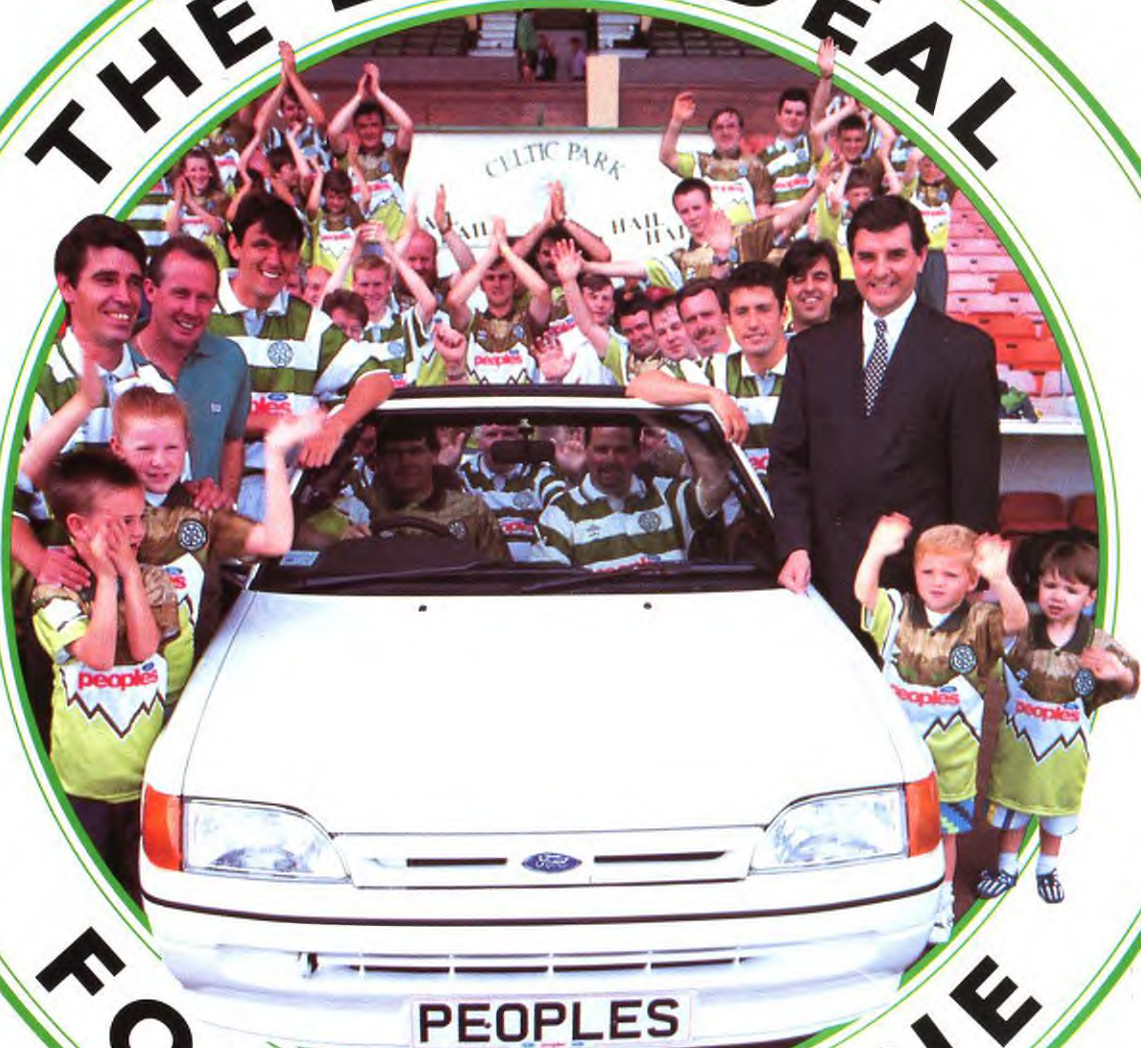

I AM delighted that we can approach today's match having played, what I consider, to be some of our best football of the season in our 2-0 victory over Motherwell on Tuesday.

We knew this game would be physically tough and matched Motherwell early on in this regard, working hard and earning the right to play football.

And we certainly did play some very good stuff in the match, especially in the second half, and perhaps the final scoreline did not truly reflect our superiority over the piece, the result of passing up a few scoreable chances late on.

Nevertheless the goals we did score were excellently taken by Tommy Coyne and Charlie Nicholas, who are linking up well in attack at the moment.

In the centre of defence I thought Gary Gillespie and Mike Galloway were outstanding, Gary really responding to my call for a tightening up in that area after basic mistakes were made on Saturday, while Mike showing himself to be the model of consistency at the moment.

We are now unbeaten in our last six games and are

building up the points gathering momentum — having taken seven out of a possible eight points from our last four league games — which we will require to make a real challenge for the championship.

Indeed the Motherwell match saw us complete the first quarter of the league programme and reflecting on that I would say we are only three points short of what I would have considered a very good start.

Now we must push on and keep winning and to do that we must defeat Dundee United today.

They, like ourselves, have put together some good results of late and it will be a very different United side we will face this afternoon, as compared to the one we defeated in the opening game of the season.

It has all the makings of another stirring encounter and it will take us to be at our very best to secure the two points we so desperately want

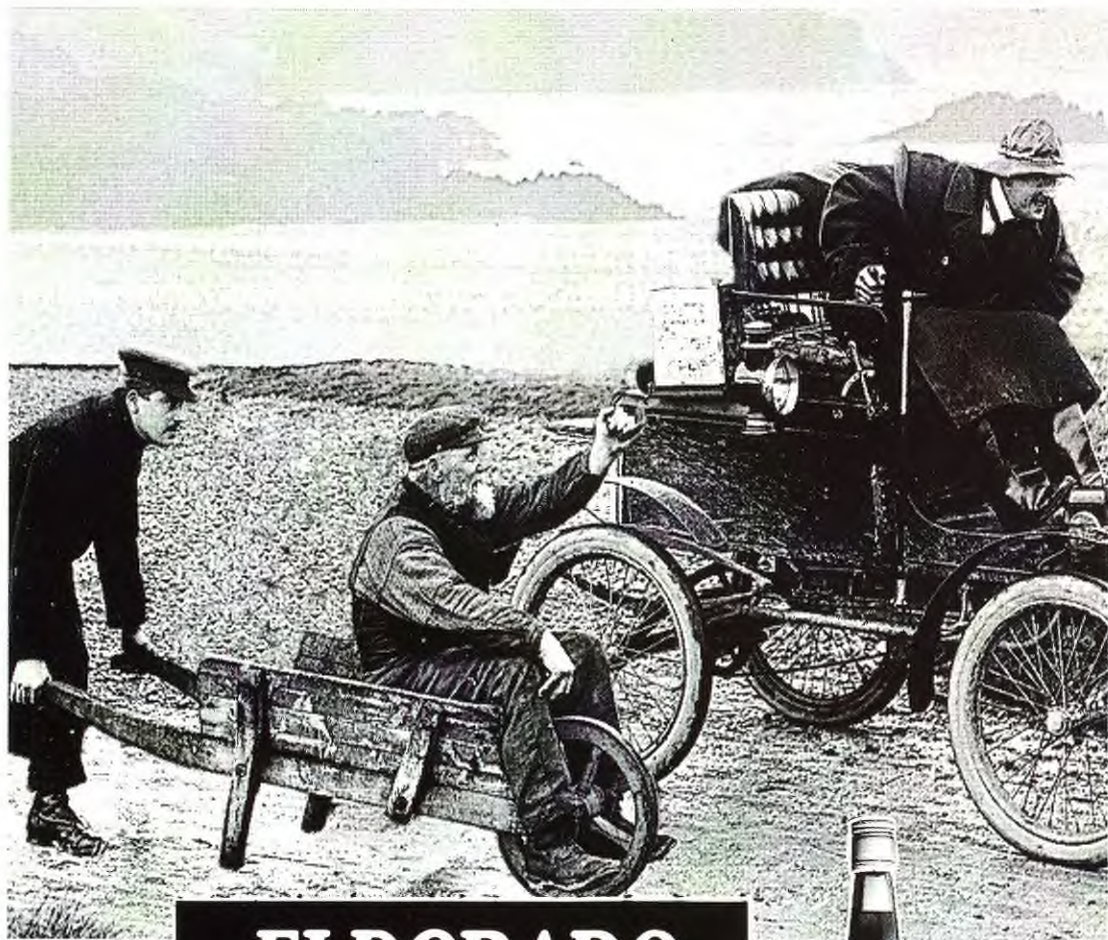

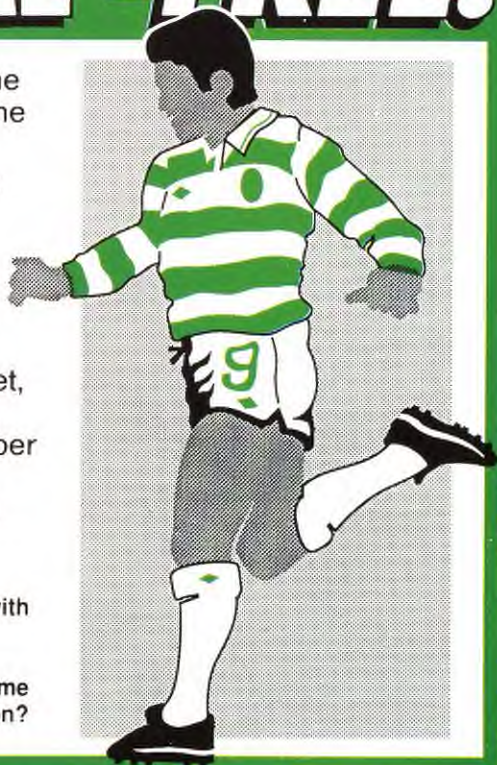
