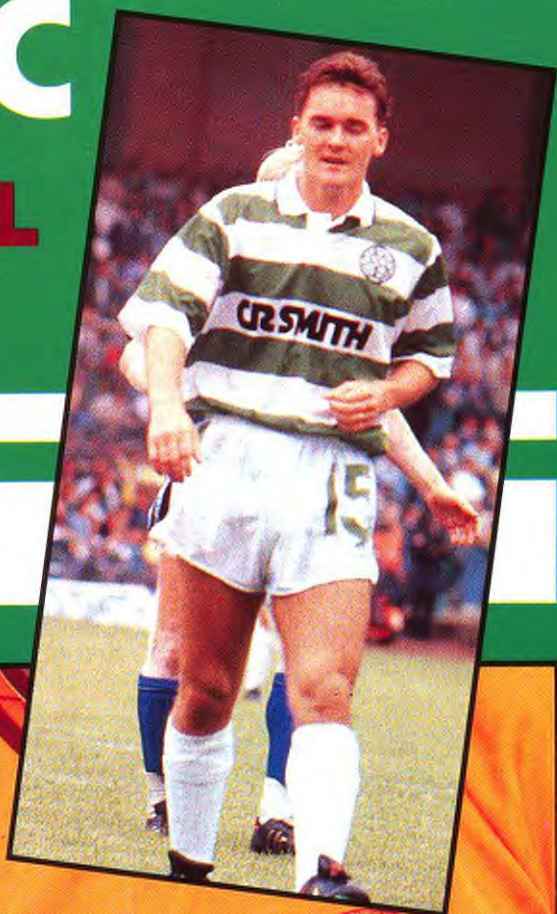

# HELP US REACH TWIN TARGETS

WE approach today's Premier Division meeting with Motherwell as the first of a two-legged game ... in which we aim to do well in both!

To achieve that target, we will need the full backing and participation of our supporters.

Up to this point, their support has been excellent but it has also been easy as the team has provided the lead on the pitch with a sequence of excellent results, the last two of them in that special Old Firm atmosphere.

Now the players and I are looking for the fans to lift us for the visit of Motherwell, a game which many will inevitably look upon as comparatively mundane after the two which preceded it.

It is always difficult to go into such a fixture after experiencing a high in big games immediately before it and I have had the added problem of having to wait until after midweek internationals before knowing exactly who is available.

In fairness to the squad of players with which we have operated recently, their application and willingness to work has been excellent.

They have made working with them easy and enjoyable.

I said at the outset that we look at today's game as the first of a two-legged affair with Motherwell, as the Scottish Cup semi-final at Hampden on Wednesday looms.

We shall, however,

approach the two matches independently, not even beginning to think about the cup-tie until after the league match.

Each game is of considerable importance to us.

Our recent fine run has taken us to within three points of third-placed Dundee United in the Premier Division and we must take two more points today to keep the pressure on Jim McLean's side.

The importance of Wednesday's meeting speaks for itself.

We shall again go to Seamill to complete our preparations for that one because the players developed a positive attitude and single-minded approach for both the Old Firm matches while there.

Tommy McLean will be preparing for the games with equal thoroughness and his side always poses a stern test.

Our 2-1 win over them at Celtic Park in November was the first in a couple of seasons and they again made life very difficult for us in the 1-1 draw at Fir Park at the end of January.

The fact that that game was the last one in which we conceded a goal and dropped a point emphasises how seriously the Motherwell double challenge must be taken.

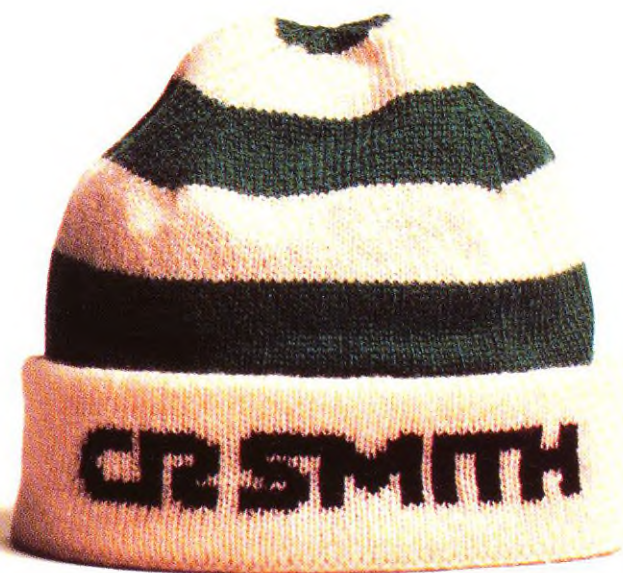

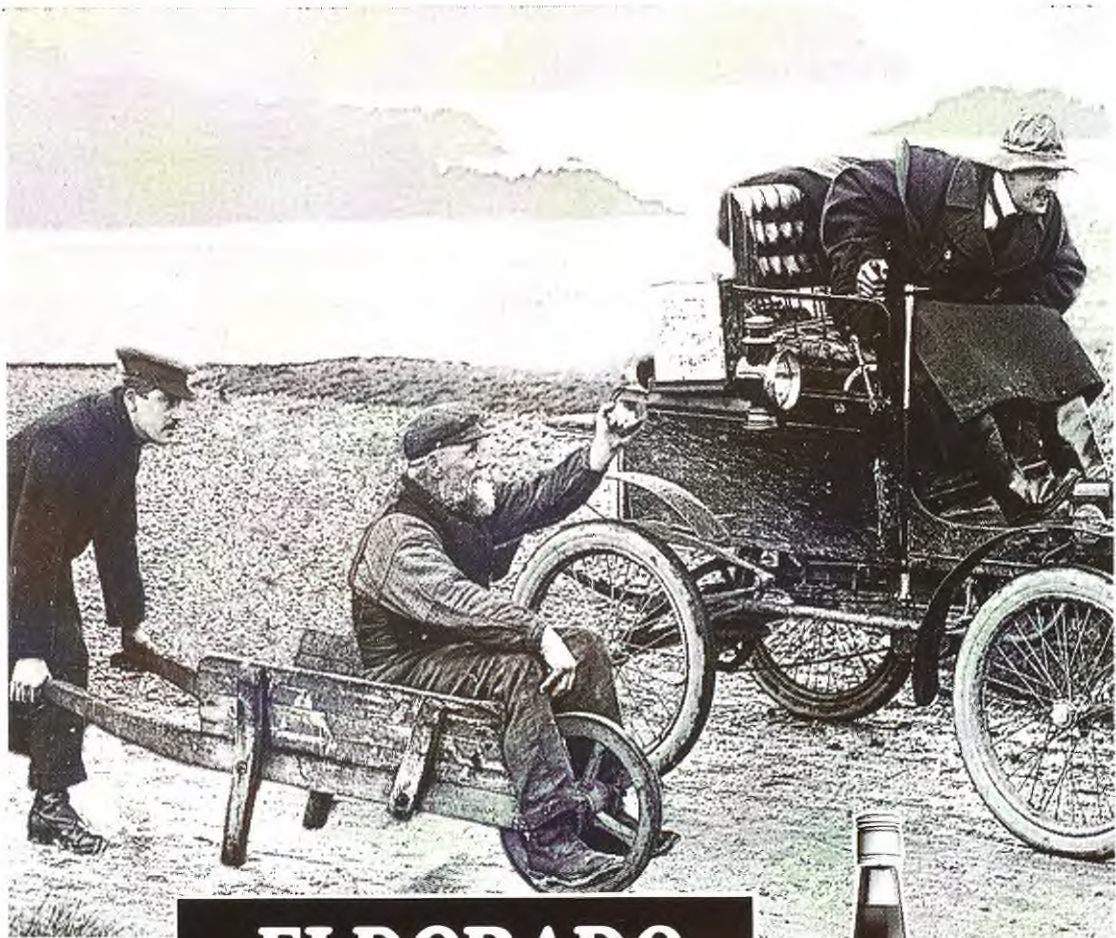

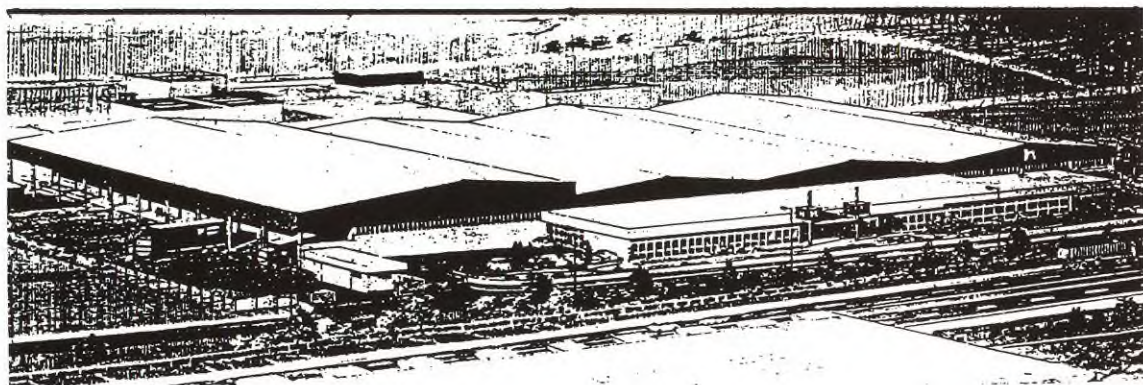
